# BC TAKES BEANPOT MOMENTUM TO WESTERN MASS Home-and-home series between top two teams headlines weekend action

They're in first place in Hockey East, they're the No. 1 team in the nation, and they're the new Beanpot champions. They're the Boston College Eagles – and they represent the biggest test of the season for the rejuvenated UMass Minutemen.

UMass has at least one win against every Hockey East opponent this season except for BC. In their only prior meeting in 2003-04, BC got two early goals from John Adams and limited the Minutemen to just 15 shots on their home ice en route to a 4-1 triumph. The game took place in front of a Mullins Center hockey record crowd of 7,113, and one can expect a similar total in Friday's match in Amherst.

UMass is just one point behind BC in the league standings. Not only are the Minutemen almost assured of their first-ever home ice berth in the Hockey East quarterfinals, they are legitimately threatening to win the league's regular season title. (The highest they've ever finished before was sixth.) The Eagles have the one-point advantage as well as two games in hand, but those games-in-hand will be

a home-and-home series vs. UNH and a final weekend road trip to Maine. UMass, meanwhile, has two games each with Boston University and Northeastern, two teams that have struggled throughout the 2003-04 season.

BU and Northeastern are both fighting to

BU and Northeastern are both fighting to make the playoffs, and neither has an easy draw this weekend. The Terriers have two road games vs. teams that are also looking to guarantee playoff invitations: Merrimack on Thursday and Providence on Saturday. That will make it a busy three-game week for BU, while their opponents have the luxury of focusing solely on the Terriers during game preparation, as those are the only games of the week for those squads.

Though playing both contests on home ice, Northeastern has drawn No. 3 Maine this weekend. The Black Bears are not out of the hunt for first place and they're especially motivated by the prospect of controlling their own destiny in that final weekend vs. BC. Even the current four-point deficit headed into that series could reasonably be overcome, so the Black Bears must only keep pace for now. The NU Huskies, though several seasons removed from their last victory at Alfond Arena, have been quite successful vs. Maine at Matthews. A five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2) at home vs. Maine was broken in their only meeting in Boston last season, a dominating 8-2 triumph for the Black Bears in mid-November of 2002.

UMass Lowell and UNH round out the weekend slate with a home-and-home series between two teams that could potentially meet in the quarterfinals for the third time in four seasons.
