GOALTENDERS SHINE IN SPLIT WEEKEND FOR MOST Ayers leads way with two of the five shutouts on the week

Parity was on display last week as six of the nine Hockey East teams came away with two points each in two league games, thanks mostly to sharp goaltending at both ends.

That was particularly true at Maine, where UMass rebounded from a 3-0 shutout loss on Friday to post a 1-0 shutout of its own in the rematch. Black Bear senior Frank Doyle continued his mastery by stopping all 17 UMass shots on Friday. He gave way to Jimmy Howard on Saturday, and Howard went 15-for-16, only to lose 1-0 to Gabe Winer's perfect 22-for-22.

Maine's loss gave Boston College a little breathing room at the top of the standings, as the Eagles posted the only Hockey East sweep of the weekend, 5-1 and 3-2 vs. Boston University. Rookie Adam Pineault scored twice in Friday's win, and goaltender Matti Kaltiainen stopped 49 of the 52 shots launched by the Terrier offense on the weekend.

UNH also registered two wins, over ECAC opponents Dartmouth and Brown. In Tuesday's marquee match at the Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, Steve Saviano had his second hat trick of the season and Justin Aikins posted four assists as the Wildcats cruised to a 5-0 win. Mike Ayers also had a big night and was forced to make 30 saves to pick up the shutout. He made it two in a row Saturday night vs. Brown, stopping 23 shots for a 3-0 shutout win.

Merrimack rookie Jim Healey put up the league's fifth shutout of the week, stopping 17 shots to earn a vital 3-0 win for the Warriors at UMass Lowell. The victory took some of the sting off a 4-3 OT loss suffered at home the night before vs. the River Hawks. UML's John Yaros had 41 saves in that game and survived a penalty shot awarded to Merrimack in overtime. River Hawk forward Andrew Martin had a hand in all four Lowell goals.

Northeastern and Providence finished up their season series with two more ties to go with the first one. David Cacciola was the Friars' savior in Friday's match at Northeastern, stopping 42 total shots to preserve a valuable point in a 1-1 tie. On Saturday, PC's Bobby Goepfert stepped in between the pipes at home and registered 47 saves in a 3-3 tie. The NU offense finished with 93 shots over the home-and-home series.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC has now swept the last two regular season league series with BU. The last time BC swept the series before last season was 1990-91 ... Patrick Eaves left Saturday's game with a bruised sternum. He is listed day-to-day, as are Ben Eaves (knee) and Dave Spina (ankle).

Boston University: The Terriers have scored two or fewer goals in 11 of 20 games played this year, but have still outscored their opponents 62-61 overall ... BU was 14-for-16 on the penalty kill vs. BC this weekend, including 9-for-10 on Friday ... BU has managed just one win on the road this year and is winless (0-4-4) in its last eight on the road.

University of Maine: Frank Doyle set a UMaine record with his fourth shutout of the season Friday vs. UMass. Senior defenseman Prestin Ryan set a team record with 289 penalty minutes in his career ... Saturday's loss was Maine's first at home this season following eight straight wins. It was their first shutout loss at home since January 29, 2000, vs. Boston College.

University of Massachusetts: Friday's shutout loss was the third in the last four games for the Minutemen ... UMass is 5-1 in one-goal games this year ... UMass is 10-0-3 this season when scoring the first goal ... Defensemen have accounted for 22 of 57 Minutemen goals this season ... UMass has scored only 19 goals in the last 11 games ... The Minutemen are 6-2-0 on the road in Hockey East, but only 1-3-2 at home.

UMass Lowell: Sophomore Ben Walter suffered an MCL sprain Friday vs. the Warriors, and is expected to miss the next 3-5 weeks ... UML ended two impressive streaks in Saturday's shutout loss to Merrimack. Its six-game unbeaten streak in league play was its third-best ever in Hockey East. The River Hawks were also unbeaten in nine straight matchups against the Warriors.

Merrimack College: Merrimack matched a season high with 44 shots in a 4-3 OT loss against UMass Lowell on Friday night ... Merrimack will play its final non-league game on Tuesday night when it travels to Brown. Brown leads the nation with a 92.5 penalty killing percentage while Merrimack ranks fourth at 88.8.

New Hampshire: Senior captain Pat Foley was selected as one of five finalists for the prestigious Hockey Humanitarian Award ... In seven starts vs. nationally ranked teams, Mike Ayers owns a 5-0-2 record with a 1.12 GAA and a .962 save percentage ... Junior forward Justin Aikins leads the nation with 23 assists.

Northeastern University: In his 100th career game, senior Brian Tudrick scored NU's only goal in a 1-1 tie vs. Providence ... NU is 6-1-2 over its last nine games ... NU had 50 shots at Providence Saturday. It was the first time the Huskies reached 50 since Nov. 30, 2001, vs. Holy Cross.

Providence College: Providence has played six overtime games this season, all ending in ties. The three ties against Northeastern this season marks the first time in school history that Providence has tied the same team three times in one season. The six ties overall marks the most by a Friar team since the 1994-95 season ... Junior Chris Chaput has tallied at least one point in 12 out of the last 13 games, including five consecutive games.

• Mike Ayers, UNH (Sr. G; Hingham, MA) – Has posted a 1.67 GAA and a .940 save percentage over his last six starts.

• David Cacciola, PC (Jr. G; Burlington, MA) – Has allowed only one goal in four of his last five starts.

• Frank Doyle, Maine (Sr. G; Guelph, ON) – Has allowed only three goals over the last five games, posting a GAA of 0.63 and a save percentage of .963.

• Jason Guerriero, NU (Jr. F; Manorville, NY) – Has four goals and 12 assists in the last eight games, an average of 2.00 points per game.

• BC and Merrimack Penalty Killing Units – Merrimack has killed off 25 straight penalties and is 48 of 49 over the past 10 games. The Warriors have the fourth-best PK unit in the country. BC has the second best in the nation. The Eagles have allowed only 10 power play goals this season and have scored eight short-handed goals.
