BC VISITS NORTHEASTERN IN BATTLE OF TWO HOT TEAMS Undaunted River Hawks will challenge state rival Minutemen

Following a frustrating 0-9-2 start to the 2003-04 season, the Northeastern Huskies have suddenly morphed into one of the league's hottest teams. Following back-toback shutout victories to open the month of the December, NU played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament last weekend and posted two more wins. Junior forward Jason Guerriero exploded for three goals and four assists in the tourney and was selected as the Most Valuable Player. Fellow Huskies Keni Gibson, Mike Morris and Steve Sanders were also named to the All-Tournament team. Another victory at home on Saturday would stretch NU's streak to five games, which would be the Huskies' longest D-I winning streak since they had two such streaks in the 1988-89 season.

As luck would have it, Saturday's opponent is Boston College, winner of seven straight and undefeated in the last 12. The Eagles are fresh off a championship at the Great Lakes Invitational tournament, which they won even without the services of exceptional sophomore Patrick Eaves, who is with Team USA at the World Junior Championships (see brief at right.)

In its first year in the Boston, the carrier's region includes metro-Philadelphia.

CSTV faces off the second half of its inaugural season with BU at Minnesota on Friday, the first of a two-game set. Both teams have been up and down in the national polls this season and each boasts an incredible history. Among old-school East-West rivalries, this is one of the best.

NESN will also enter the fray this weekend, warming up for their return to the Hockey East Game of the Week package with a broadcast of Quinnipiac at Providence. Next weekend, NESN returns to Providence for the Hockey East package opener, when the Friars host UNH.

Massachusetts and UMass Lowell finish up their season series with a home-andhome set, both matinee contests. The Minutemen prevailed 3-2 in the first meeting, a very early league opener on Oct. 11 in Lowell. Sophomore Ben Walter potted his first two goals of the season, but was upstaged by a short-handed goal in the closing minutes by UMass' Peter Trovato. The Minutemen have enjoyed a strong 5-2-2 start in league play, losing only to Boston College and Providence, but UMass Lowell is nipping at their heels at 4-3-1. The River Hawks' last league game was a 5-4 win at UNH which followed a win and a tie vs. BU. Lowell is catching the Minutemen in an quirky stretch of four ties in their last five games.

WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Team USA today completed a perfect 4-0 record in round robin play, defeating Russia, 4-1. BC's Patrick Eaves set up the first two U.S. goals and Stephen Werner of UMass scored the third. Werner scored two goals in Tuesday's 4-3 win over Sweden, including a shorthander in the third period that stood up as the game-winner. With the 4-0 record, Team USA gets a quarterfinal bye and will next play in Saturday's semifinal.
