NOR'EASTER NETS NORTHEASTERN'S FIRST WIN Snow forces postponement of three league games

Thwarting an early season snowstorm, the only two Division-I teams still winless went ahead with their date with destiny Saturday, and Northeastern prevailed, 1-0, over Vermont. The Huskies' first win of the season was led by junior goaltender Keni Gibson, who remained true against 25 shots in netting his second career shutout, and rookie Ray Ortiz, who potted his first career goal, the most significant of the NU season so far.

The two league games on Saturday (Maine at Merrimack, BC at Providence) were postponed, as was Sunday's UMass game at BU, all due to inclement weather. Maine and Merrimack have rescheduled their game to Tuesday, Jan. 6. No make-up dates have yet been selected for the other two contests.

Friday's games were concluded before the weather came in. Maine jumped on Merrimack for three first period goals and that was all the Black Bears needed for a 3-1 win as Jimmy Howard stopped 28 of the 29 shots he faced. At Boston College, Tony Voce added another hat trick to his resume with three goals and an assist in BC's first meeting of the season with Boston University, a 5-2 Eagle win. Patrick Eaves netted the other two BC goals while elder brother Ben picked up three assists.

Sharing a North Country trip, UNH and UMass Lowell each got a victory at Clarkson and each got a loss at St. Lawrence. Wildcat Sean Collins got his first career hat trick in Friday's 4-3 win at Clarkson and he added another goal in a loss at St. Lawrence on Saturday. Lowell squandered a 4-3 third period lead at St. Lawrence Friday, but overcame a 2-1 third period deficit at Clarkson on Saturday. Mark Pandolfo had three goals in the weekend set.

Preseason favorite Boston College will hold the lead in the Hockey East standings heading into the holiday break. Undefeated in league play, the Eagles have a three-point advantage over both UNH and Massachusetts, who play the final Hockey East contest of 2003 Thursday in Amherst. The two teams are tied in the standings one-third of the way through the schedule. A record crowd could be on hand for Thursday's match, the rivals' first meeting since UNH edged UMass, 5-4, in last year's Hockey East semifinals.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC's top forward line of Tony Voce, Ben Eaves and Patrick Eaves was back together for the first time in four games and did not disappoint, as they scored all five goals and also added five assists in Friday's win over BU ... Dave Spina returned to the BC lineup, making his first appearance since the season opener at Vermont. He had missed 13 games with an ankle injury.

Boston University: Sean Fields appeared in his 100th career game Friday night at BC, a new Terrier record. His 46 saves in the game brought his career total to 2479, also a new Terrier record. Scott Cashman held both records before Friday ... BU has scored just five third period goals this season.

University of Maine: Freshman Michel Leveille recorded his team-leading 13th assist of the season on Friday at Merrimack. He is still looking for his first career goal ... Maine holds a 466-343 edge in total shots this season, but even more impressively holds a 55-25 advantage on the scoreboard ... Maine has scored just 12 power play goals on 68 attempts, but has allowed only seven goals on 66 power play chances to its opponents.

University of Massachusetts: Sunday's game at Boston University was postponed due to weather. A make-up date has not yet been selected.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks were 5-0-1 this season when leading after two periods before surrendering two third period goals in Friday's 5-4 loss at St. Lawrence. They were 0-5-1 this season when trailing after two periods before scoring three third period goals in Saturday's 4-3 win at Clarkson ... Mark Pandolfo has scored in five of the last six outings for the River Hawks.

Merrimack College: Saturday's game vs. Maine was postponed due to weather and has been rescheduled for Tuesday, January 6 at 7:00 p.m. ... Tim Reidy scored the lone goal for the Warriors on Friday night. Reidy has scored all six of his goals at home this year ... Defenseman Bryan Schmidt ended a five-game point streak on Friday night ... Seven of the last nine games vs. Maine at home have been decided by two goals or less.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has scored at least one power play goal in 13 of its 15 games this year ... UNH suffered its first loss to an ECAC opponent on Saturday at St. Lawrence and is now 4-1 vs. the ECAC this season ... Senior forward Nathan Martz has scored at least one point in all nine games he has played in this year ... Freshman defenseman John Doherty scored his first collegiate goal on Friday night at Clarkson.

Northeastern University: Junior Keni Gibson's shutout Saturday was the second of his career and first since 3-0 win at BU on Jan. 6, 2002 ... Freshman Ray Ortiz's gamewinning goal in Saturday's 1-0 win over Vermont was also the first goal of his career ... NU is dominating at 12-3-2 in its last 17 games against foes from the ECAC.

Providence College: Saturday's game vs. Boston College was postponed due to weather. A make-up date has not yet been selected ... PC is 4-0-1 in non-conference games this season.

- Sean Collins, UNH (Jr. F; Reading, MA) Has scored at least one point in each of his last seven games (six goals, four assists).
- Ryan Shannon, BC (Jr. F; Darien, CT) Has a ninegame point streak, the longest by a Hockey East player this season. BC is undefeated in that span.
- Tony Voce and Ben Eaves, BC Over the last four games, Voce has seven goals while Eaves has contributed eight assists.
- BC Penalty Killing Has allowed just six power play goals while scoring five short-handers.


