## EIGHTH SEED BU KNOCKS OUT TOP SEED BC Maine, UMass, New Hampshire advance to Fleet with series wins

For the second consecutive season, the Boston University Terriers have risen from the ashes in their season series vs. Boston College to gain redemption against their fiercest rival. After losing four straight games vs. BC this season, including the Beanpot finale in overtime, BU has taken the best-of-three Hockey East quarterfinal series vs. top seed BC, two games to one. It is only the third time in Hockey East history that a No. 8 seed has eliminated a No. 1 seed. BC was the victim the first time it happened, a 6-5 loss to Northeastern in a one-game quarterfinal in 1991, while 1998 top seed BU suffered a 2-1 series loss to Merrimack.

Notching two wins on the weekend, senior goaltender Sean Fields moved into first-place all-time on the BU wins list, with 62. UNH counterpart Mike Ayers now enjoys a similar distinction, having posted his 58th career victory with a 1-0 shutout vs. Providence on Saturday. That breaks the previous record held by Ty Conklin. Ayers played a key role in the 2-1 series triumph over the Friars, allowing just one goal in Game One and none in the Game Three clincher. The only hiccup was a 4-3 OT loss in Game Two that was forced by PC's Colin McDonald, who converted a two-on-one break with fellow rookie Bill McCreary. Sean Collins had three of UNH's six goals in the series, including both in a 2-1 win in Game One. Fields, meanwhile, totalled 100 saves in the series vs. Boston College, as the Terriers won the set despite being outshot 108-45. Rookie Kenny Roche and sophomore Brad Zancanaro each had one goal in each of BU's wins, while Tony Voce led the BC offense in the series with two goals and two assists.

The UMass Minutemen ended the regular season in an 0-6-1 slump, but made quick work of UMass Lowell in their quarterfinal series, scoring victories of 6-3 and 3-1. Thomas Pöck led the way in Game One with a goal and three assists, but the story of the series was junior goaltender Tim Warner. Warner came in as an emergency replacement for injured starter Gabe Winer and posted 39 saves on 42 shots in the first game and 22 saves on 23 shots in the second game. The games marked Warner's first starts of the season.

At Maine, the Black Bears recovered from relatively slow first periods in both games to notch a series sweep with two slim one-goal wins over an opportunistic Merrimack squad. Colin Shields netted three of Maine's five goals on the weekend, including both in a 2-1 win in Game One.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** In the four games Ben Eaves has played since his return from injury, he and brother Patrick Eaves and Tony Voce have combined for seven goals and nine assists ... BC's 4-0 shutout of BU was its first over the Terriers since Feb. 24, 1960. It had been 21 years since there was a shutout by either team in the series.

**Boston University:** The Terriers' two wins over the Eagles over the weekend came on the birthday of two of the BU coaches. Head coach Jack Parker celebrated his 59th birthday with a 3-2 win on Thursday and assistant coach Mike Bavis turned 34 on Saturday, the same day as a 4-2 win for BU ... The Terriers' penalty-killing unit did a great job vs. the Eagles as BC was just 2-of-17 (.118) on its power play.

**University of Maine:** Maine ended its home season with two quarterfinal wins to lift its record on home ice to 17-1-1 this year ... The Black Bears overcame a 2-1 third-period deficit in Saturday's clincher vs. Merrimack. It was just their second win of the season when entering the third period trailing (2-7-0) ... Maine advances to the semifinals of the Hockey East Tournament for a league-most 15th time in 20 seasons of play ... Maine is 23-1 when scoring three goals or more this season.

**University of Massachusetts:** UMass has won four quarterfinal games in a row after going 0-for-9 in their first nine attempts ... UMass' six goals on Thursday matched a season high, set in the season opener against UConn. The last time UMass scored six against a Hockey East team was Nov. 15, 2002 ... Mike Warner scored two goals in Thursday's win. UMass is 8-0 this season when Warner scores ... Greg Mauldin has four goals in the last three games ... The Mullins Center averaged 4,507 fans per game this season, more than 1000 per game higher than the previous record.

**UMass Lowell:** The River Hawk power play unit converted on only one of its last 31 opportunities while the penalty kill finished with a 24-for-36 (.666) over the final 10 games ... Sophomore John Yaros finished the season with a .907 save percentage, which ranks third all-time in the Lowell record book, behind only Cam McCormick in 2001-02 (.920) and Dwayne Roloson in 1993-94 (.909).

**Merrimack College:** The Merrimack penalty kill was perfect in Maine over the weekend, holding the Black Bears scoreless on their 10 power play opportunities. The Warrior penalty killing unit went 19-for-20 over the last four games of the season ... Marco Rosa finishes his career tied for 49th on the school's all-time scoring list with 97 points.

**New Hampshire:** Senior goaltender Mike Ayers posted his 13th shutout of his career and fifth of the season en route to his 58th career victory, breaking the all-time school record for wins previously held by Ty Conklin ... With the win on Saturday, the Wildcats posted their eighth straight 20-win season ... Junior forward Preston Callander has scored 21 goals in his junior season. In his previous two seasons, he had totalled just 16 goals ... UNH has three 40+ point scorers, the most of any Hockey East school.

**Providence College:** The Friars ended a six-game losing streak in the Hockey East Tournament dating back to 2001 with a 4-3 overtime win over UNH. The win also marked PC's first overtime victory this season ... Senior defenseman Stephen Wood finished his career ranked 13th all-time in career games played at PC with 143 games.

## WHO'S HOT

• **Dusty Demianiuk in the Hockey East tournament** – In 45 career regular season games, the UMass defenseman has produced just two points. But in only five career Hockey East tournament games, he has two goals and two assists.

• **Jim Healey, MC** (Fr. G; Holyrood, NF) – Despite facing an average of over 32 shots per game over his last eight starts, he has compiled a 2.58 GAA and a .924 in that span.

• **Jim Howard, Maine** (So. G; Ogdensburg, NY) – Has allowed just seven goals (none at even strength) over his last nine games, ringing up four shutouts in that span.

• **Colin Shields, Maine** (Sr. F; Glasgow, Scotland) – Has at least one point in each of the last eight games.

• **UNH Penalty Kill** – Has killed off 21 of the last 23 power play opportunities by the opponent over the last eight games.
