# MAINE STAYS PERFECT WITH BACK-TO-BACK LEAGUE WINS UMass Lowell sweeps Northeastern to get an early jump in Hockey East

Last season, it took until January before Lowell recorded its first win in league play. The River Hawks were determined to get out of the gates a bit faster this season, and have done so already with a convincing weekend sweep over Northeastern. They are now 2-1 in league play, right alongside Massachusetts, who split the weekend against Providence.

Chris Davidson got the Hawks started right on the weekend, stopping 18 of the 19 shots he faced in the first period of Friday's game at Northeastern, emerging relatively unscathed. Sophomore sensation Ben Walter was limited to just an assist in the 5-2 win on Friday, but contributed two power play goals to UML's home victory by the same score on Saturday. He now has 10 goals in just seven games, second best in the NCAA. Eight of his goals have come on the man advantage.

Providence spread the wealth in Friday's 6-2 win at Massachusetts as six different Friars found the net while three other Friars recorded two assists each, including rookie Bill McCreary. UMass struck back on Saturday, however, getting two power play markers from slick-skating defenseman Thomas Pöck en route to a 4-2 triumph. Friar netminder David Cacciola continued his hot streak, stopping 32 of 35 shots before UMass tallied an empty-netter.

Massachusetts and UMass Lowell are both trailing Maine in the standings. The Black Bears got two goals from CCM Player of the Month Todd Jackson to cruise to a 6-2 win over Merrimack on Thursday. Marco Rosa had both goals for Merrimack, both set up by Matt Johnson, who had four assists on the week. Hosting BU on Saturday, Maine sat on a pair of first period goals and Frank Doyle did the rest, turning aside 23 of 24 shots as Maine prevailed, 2-1.

In non-conference action, UNH rookie Jacob Micflikier exploded for four goals and an assist in a 9-2 win over Union. He is the first Hockey East rookie to score four goals in a game since BC's Brian Gionta scored four vs. UMass Lowell on Feb. 28, 1998. For his unique feat, Micflikier was selected as the CCM Player of the Week and was also selected as the Superskills Hockey Rookie of the Month for October. (See related release.)

#### TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Captain Ben Eaves is listed as probable for Wednesday's game vs. UMass Lowell.

**Boston University:** The Terriers will be looking to score their first goal against New Hampshire in four games. They have been shut out in their last three matches against UNH. Wildcat goaltender Mike Ayers has a shutout streak of 182:41 vs. BU ... In special teams' play, the Terriers have scored just two power play goals in 17 chances (.118), but they have killed off 17 of 20 chances (.850) by their opponents.

University of Maine: As storied as the program has been in the past, Maine's 7-0 start this season is its best ever ... Maine is the first team this season to go into a weekend ranked No. 1 and emerge undefeated. Minnesota, BC and UNH all lost a game immediately after being ranked at the top ... Freshman Keith Johnson faced off against his older brother, BU senior Gregg Johnson, for the first time as collegiate rivals on Saturday.

University of Massachusetts: Dating back to last season, the Minutemen have won five straight road games, a school record. Three of the wins have come over ranked foes and all have come against Hockey East teams ... UMass' 5-1 start is its best since joining Hockey East ... The Minutemen are 18-1 when scoring four or more goals in a game since the start of last season.

**UMass Lowell:** Four River Hawks scored his first goal of the season in Friday's 5-2 win at Northeastern ... Ben Walter is the first Lowell player to score 10 goals in the first seven games of a season since Mike Carr had 12 in the first seven games of the 1981-82 frame.

Merrimack College: Merrimack has outscored its opponents 11-10 over the first two period but has been outscored 12-5 in the third period this year ... On Saturday, Tim Reidy scored the team's first short-handed goal in almost a year. The last came against Dartmouth on Nov. 3, 2002 ... Friday night will be Joe Exter Night at the J. Thom Lawler Arena. Exter, the former All-Star Warrior goalie who survived a life-threatening injury at the end of the last season, will address the crowd and be available for autographs between periods.

University of New Hampshire: Fourteen different UNH players got into the scoring column in Friday's 9-2 win over Union. The line of Jacob Micflikier, Justin Aikins and Preston Callander accounted for five goals and five assists ... UNH scored five goals in the third period vs. Union and has outscored opponents 13-4 in the third period so far this season ... The Wildcats' next four opponents (BC, BU, Maine and Providence) are all ranked in the top 15 of the national polls and have a combined record of 17-5-3 so far.

**Northeastern University:** Sophomore Brian Swiniarski and junior Jason Guerriero each scored a goal in each of the games against UMass Lowell. Swiniarski has four goals in the last five games and has scored those on just six shots ... At 0-4-1, the Huskies are off to their roughest start since going 0-4-1 in 1990-91.

**Providence College:** The Friars are unbeaten (3-0-1) on the road this season ... Each of three different Friars recorded his first collegiate goal this weekend ... Senior Peter Zingoni and freshman Chase Watson have each recorded at least one point in six of the eight games this season.

- Jacob MicFlikier, UNH (Fr. F; Winnipeg, MB) Has scored all eight of his points (six goals, two assists) in the last three games.
- Ben Walter, UML (So. F; Langley, BC) In just seven games, Walter has 10 goals, second-best in the NCAA and double the entire output of his rookie season.
- BC penalty kill Has killed off 16 straight opposing power plays and 29 of 31 on the season.
- Maine defense and goaltending Two shutouts and only nine total goals allowed over seven games this season (1.29 GAA).
- Todd Jackson and Maine's penalty kill Jackson has four of Maine's five short-handed goals. Opponents have totalled just three power play goals.
- **UNH power play** Already has 12 goals on just 36 opportunities, a percentage of 33.3, best in the nation.
