UML STEERS INTO SECOND WITH BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS Northeastern shuts out No. 2 BC for fifth straight victory

A year ago at this time, UMass Lowell was 0-8 in league play and finished the first half at 1-11. Thanks to a weekend sweep of Massachusetts, the rejuvenated River Hawks are 6-3-1 through 10 Hockey East contests, tied for second place with Maine and just one point away from first-place Boston College.

Much of the credit for this weekend's impressive showing can be heaped on goaltender Chris Davidson and forward Elias Godoy. Davidson, much-maligned last year, stopped all 52 shots he faced this weekend to record back-to-back shutouts. Godoy scored three of the four River Hawk goals in the sweep, including the only goal of the game in Sunday's 1-0 triumph in Amherst.

In a clash of the league's two hottest teams Saturday, host Northeastern emerged with the win, decisively shutting out BC by a 3-0 final. It was NU's first shutout over Boston College since the 1988 Beanpot. The victory was NU's first in league play but fifth straight overall following an 0-9-2 start, marking the longest Husky win streak since the 1988-89 season. Keni Gibson finished with 34 saves in recording his third shutout in five games to equal both the season (3) and career (4) records for NU goaltenders. Junior forward Jason Guerriero scored one goal and assisted on both of the others to finish the week with seven points in just two games played. He was named MVP of the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament after Monday's 7-5 championship game win over Mercyhurst.

In non-conference action, NCAA defending champ Minnesota hosted record crowds for a weekend series vs. Boston U., and not a single fan left disappointed. The historical rivals traded goal for goal over the two-game set, yielding back-to-back 5-5 ties.

Merrimack had no trouble at Princeton, recording two one-sided wins. Warrior rookie Jim Healey needed to make just 11 saves Saturday for his first career shutout. Both Maine and Providence also enjoyed dominant showings in non-conference play, soundly defeating Vermont and Quinnipiac, respectively. The sole loss suffered by Hockey East in nonleague came in the form of Yale's 3-2 win at UNH Saturday.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The shutout loss at NU Saturday ended a seven-game winning streak and a 12-game undefeated streak for the Eagles. It also ended lengthy point streaks for Ben Eaves (7), Ryan Shannon (12) and Tony Voce (7).

Boston University: The Terriers have six ties this season, one short of the school record of seven set in 1999-2000. Five of their ties have come on the road, where they have a 1-3-5 record this year ... After not scoring a goal in his first 13 games this season, Frantisek Skladany now has two goals in his last three games.

University of Maine: The Black Bears scored three goals in the first 3:49 en route to a 6-1 win over Vermont at Portland. Matt Greyeyes and Josh Soares each scored their first collegiate goal and Jeff Mushaluk netted his first of this season. Maine is now undefeated in their last seven games played in Portland (5-0-2).

University of Massachusetts: UMass failure to score a goal in two games this weekend was due in large part to the absence of their top four forwards. Matt Anderson (injury), Chris Capraro (personal) and Stephen Werner (World Junior Championships) were out even before Greg Mauldin was felled with a concussion late in Saturday's loss. He is expected back soon, as is Werner, who has five goals, including two short-handed, in five games with Team USA.

UMass Lowell: UML is 4-0-1 in its last five meetings with ranked opponents ... Mark Pandolfo saw his five-game goal scoring streak snapped Saturday night, and Jason Tejchma saw his five-game point scoring streak stopped on Sunday. Elias Godoy had three goals on the weekend and now has a five-game point streak of his own.

Merrimack College: Merrimack held Princeton to 11 shots on Saturday night, the lowest shot total it has allowed this season. ... The Warriors have won three straight games, all of which have been on the road, and have outscored their opponents 15-3 over those three games ... Over the past five games, linemates Tim Reidy and Steve Crusco have combined for six goals and six assists.

New Hampshire: The Wildcats have lost two consecutive home games for the first time since the 2001 Hockey East quarterfinals ... UNH plays seven of its next 10 games away from the Whittemore Center and five of the next 10 games are against ranked opponents.

Northeastern University: NU is 5-3-2 when scoring first. NU has scored first in its last six games and has won five straight ... Keni Gibson tied both the NU single-season and career shutout records with three and four, respectively ... MVP Jason Guerriero was joined on the All-Tournament team at the Rensselaer Invitational Tournament by linemates Mike Morris and Steve Sanders. The trio has produced nine goals and 15 assists for 24 points over the past five games, all victories.

Providence College: The Friars equaled their season-high with seven goals versus Quinnipiac ... Despite being the conference leader in GAA and save percentage, junior goaltender David Cacciola's 7-1 win over Quinnipiac Friday was his first of the season ... Providence is 6-1-1 in non-conference games this season ... Chris Chaput now has a career-high 19 points and 15 assists. He has recorded 12 points in the last seven games.

WHO'S HOT

• Jason Guerriero, NU (Jr. F; Manorville, NY) – Has posted two assists in each of the last four games and has added four goals in that span.

• Stephen Werner, UMass (So. F; Chevy Chase, MD) – Has scored five goals in five games as a member of Team USA at the World Junior Championships. Team USA plays Team Canada for the Gold Medal today.

• Merrimack Penalty Kill – The Warriors have killed off 20 of the last 21 opposing power plays. Over the past nine games, the unit is over 90 percent, at 37-for-41.

• UMass Lowell, Northeastern and Merrimack – The preseason coaches' poll picked these teams to finish 7-8-9, respectively. UML is currently tied for second place, Northeastern has won five in a row overall after an 0-9-2 start and Merrimack is on a three-game winning streak.


