FRIARS A SOLID FIFTH FOLLOWING SWEEP ON THE ROAD *Parker, York tied with 688 career wins each headed into 'Pot finale*

Emerging from a season of relative obscurity, the Providence College Friars posted back-to-back road wins in league play over the weekend, making a strong case for fifth place ahead of four other contenders. They have won three straight Hockey East games after going winless in their previous nine. A big part of their winning formula this weekend was goaltender Bobby Goepfert, who stopped all 36 shots he faced in a 2-0 win at Boston University on Friday and 22 of 24 in a 4-2 win at Lowell on Sunday. He was an easy selection as CCM Player of the Week, although teammate Cody Loughlean (two goals, two assists on the weekend) was another strong candidate. Lowell's home loss somewhat soured the thrill of goaltender Chris Davidson's dynamic 46-save performance at Northeastern Friday, a 1-1 tie for both teams.

Like BU, Boston College had a minor hiccup en route to tonight's Beanpot final, netting only a tie at Merrimack. The Warriors got two goals from Tim Reidy to offset two by BC's Tony Voce, but it was Jim Healey's 41 saves that made the biggest difference for the home squad. Merrimack now owns an impressive 5-2-1 record vs. BC in their last eight meetings at Lawler Arena. BC and BU go head-to-head in the Beanpot championship game, with their respective head coaches tied at 688 career wins each.

UNH managed a split in a home-and-home series and thus the season series vs. UMass when Justin Aikins converted in overtime Saturday for a 3-2 win at home. The Minutemen took Friday's game in Amherst, building a 4-0 lead before the 'Cats finally broke the shutout in the closing minutes. Senior defenseman Nick Kuiper had a goal in each game for UMass.

In non-conference action, Maine hosted Alabama-Huntsville in a very low scoring two-game series. Only one goal was scored in Friday's opener, a 1-0 win for Maine. Frank Doyle's 16 saves gave him a Maine record fifth shutout this year. Each squad scored twice in the rematch with Todd Jackson converting both for Maine. Colin Shields set up all three Black Bear goals on the weekend.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles are expected to take over the No. 1 national ranking this week ... Despite missing a combined 44 games over the past two seasons, brothers Ben and Patrick Eaves have never been out of the lineup at the same time. They've played 22 games together, and BC has a 15-4-3 record in those games.

Boston University: BU has not recorded back-to-back victories this season. This is the longest a BU team has gone in a season without winning two straight games ... The Terriers have been held to two or fewer goals in 14 of 25 games this year and they are 1-10-3 in those games. In those 14 games, they have been outscored by a total of 39-18.

University of Maine: Goaltender Frank Doyle was recently named the male recipient of the 2003-04 M Club Dean Smith Award, which annually acknowledges the most outstanding academic and athletic achievement by a UMaine athlete ... Maine has seven shutout wins on the season, a new team record. Frank Doyle has five of those and seven in his career, both Maine records ... The Black Bears are 11-1-1 at home and 19-0-1 when leading after two periods.

University of Massachusetts: The four players that scored goals in Friday's win had accounted for just 10 total goals on the season before that game ... Friday night crowd of 6,613 was the fourth largest in school history ... UMass hasn't allowed more than three goals in a game in 2004, and have held six of nine foes to two goals or less.

UMass Lowell: The once high-powered UML offense of 2003 has been a no-show in 2004. The River Hawks were averaging 3.37 goals per game before the calendar turned, and only 1.81 goals per game in the new year ... Junior Chris Davidson had 22 saves in the second period against Northeastern on Friday. The UML record for saves in a period is held by BU assistant coach Mike Geragosian, who made 27 saves in one period against Vermont on March 4, 1972. Geragosian also holds Lowell's single game record for saves with 65.

Merrimack College: The Warriors have been remarkably successful at home vs. the BC Eagles, posting an impressive 5-2-1 record in the last eight meetings between the teams in North Andover ... Merrimack and BC have tied twice this season. Previously, they had played 55 times without ever playing to a tie ... Tim Reidy has four two-goal games this season, accounting for eight of his 10 goals.

New Hampshire: UNH's power play has scored at least one goal in nine of its last 10 games ... The Wildcats own a 6-3-2 record in 11 games vs. nationally ranked teams ... The Wildcats have outscored their opponents 38-17 in the third period this season but have scored 41 percent of their goals in the second period (43 of 106 goals) ... Six different Wildcats have reached the 20-point plateau already this season.

Northeastern University: The Huskies have outshot opponents 790-684, but have been outscored 82-67 ... NU is 5-1-5 when allowing three goals or fewer... NU's five ties is two short of the school record of seven, set in 1993-94) ... NU is the second-least penalized team in the nation.

Providence College: Providence has won three consecutive Hockey East games after winning just two league games in their first 15 games ... Seniors Cody Loughlean (16 points) and Peter Zingoni (27 points) have each totaled career highs in points this season ... Former Friar Ron Wilson has been selected to coach Team USA's entry in the 2004 World Cup.

WHO'S HOT

• **Justin Aikins, UNH** (Jr. F; Surrey, BC) – Has recorded a point in eight of UNH's last nine games with 11 points in that time.

• **Chris Chaput, PC** (Jr. F; Pawtucket, RI) – Has recorded at least one point in 18 of the last 20 games.

• **Bobby Goepfert, PC** (So. G; Kings Park, NY) – Has a 5-1 record, a 1.15 goals against average and a .960 save percentage in his last six starts, including two shutouts. He recently posted a shutout streak of 120:18.

• **River Hawk Penalty Kill** – Has allowed just three goals in 2004, going 33-for-36 (91.7 percent).

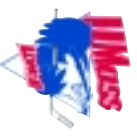
