BC BREAKING AWAY WITH SWEEP OVER UMASS BU, Northeastern headed to wire for final playoff spot

The Minutemen were allowing just over two goals per game in Hockey East play entering the weekend, and hadn't allowed more than three goals in a game in the last nine. But that's before they ran into the top-ranked Boston College Eagles.

BC made quick work of UMass, scoring three goals in the first period of Friday's 5-2 win in Amherst and four goals in the first period of Saturday's 6-1 win at home, including two in a span of 13 seconds and two more in a span of 27 seconds. Sophomore Patrick Eaves led the way Saturday with his first career hat trick to go with one assist. Those victories clinched home ice for the Eagles in the Hockey East quarterfinals and put the exclamation point on the team's claim to first place. They are now five points ahead of Maine with only six games left to play. UMass also trails BC by six points, but only has four games left to catch up.

The sweep capped a very triumphant week for BC, who won its second Beanpot in four seasons with Monday's 2-1 OT win over BU. The Terriers had a tough time recovering from the loss, dropping back-to-back Hockey East contests at Merrimack and Providence. The BU offense remained invisible on the week, managing just one goal in each game. Jim Healey had 33 saves for Merrimack Thursday and Bobby Goepfert had 33 for Providence on Saturday.

BU's struggles have opened the door for an opportunistic Northeastern squad, seeking to avoid its second straight season out of the playoff mix. The Huskies picked up a huge point to pull within one of BU in an unusually thrilling 0-0 tie with Maine in which the teams combined for 72 shots on goal. NU's Keni Gibson was especially impressive on the week, stopping 94 of 98 shots faced over three games (.959 save percentage). Maine's outstanding goaltending tandem of Frank Doyle and Jim Howard combined to allow just one goal over the two games at Northeastern, a win and a tie, dropping the team's GAA to a minuscule 1.60, the best in the nation.

Speaking of the best in the nation, UNH's Steve Saviano stayed atop the goal-scoring list, picking up his 23rd and 24th of the season in Friday's 3-3 tie at UMass Lowell. The River Hawks played even with the Wildcats all weekend, and completed the split with another tie at UNH on Saturday. UNH's Preston Callander had two goals and two assists in the series and UML's Elias Godoy had three goals.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Patrick Eaves' hat trick Saturday was the fourth of the season for an Eagle player. Tony Voce has the other three ... Ned Havern has six goals on the season and four have been game-winners ... Ty Hennes and Ryan Shannon are each on four-game point-scoring streaks ... The BC power play has scored seven goals in the last five games.

Boston University: The Terriers have scored a total of three goals in the last four games, all losses. They have been limited to two goals or less in 17 of 28 games this season, including six of the last seven. Terrier goalie Sean Fields has been outstanding in those seven (1.85 GAA and a .934 save percentage) but has received a total of just 10 goals in support in the same span, half of those coming in one game ... Seven of BU's eight wins this season have come at home.

University of Maine: Maine now has eight shutouts this season, extending a team record established earlier this season ... Jim Howard is leading the nation with a 1.31 GAA and a .949 save percentage. His 40 saves in Saturday's 0-0 tie at Northeastern was a career high.

University of Massachusetts: Friday's home sellout of 8,373 set a record for the largest crowd ever at a Hockey East arena. It was the first hockey sellout in Mullins Center history ... Greg Mauldin has eight multi-point games in 21 games played this season ... Special teams have abandoned UMass recently. The Minutemen are 0-for-14 on the power play over the past four games, while opponents have gone 6-for-25.

UMass Lowell: In three appearances against UNH this season, Elias Godoy had six goals and four assists ... Excluding forfeits, UMass Lowell is undefeated at 4-0-4 in games against nationally-ranked opponents this season. The River Hawks are in the midst of a six-game stretch against ranked foes, with No. 1 BC this weekend and No. 3 Maine next weekend.

Merrimack College: Merrimack picked up its 300th win of all-time at the J. Thom Lawler Arena (formerly Volpe Center). The Warriors now hold an impressive all-time record of 300-173-32 (.626) in their home rink ... The Warriors' penalty kill went 20-for-22 (.909) in three games vs. BU this season. Rookie goaltender Jim Healey stopped 48 of the 50 shots he faced over 100 minutes of actions vs. BU.

New Hampshire: The Wildcats have gone to overtime in their last three games and have a win and two ties to show for it ... UNH needs four wins for the program's eighth straight 20+ win season. Mike Ayers needs four victories to break Ty Conklin's school record of 57 wins ... The Wildcats have the best record of any team in Div. I hockey over the past 5+ seasons with a .708 winning percentage.

Northeastern University: Junior Keni Gibson broke the Northeastern single-season (4) and career (5) shutout records in a 0-0 tie against Maine Saturday. Gibson has shut out both top-ranked Boston College and third-ranked Maine this season ... NU's six ties is just one short of the single-season record of seven set in 1993-94.

Providence College: The Friars have won four consecutive games for the second time this season. All four have come in league play, where the Friars had gone 2-8-5 prior to beginning the streak ... Prior to allowing a third period goal Saturday, Bobby Goepfert had a 104:17 shutout streak vs. the Terriers ... Senior Jonathan Goodwin has a career high 18 points (nine goals, nine assists) this season.

• **Preston Callander, UNH** (Jr. F; Regina, SK) – Has three goals and three assists over the last three games.

• **Sean Fields, BU** (Sr. G; Edmonton, AB) – Boasts a 1.85 GAA and a .934 save percentage over the past seven games.

• **Bobby Goepfert, PC** (So. G; Kings Park, NY) – Has a 6-1 record, two shutouts, a 1.13 goals against average and a .962 save percentage over his last seven starts.

• **Maine defense and goaltending** – Has allowed a total of eight goals over the last seven games.

• **River Hawk Power Play** – After scoring just once in its first 18 opportunities in 2004, the UML man-advantage unit has connected on eight out of 17 opportunities since.
