OT GOAL PUTS BU IN, NU OUT, ON THRILLING FINAL NIGHT *Husky sweep goes unrewarded as Van der Gulik converts in the clutch*

After squandering a 2-0 lead at UNH on the final night of the regular season, the Boston University Terriers found themselves in overtime and in need of a win to avoid missing the playoffs for the first time in the 20-year history of Hockey East. A tie would award the final playoff spot to Northeastern, who had just completed a necessary sweep of Massachusetts to set up the nightmare scenario for BU.

Boasting an admirable 4-4-4 record at the Whittemore Center coming into the game, the Terriers again delivered, as sophomore David Van der Gulik converted his own rebound past a frustrated Mike Ayers, dashing the hopes of the NU Huskies and their fans. After a timid 0-9-2 start to the season, the Huskies went 11-7-5 over the final 23 games, including 3-0-1 in their final four. Husky goaltender Keni Gibson posted 75 saves on 77 shots over two games vs. UMass on the weekend, but it was not enough to put the determined Terriers to pasture. Gibson was named the ITECH First Star of each game and has won the ITECH Three Stars Award for 2003-04.

The dramatic BU win sets up a Hockey East quarterfinal series that could be even more dramatic – Boston University at Boston College, starting on Thursday. BC is 5-0 vs. BU this season, but comes into the series on an unprecedented three-game losing streak. Maine thwarted BC captain Ben Eaves' impressive return to the lineup Saturday, getting an overtime goal from John Ronan to complete a weekend sweep. BC's Tony Voce got two goals and one assist in the loss to finish with 27 points in league play, tied with teammate Ryan Shannon for the 2003-04 Hockey East scoring title.

Black Bear goaltender Jim Howard set the stage for the headline series between the No. 2 and No. 3 teams in the nation, stopping all 21 shots he faced Friday for his fourth shutout in his past five Hockey East games. He has established incredible new single-season goaltending standards in the Hockey East record book, finishing league play with a 1.15 goals-against-average and a .953 save percentage shattering the old marks of 1.64 (UNH's Ty Conklin in 1998-99) and .938 (UNH's Mike Ayers in 2001-02). With Howard and no-slouch partner Frank Doyle between the pipes, Maine established a new record for defensive prowess in Hockey East, having allowed only 1.75 goals per game this season.

UMass Lowell got 40 saves from Chris Davidson and three assists from Elias Godoy Saturday at Providence to record a 4-3 win and clinch the No. 6 seed, avoiding an undesirable first-round matchup at Maine. Instead, the River Hawks will be the first-ever quarterfinal guests of the UMass Minutemen, who have struggled with an 0-6-1 record to close out the regular season. UMass Lowell won the season series, 2-1, but later forfeited its two wins vs. UMass due to the use of an ineligible player.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Captain Ben Eaves returned on Saturday after missing 15 games with a fractured kneecap. He assisted on all three BC goals ... BC has now lost three games in a row for the first time since the last three games of the 2001-02 season ... Freshman goalie Joe Pearce started both games for BC this weekend.

Boston University: Sean Fields earned his 60th career win Saturday, tying him with Scott Cashman for team record ... The Terriers had been shut out four straight times by UNH's Mike Ayers before ending the lengthy scoreless streak at 254:24 with their first goal on Thursday ... BU has nine ties this season, a school record.

University of Maine: Goaltender Jim Howard began the season with a shutout win over then top-ranked Minnesota and closed out the regular season with a shutout win over second-ranked Boston College ... Maine is 21-1-1 when leading after the first period ... The Black Bears have ten shutouts on the season, doubling the old team record of five, which was set just last season.

University of Massachusetts: UMass has scored two goals or less in the last seven games, posting an 0-6-1 mark in that span ... Thomas Pöck has 20 assists for the second straight season and now has 95 career points ... The Minutemen outshot NU 15-1 in the first period of Saturday's loss, and finished with a season-high 39 shots total. UMass outshot NU 77-41 this weekend but suffered two losses.

UMass Lowell: The hottest line as of late for UML is the combination of Andrew Martin, Bobby Robins and Jason Tejchma. The line has a total of six goals and eight assists over the past six games. Robins has five points in that span. He had just six point through the previous 24 games he had played in ... UML is now 7-0-0 in its last seven regular season finales.

Merrimack College: Jim Healey's 48 saves in Thursday's 3-3 tie at Lowell were the most by any goalie in a Hockey East game this season ... Merrimack went 2-1-3 over its last six games of the regular season. Senior captain Marco Rosa led the Warriors with seven points in that span.

New Hampshire: The BU Terriers got another win at the Whittemore Center Saturday, upping their all-time record there to 5-4-4. BU is the Wildcats' only league opponent that has a winning record at the Whittemore Center ... Senior forward Steve Saviano and BC forward Tony Voce lead the country in goal scoring with 26 each.

Northeastern University: Junior goalie Keni Gibson now holds the NU career records for save percentage (.905), goals against average (2.80) and shutouts (6) ... After starting the season 0-9-2, the Huskies went 11-7-5 over the final 23 games and ended the year with a four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1) ... After opening the season with three goals in the first nine games, junior Jason Guerriero had 32 points over the final 25 games and now has 99 points in his career.

Providence College: Freshman Colin McDonald has tallied a power-play goal in each of the last three games ... Senior Peter Zingoni has recorded at least one point in seven of the last eight games ... The Friars have six skaters with 20 or more points ... The Friars have gone 7 for 24 (.291) on the power play in their last four games.

WHO'S HOT

• **Jim Healey, MC** (Fr. G; Holyrood, NF) – Over his last six starts, has a 2-1-3 record with a 2.60 GAA, a .925 save percentage and an average of 31 saves per game.

• **Maine defense and goaltending** – Has allowed only eighteen goals in the last thirteen games for a 1.38 GAA. Sophomore Jimmy Howard has four shutouts in his last five league games and has allowed just six goals (none at even strength) over his last eight games overall. He has shattered the previous single-season Hockey East records for GAA and save percentage, compiling a 1.15 and .953, respectively.

• **UNH Penalty Kill** – Has killed off 15 of the last 16 power play opportunities by the opponent over the last five games (93.8%).
