## DENVER ENDS OUTSTANDING SEASON FOR BLACK BEARS Maine offense comes up just short in NCAA championship game

In the end, it once again came down to a single goal. Unfortunately, the Maine Black Bears were on the short end this time.

Following eight straight one-goal victories, seven coming in the postseason, fate caught up with the Black Bears as they finally suffered a one-goal loss, dropping a 1-0 decision to Denver in the NCAA championship game. The result epitomized the recent struggles endured by the Maine offense, which has been limited to two goals or fewer six times in the last eight games. Maine finished its season with only eight losses, four coming by a final score of 1-0.

The score soured a fantastic finish to the season for Maine goaltender Jim Howard, who calmly offset the team's scoring drought with his own one-man stopping show at the other end. He made 40 saves in Thursday's semifinal victory over Boston College, limiting the fully operational Eagle offense to one goal and receiving only two goals in support. That was enough for the win, however, his fifth of the playoffs. With only one goal allowed in the final, Howard completed his magnificent sophomore season with a GAA of 1.19 and a save percentage of .956. Both figures represent new single-season records in NCAA Division-I play.

Maine rookie Mike Hamilton was also a force in the semifinal vs. BC, setting up both Black Bear goals to extend his amazing postseason run. He scored Maine's only goal in a 1-0 win over BU in the Hockey East semifinal, scored a goal to start a dramatic four-goal Maine comeback vs. Harvard in his first NCAA tournament game, and scored the OT winner in a 2-1 triumph vs. Wisconsin in the East Regional final. He was named to the East Regional All-Tournament team and was subsequently selected as the Superskills Hockey East Rookie of the Month. He has been named Rookie of the Week for the fourth consecutive time.

Boston College ended its season one step closer to another championship, qualifying for the Frozen Four for the first time since winning it all in 2001. Loaded with talent, the Eagles will bid farewell to snipers Ben Eaves and Tony Voce, and star defenseman J.D. Forrest, all of whom were rookies on the 2001 team. Ryan Shannon scored BC's only goal in the semifinal vs. Maine, and finished with 42 points, No. 2 on the Eagle chart behind Voce and tied for fourth among all Hockey East players.

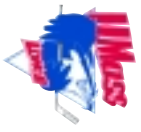
