## MAINE SWEEPS UNH TO MAKE IT A THREE-HORSE RACE *UMass jumps into second place with two wins and two forfeit wins*

Just one week ago, Boston College had a five-point lead over the rest of the pack in the Hockey East standings and looked certain to quickly wrap up the regular season title. But courtesy of sweeps by Maine and UMass, and two forfeits by UMass Lowell that benefitted the Minutemen, BC's lead is down to just two points and the race is back on.

The Eagles did their part by cruising to a 4-0 win over Providence on Friday. Patrick Eaves had two goals and Matti Kaltiainen had 14 saves for his second shutout of the month. But Maine was determined to keep pace, and did so with back-to-back wins over UNH. The Black Bears jumped out to leads of 3-0 and 5-1 in Friday's game before UNH came back with a vengeance, only to fall just short at 5-4. The Bears weren't about to put any lead in such jeopardy in the rematch, as they scored five unanswered goals to post a convincing 5-0 triumph. Jim Howard made 25 saves.

Massachusetts enjoyed both good play and good fortune over the weekend, posting two league wins (4-2 over Northeastern and 3-1 over Merrimack) and getting credit for two more thanks to forfeits in earlier games by UMass Lowell. UML administration discovered late last week that a player that had been used in nine games was in fact ineligible for competition. The team promptly forfeited the five victories gained in that span, including two over UMass and one over Merrimack.

Although the River Hawks dropped temporarily out of contention for home ice advantage in the Hockey East playoffs, they did manage to pick up a big win over Boston U. on Friday, a slim 2-1 final. Elias Godoy and Cleve Kinley each had two assists and goaltender John Yaros made 24 saves.

Providence also picked up two key points by downing Lowell on Saturday by a 3-2 score. That moved the Friars into a three-way tie for fifth place with Lowell and Merrimack. Fifth-place is hardly safe, however, as only four points separate fifth from ninth.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Head coach Jerry York has moved into a dead heat with BU head coach Jack Parker on the all-time wins list with 687 each ... BC has its best single-season record ever through 25 games at 19-3-3 ... Assistant coach Jim Logue will be inducted into the Beanpot Hall of Fame on Monday. He was Beanpot MVP in 1959.

**Boston University:** The Terriers have been held to two or fewer goals 13 times in 23 games this season. In those 13 games, BU is 1-9-3 ... BU has scored just 14 goals in the third period this year and has been shut out in the third period 12 times ... The Terriers are just 1-5-5 on the road this year ... David Van der Gulik has four goals and three assists in his last six games.

**University of Maine:** In Saturday's win over UNH, Maine was 3-for-5 on the power play and also picked up a short-handed goal ... Maine has six shutout wins on the season, a new single-season school record ... Colin Shields reached the 100-point club with an assist in Friday's win.

**University of Massachusetts:** UMass limited Merrimack to 40 total shots over their three-game season series, sweeping for the first time since 1999-2000 season ... UMass now has 11 wins in league play, its best ever ... The Minutemen are 12-0-3 when leading after two periods this season, 22-0-3 over the past two seasons.

**UMass Lowell:** The River Hawks picked up the series victory over BU with a 2-1 win Friday, marking only the third time in program history that UML has taken the season series against the Terriers ... Freshman Cleve Kinley had three assists this past weekend and leads River Hawk defensemen in points with 10.

**Merrimack College:** Ten of Merrimack's 14 shots at UMass Saturday came in the third period ... UMass was able to hold Bryan Schmidt scoreless in the three games this year. Last year, the defenseman scored three of his nine goals against the Minutemen ... Steve Crusco netted the lone goal for the Warriors on Saturday. Merrimack is now 4-2 when Crusco scores a goal.

**New Hampshire:** Senior co-captain Steve Saviano is currently in a three-way tie for the national goal scoring lead with 22, while junior forward Justin Aikins is the national leader in assists with 25 ... Former Wildcat Garrett Stafford was named to the PlanetUSA team for the 2004 AHL All-Star game and Bryan Muir was named a starter for Team Canada.

**Northeastern University:** NU is the second-least penalized team in the nation, averaging just 11.5 minutes in the box per game ... NU is 7-3-3 when leading or tied after two periods of play ... Defenseman Jon Awe has a 1-9-10 line over the last 12 games.

**Providence College:** Saturday's win over UMass Lowell marked the Friars' first league win since November 14. In non-conference play, the Friars are 8-1-1 ... The freshman class accounted for five of the eight points in Saturday's victory, including the game-winning goal, notched by Tony Zancanaro in the third period.

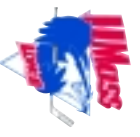
