A WILD WEEKEND FOR MAINE AT BOSTON U. *First-place BC gets more breathing room with back-to-back league wins*

As expected, the weekend series for Maine at Boston University was a memorable one as the teams combined for 12 goals in Friday's opener, an 8-4 Maine win, only to watch the offense disappear in a 1-0 BU win in the rematch. Black Bear Colin Shields potted a pair of short-handed goals and added another at even strength to lead the attack on Friday. He also had two assists and was +6. But Shields and the rest of the Black Bears were shut down on Saturday, thanks mostly to BU goaltender Sean Fields, who turned aside all 27 shots he faced.

Boston College opened the week with a 2-1 overtime win at Providence Tuesday and finished it with a 4-2 comeback win at Northeastern three nights later. Ryan Shannon totalled three goals and an assist over the two games to take over the Hockey East scoring lead. With five straight wins, the Eagles are now 11-1-2 in league play and have a comfortable five-point cushion over second-place Maine.

Northeastern rebounded from the loss to BC with a vital 3-2 win at Merrimack on Saturday. Sophomore Mike Morris had the game-winning goal and an assist as NU peppered Merrimack goaltender Jim Healey with 40 shots. Healey was also the unfortunate victim of UNH's vengeance Friday. The Wildcats piled up seven goals in two periods vs. Healey and added two more vs. Casey Guenther in the third to pick up a 9-1 win. Steve Saviano had his second four-goal game of the season and also had one assist. Merrimack had soundly defeated UNH 7-2 in the teams' last meeting.

The Warriors also dropped a non-conference game earlier in the week, 6-2 at Brown, despite two goals from Tim Reidy. Brown made it a sweep of Hockey East foes with a 3-2 win at Lowell on Saturday. Providence carried the torch for Hockey East in non-conference play once again, posting back-to-back wins at Lake Superior State. Goaltender Bobby Goepfert allowed just one goal on 48 shots in the series. The Friars own an 8-1-1 non-conference record this season.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC has been spreading the scoring around, as 12 different Eagles have scored a game-winning goal this year and no player has more than two ... With 686 career wins, BC head coach Jerry York is just one behind BU's Jack Parker for No. 3 on the all-time wins list.

Boston University: Sean Fields moved into a tie for second place with Michel Larocque on BU's all-time win list with his 1-0 blanking of Maine on Saturday night. He now has 57 career victories, just three shy of the BU record held by Scott Cashman. He is also now tied for second on BU's career shutout list with seven ... Veteran hockey athletic trainer Larry Venis returned to the BU bench Friday. He had been out of work since being hit by an errant puck on Nov. 15.

University of Maine: The eight goals scored Friday at BU was a season high for Maine ... Maine tied a team record with three short-handed goals on Friday night, including two during the same BU power play in the first period. That also tied the Hockey East record of three set in 1995 by BC vs. UMass ... The Black Bears are now 16-0-0 when leading after two periods, but 1-6-0 when trailing after two periods.

UMass Lowell: 'Bears' are not welcome at the Tsongas Arena. The Brown University Bears are 3-0 all-time at UML's home rink while the Maine Black Bears are 7-0 there ... In the first 19 games of the season, UML averaged 3.37 goals per game, but goal production has been down recently. Through the last seven games, UML has only scored an average of 1.86 goals per game.

Merrimack College: Merrimack's penalty kill streak came to an end at 25 when Brown netted a power play goal in the first period on Tuesday night ... Brent Gough and Tony Johnson have each recorded a point in four of the last five games. Each has a pair of goals and three assists over that stretch ... Merrimack has played three more games in league play than any other Hockey East school. The schedule slows a bit now as the Warriors have just three games scheduled over the next three weeks.

New Hampshire: 15 of 18 skaters scored at least one point in the 9-1 win at Merrimack Friday night. UNH's first line of Sean Collins, Nathan Martz and Steve Saviano accounted for 13 of UNH's 26 points vs. Merrimack. Saviano and Collins both eclipsed the 100-point plateau in the win. Brian Yandle posted a team-high +5 in the game, despite notching just one point ... Over the last three games, UNH has outscored its opponents 17-1.

Northeastern University: NU is 7-2-2 in its last 11 games ... Head Coach Bruce Crowder picked up his 200th career victory Saturday at Merrimack ... Defenseman Tim Judy registered his 50th career point Friday vs. BC ... NU is 5-0-2 when allowing two goals or fewer.

Providence College: The Friars finished their regular season non-conference schedule with an admirable 8-1-1 mark ... All eight PC losses this season have come versus ranked teams ... Four of Providence's last five Hockey East games have gone into overtime.

• **Mike Ayers, UNH** (Sr. G; Hingham, MA) – Has allowed just one goal over his last three starts.

• **Chris Chaput, PC** (Jr. F; Pawtucket, RI) – Has recorded at least one point in eight consecutive games, and 15 of the last 16.

• **Jason Guerriero, NU** (Jr. F; Manorville, NY) – Has five goals and 12 assists over the last 10 games.

• **Steve Saviano, UNH** (Sr. F; Reading, MA) – Five game point streak includes eight goals and three assists.

• **BC and Maine defenses** – Both are on pace to break the Hockey East record of 1.96 goals allowed per game set by the 2000-01 UNH squad. Maine's overall defense (1.71 GAPG) is well below the previous team record of 2.33.

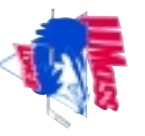
