CHAMPIONSHIP TICKETS NOW ON SALE *FleetCenter prepares for sellout crowds for semifinals and final*

In anticipation of the same unrivaled fan enthusiasm that has tested the FleetCenter's capacity for its past five tournaments, the Hockey East Association is pleased to announce that tickets to the 2004 Hockey East Championship Tournament are now on sale. Championship tickets can be purchased in person at the FleetCenter box office, via phone through Ticketmaster (617-931-2000), or online at HockeyEastOnline.com or Ticketmaster.com.

The tournament semifinal games will take place on Friday, March 19th, and are scheduled to face-off at 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. The ticket prices of \$15/\$21* per seat in the balcony or \$28 per seat in the loge include admission to both semifinal games.

Winners of the semifinals will advance to the title game at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 20th, to determine the winner of the 2004 Lamoriello Trophy. Ticket prices will again be \$15/\$21* for balcony seats and \$28 for loge. For both events, a \$5 discount* on balcony seats will be available to groups of 15 or more people and to students with a valid ID from any Hockey East member institution.

"Last year, we were pleased to see brisk December sales as many fans used tournament tickets as holiday gifts," said Hockey East Commissioner Joe Bertagna. "With the semifinal sellout last March — and our earliest on-sale date ever — we expect even better sales this holiday season."

The 2003 tournament was another classic as the University of New Hampshire successfully defended its first Hockey East Tournament title, defeating the Boston University Terriers, 1-0 in overtime, in the title game. A record crowd of 34,328 witnessed the two nights of FleetCenter action in 2003 and similar crowds are expected in 2004.

League executives have strongly recommended that fans procure their tickets early for what promises to be one of the most exciting events of the 2003-04 college hockey season.

*Under 2004 pricing, all loge seats are \$28; balcony seats have a two-tiered pricing structure, with the first six rows priced at \$21 and all other balcony seats priced at \$15. Students may apply their \$5 discount to all balcony seats while groups (15 or more people) may only apply their discounts for the \$15 tickets. There are no discounts for loge seats.

BACK-TO-BACK HAT TRICKS FOR BU BLUELINERS Boston College remains undefeated in Hockey East with 4-2 win vs. NU

Trying to combat an average start to their 2003-04 season, the BU Terriers exploded for seven goals vs. Yale Sunday night en route to a 7-2 victory. Two BU defensemen (Ryan Whitney and Kevin Schaeffer) recorded hat tricks, an extremely rare occurrence at any level in hockey. Schaeffer was a quick choice as Superskills Hockey Rookie of the Week, as he totalled five points over three games. The Terriers are exactly .500 at 4-4-4 through 12 games.

Across town, Boston College is off to a strong 9-2-3 start and is leading the league with an undefeated 5-0-2 record. The Eagles knocked off both Dartmouth (4-1) and Northeastern (4-2) this past week, the latter coming in the face of a 2-0 deficit. BC's penalty-killing unit was a perfect 7-for-7 (now 59-for-65 on the season) and notched its fourth short-hander of the year courtesy of Stephen Gionta. The goal came on a two-man disadvantage and catapulted BC's comeback win over NU.

Although UMass Lowell suffered a 2-1 loss to visiting RPI Friday, it only slightly dimmed the glory of a 5-4 victory at UNH earlier in the week. The River Hawks jumped out to a 3-0 lead and finished with the 'W' thanks to three goals and an assist from sophomore Elias Godoy, Hockey East's CCM Player of the Week. New Hampshire got back in the win column with a 4-3 triumph over RPI on Saturday.

Massachusetts saw its seven-game road win streak come to an end in front of a hostile crowd of 8,314 at Nebraska-Omaha on Friday. But the Minutemen rebounded with a hard-earned 1-1 tie in the rematch on Saturday and finished the week at 1-1-1, having downed Vermont earlier in the week. Defenseman Thomas Pöck continued his scoring consistency with a point in each game, including the only goal in the 1-1 tie.

