UMASS GETS FIRST-EVER WIN AT BOSTON U. Terriers respond with inspired OT win to end NU's five-game win streak

The UMass Minutemen ended a mini-slump in dramatic fashion last Wednesday, recording a 2-1 win at BU's Walter Brown Arena. It was the first-ever win for UMass at BU's home rink following 18 consecutive losses there. It also ended an eight-game winless streak for the Minutemen overall, although the team had four ties in that span. Craig MacDonald set up the first UMass goal and scored the game-winner, but it was Stephen Werner's two assists that provided the most interesting storyline, considering he had just returned from winning a gold medal with Team USA at the World Junior Championships. Werner had five goals, including two short-handers, and was +6 in helping the U.S. to a 6-0 record. BC forward Patrick Eaves and Maine forward Greg Moore each had one assist in the championship game.

BU responded to Wednesday's defeat with an inspired 4-3 overtime victory over Northeastern on Friday. Sophomore David VanderGulik scored a goal and set up two others, including Bryan Miller's OT winner. The effort thwarted Northeastern's bid for its sixth straight win. The Huskies quickly got back in the win column with a 5-2 victory over Holy Cross on Saturday.

UNH and Providence played a home-and-home set which ultimately yielded a 1-1-1 split in the season series. Goaltenders David Cacciola (PC) and Jeff Pietrasiak (UNH) were both impressive in Friday's game, a 1-1 tie, as each finished with 33 saves on 34 shots faced. The UNH offense solved Cacciola in Saturday's rematch, as the Wildcats recorded a 5-3 victory.

Maine junior Dustin Penner got his own offense in gear this past week, picking up two goals and three assists over two Maine wins, 5-2 at Merrimack and 6-0 over Sacred Heart. He previously had just one goal and six assists over 17 games this season. Senior goaltender Frank Doyle was solid between the pipes, stopping 17 of 18 shots faced over two periods at Merrimack and all 11 he faced in a one-sided shutout win vs. Sacred Heart. It was his third shutout of the season and fifth of his career. Merrimack also succumbed to stingy defense on Friday, losing 4-0 at BC. Matti Kaltiainen needed to make just 14 saves for his first shutout of the season.

UMass Lowell split a weekend set at Michigan State, rebounding from a 2-0 shutout loss on Friday to post a 3-2 win on Saturday. Ben Walter scored two goals and Elias Godoy set up two. Sophomore goaltender John Yaros, in his first game as a River Hawk, totalled 24 saves on 26 shots to earn the win.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC scored two short-handed goals for the first time this season when Ben Eaves and J.D. Forrest both did it in a 4-0 win against Merrimack on Friday. The shutout of Merrimack was the first by the Eagles this season.

Boston University: The Terriers have once again achieved equilibrium in their record at 6-6-6. At different points earlier this season, they have had records of 2-2-2, 3-3-3, 4-4-4, and 5-5-5.

University of Maine: Frank Doyle picked up his third shutout of the season Saturday, tying Maine's single-season record. He has five career shutouts, one short of the school record ... Maine has a modest three-game win streak and has outscored its opponents 17-3 in that span ... Maine is a perfect 7-0-0 at home this season ... Rookie Michel Leveille's 19 assists ranks second only to BC captain Ben Eaves among Hockey East players.

University of Massachusetts: UMass' win at BU was the team's first ever over at Walter Brown Arena, where UMass had previously been 0-18 ... The Minutemen have scored only 18 goals in the last nine games, an average of just two goals per game. However, UMass is 3-5-3 this season when scoring two or fewer goals in a game, after posting an 0-12-1 mark last season ... UMass' 6-4-2 Hockey East record is its best-ever mark at the halfway point.

UMass Lowell: UMass Lowell was shut out for the third time this season on Friday. This is the first time UML has been held scoreless three times in a season ... Sophomore Ben Walter picked up a pair of goals on Saturday. It was his first multi-point game since collecting three assists at New Hampshire on November 25.

Merrimack College: Sophomore defenseman Bryan Schmidt has tallied at least one point in eight of his last 11 games, scoring five goals and adding six assists for 11 points over that span ... Freshman goaltender Jim Healey enjoyed a modest scoreless streak of 111:12 before Maine finally beat him in Tuesday's win.

New Hampshire: UNH snapped a three-game winless streak with a 5-3 victory over the Friars at the Whittemore Center on Saturday. Fourteen different skaters recorded at least one point in the win ... UNH's power play got back on track with three goals on six chances over two games on the weekend.

Northeastern University: With Saturday's win over Holy Cross, Bruce Crowder became the fourth head coach in Northeastern history to record 100 victories with the program. He now needs just one more win to reach a career mark of 200 wins. He has 100 at Northeastern and had 99 as head coach at UMass Lowell.

Providence College: Junior Chris Chaput has recorded at least one point in 10 of the last 11 games ... Senior Stephen Wood shares the Hockey East lead in plus/minus with a rating of +19 ... All seven Friar losses this season have come against ranked teams.

• Mark Mullen, BU (Sr. F; Dorchester, MA) – Has scored four goals in four games since returning from arthroscopic surgery on his right knee.

• Stephen Werner, UMass (So. F; Chevy Chase, MD) – Scored five goals in six games as a member of the Team USA squad that won its first gold medal at the World Junior Championships. Set up both UMass goals in a 2-1 win at BU in his first game back.

• Jason Guerriero, Mike Morris, Steve Sanders, NU – The line has combined for 11 goals and 20 assists over the last seven games. Guerriero has four goals and 11 assists over a six-game point streak. Morris has also scored at least one point in each of the past six games.

• Merrimack Penalty Kill – The Warriors successfully killed off seven short-handed situations in each game last week, vs. 1st place BC and 2nd place Maine. The unit has killed off 21 straight and is 34 of 35 over the past six games.


