UMASS LOWELL TAKES THREE OF FOUR POINTS VS. BU Minutemen continue march with 1-1 tie vs. 4th ranked Maine

One third of the way through the season, four teams have made similar early claims to Hockey East's 20th anniversary title.

As expected, preseason favorite Boston College and two-time defending champ UNH are both in the mix. BC rebounded from a 3-3 tie vs. eighth-place Merrimack last Tuesday to post a 7-4 win over Providence Friday. Tony Voce had a power play hat trick to lead a manadvantage unit that struck five times vs. the Friars. New Hampshire overcame a 2-0 first period deficit to record a 3-2 victory at Northeastern Friday, the first for the 'Cats at Matthews Arena since January of 1999. The Wildcats completed the weekend sweep with a 5-2 win at home on Saturday.

Despite losing its top five scorers from last season, the University of Maine also appears to be in good shape. The Black Bears are one of only two Division I squads to have reached the 10-win plateau already, and hold a strong 5-2-1 league record, with their only losses coming vs. BC and UNH. Their first tie of the season came Friday at ninth-ranked UMass, the team that ousted them in the quarterfinals of last year's Hockey East playoffs. The Minutemen are not only officially on the map now, but they are legitimate early season contenders for the Hockey East title. They are tied for first place with Maine and UNH, with Boston College, still undefeated in league play, right behind.

The UMass Lowell River Hawks have put last season's frustrations far behind them and stand at a solid 3-3-1 in league play which includes a win and a tie vs. Boston University this past weekend. Junior Chris Davidson had 28 saves in each game and has a 2.69 GAA and a .910 save percentage in league play, huge improvements over last year's numbers.

After posting an impressive 3-3 tie at Boston College, Merrimack split a weekend set at home vs. Bemidji State. Sophomore defenseman Bryan Schmidt scored an overtime goal late Sunday to put the exclamation point on a four-point week. Teammate Brent Gough had two point in each of the three games and is now tied for sixth in the league in overall scoring with 13 points in 14 games played.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Ben Eaves registered his 100th career assist (in 110 games played) Friday vs. Providence. Tony Voce's hat trick against Providence was the fourth of his career and second of the season ... The Eagles finished an incredible 5-for-7 on the power play against Providence.

Boston University: Matt Radoslovich came into this season with a total of three goals in 43 games, but has scored four already in just nine games this year. Teammate Frantisek Skladany, who had a team-leading 14 goals last year, is still looking for his first this season ... Sean Fields is the all-time leader in minutes played at BU with 5812:45.

University of Maine: Rookie Michel Leveille recorded his 12th assist of the season in Friday's 1-1 tie at Massachusetts and ranks second in Hockey East in that category ... Maine has outshot its opponents in all but one game this season (4-1 loss to BC 11/7) and holds a 431-313 edge in total shots. Maine has outscored opponents by a combined total of 52 to 24.

University of Massachusetts: Sophomore James Solon has scored a goal in two straight games. He scored only one as a freshman ... After losing 14 in a row to the Maine Black Bears, the Minutemen are 3-1-1 against Maine in the last five games ... Thomas Pöck saw his six-game scoring streak come to an end against Maine. It is the second six-game streak he had this year ... UMass is 2-2-1 when scoring two goals or less this season. Last year's team went 0-12-1 when scoring two goals or less.

UMass Lowell: UML won at Walter Brown Arena for just the fourth time in program history Friday evening ... The River Hawks saw their penalty killing streak of 21 straight snapped Friday night, as the Terriers scored on their first man-advantage of the night ... Mark Pandolfo scored a goal in each game vs. BU this weekend. Three of his six career goals have come vs. BU, where his cousins Jay and Mike starred.

Merrimack College: Senior Marco Rosa scored a goal each night against Bemidji State, marking the first time he has scored in back-to-back games since scoring in three straight games as a freshman ... Defenseman Bryan Schmidt leads the team with 40 shots on goal this year ... Merrimack went 4-for-8 (.500) on the power play over three games last week.

University of New Hampshire: Sophomore goaltender Jeff Pietrasiak made his first career Hockey East start on Saturday with a 5-2 win over the Huskies ... On Friday, the Wildcats earned their first win at NU's Matthews Arena since January 29, 1999. Conversely, UNH owns a 10-1-2 record vs. the Huskies all-time at the Whittemore Center ... UNH has allowed two goals or fewer in eight of its 11 games.

Northeastern University: The Huskies have outshot their opponents in 7 of 10 games this season, but have yet to record a win ... The NU penalty-killing unit limited UNH's top-ranked power play to 2-of-13 conversions ... In just his sixth career start, NU sophomore walk-on Jonathan Koop scored his first career goal with a slap shot from the blue line Saturday at UNH.

Providence College: The Friars have 17 different skaters who have tallied at least one goal this season. Five Friars have recorded 10 points or more ... The Friars are 4-0 in non-conference games this season.

- Justin Aikins, UNH (Jr. F; Surrey, BC) Has posted one goal and nine assists in his last five game, an average of two points per game.
- Brent Gough, MC (So. F; St. Albert, AB) Has recorded two points in each of his last three games and has nine points over the last six games.
- Ryan Shannon, BC (Jr. F; Darien, CT) Has at least one point in each of the last six games (all in league play) and has taken over the BC scoring lead.
- Gabe Winer, UMass (So. G; Stoughton, MA) Is 4-1-1 with a .910 save percentage and a 1.81 GAA over the last six games.
- **UNH power play** Has scored at least one goal in each of 11 games this year. Forty percent of UNH's 50 goals have come with the man advantage.