In other non-conference action, Providence skated to a 1-1 tie in the Mayor's Cup vs. No. 14 Brown, the ECAC's first-place squad. David Cacciola stopped all but one of 27 shots faced to improve his already impressive stats to a 1.68 GAA and a .945 save percentage. Meanwhile, Merrimack split a two-game set vs. visiting Quinnipiac. Casey Guenther got the 4-1 win Friday, stopping 21 of 22 shots.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Stephen Gionta has scored three of BC's four shorthanded goals this year ... Five Eagles are on point-scoring streaks of at least three games: Ryan Shannon (8 games), Chris Collins and Stephen Gionta (5), and Tony Voce and Ben Eaves (3).

Boston University: For likely the first time in Hockey East history, two defensemen registered hat tricks in the same game when both Kevin Schaeffer and Ryan Whitney notched three goals each vs. Yale on Sunday. The last time two BU players had hat tricks in the same game were Jon Pratt and Bob Lachance vs. Merrimack on Jan. 29, 1994. The last time a defenseman had a hat trick in a game was Tom Poti vs. UMass on February 28, 1998. The last time a freshman had a hat trick was Mike Pandolfo vs. Princeton on November 6, 1998 ... Sean Fields appeared in his 99th career game Sunday, tying the BU record held by Scott Cashman.

University of Maine: Maine will return to the ice on Friday at Merrimack following a 12 day break ... Maine is 5-0-0 at home this season and also have a winning record on the road - 3-2-1 ... The Black Bears' freshman class is led by Luciano Aquino and Mike Lundin, each with seven points.

University of Massachusetts: UMass saw two lengthy streaks come to an end with a 7-2 loss at Nebraska-Omaha on Friday. The Minutemen had won seven straight road games and were undefeated in their last 11 non-conference games. Interestingly, Nebraska-Omaha was the last team outside of Hockey East to defeat UMass, a 3-2 win in Amherst on Oct. 27, 2002 ... UMass allowed four power play goals to host Nebraska-Omaha on Friday, but stopped the Mavericks on all six tries in Saturday's rematch.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks have scored at least four goals in each of their last four meetings vs. UNH and Mike Ayers ... Freshman Cleve Kinley tallied his first collegiate goal Tuesday evening at UNH ... The River Hawks have allowed at least one power play goal in each of their last four outings. Earlier this season, they responded to a similar stretch by stopping 21 straight opportunities.

Merrimack College: Marco Rosa has scored a goal in three of the last four games ... Merrimack will play its 500th game in the S. Peter Volpe Athletic Center this Friday night when the Warriors host Maine ... Merrimack has outscored its opponents 16-15 in the second period this year but has been outscored 20-8 in the third period.

University of New Hampshire: The Wildcats failed to score a power play goal for the first time this year, but still managed a 4-3 win over RPI on Saturday ... Justin Aikins has quickly reached the 20-point plateau and is tied for fourth in the nation in scoring ... UNH has scored four or more goals in nine of its 13 games this season and currently ranks second in the nation at 4.46 goals per game.

Northeastern University: Freshman Brian Deeth scored his first collegiate goal in NU's 4-2 loss to BC ... NU has played four straight games against teams ranked fourth or higher. The Husky penalty kill has been impressive in those games, killing 18 of 21 (85.7 percent). Of NU's 11 games, seven have been against opponents ranked in the Top 15.

Providence College: PC is 4-0-1 in non-conference games this season ... The Friars moved to 10-6-2 all-time in Mayor's Cup action with a 1-1 tie versus Brown on Tuesday. Torry Gajda scored his seventh goal of the season, a career best.

• **Justin Aikins, UNH** (Jr. F; Surrey, BC) – Has scored at least one point in each of his last seven games, totalling 13 points in that span.

• **Ryan Whitney, BU** (Jr. D; Scituate, MA) – Has scored five goals in the last four games after going without a single goal in the first eight games of the season.

• **BC's 'Second' Line** (Jr. F; Darien, CT) – Each of the trio (Chris Collins, Ryan Shannon, Stephen Gionta) has posted at least one point in five straight games. Over that stretch, the line is responsible for seven goals and 13 assists.

• **Merrimack Power Play** – Has scored eight goals over the last five games, going 8-for-22 (.364) over that stretch.

• **UNH freshman class** – Has contributed seven goals and seven assists over the past four games.
