REDEMPTION: BC ROOKIE STOPPER NAMED TOURNEY MVP Pöck has a hand in seven of eight UMass goals over two games

Joe Pearce's collegiate debut is probably a game that he'd just as soon forget. The BC rookie was tagged for three goals on eight shots vs. Merrimack on Nov. 18, and was subsequently pulled by head coach Jerry York. This past Saturday night, Pearce came back with guite a vengeance, stopping 34 of 35 shots faced in a 4-1 win over sixth-ranked Michigan in front of a hostile Joe Louis Arena crowd of over 13.000. He then recorded a 4-3 win over Michigan State in the championship game of the Great Lakes Invitational Tournament and was selected as the tourney's Most Valuable Player. Fellow Eagles Ben Eaves (two goals, two assists) and Andrew Alberts (a goal and an assist) were also named to the All-Tournament Team. Ryan Shannon extended his point streak to 12 games. BC is undefeated in that span and has now won seven straight.

Thomas Pöck re-ignited his Hobey Baker bid with two goals and five assists as the Most Valuable Player of the Sheraton Banknorth Classic at Vermont. He is tied for third in the nation in scoring with 27 points and is 10 points ahead of the No. 2 defenseman on the list, Brian Yandle of UNH. UMass recorded back-to-back ties in the tournament and has five ties in the last eight games.

Providence and UMass Lowell both recorded a win and a loss on the weekend. The Friars advanced to the championship game of the first-ever Dunkin' Donuts Coffee Pot with a 4-3 win over Clarkson, but were humbled 6-1 in the title game by St. Cloud State. UMass Lowell mounted a furious comeback in the face of a 4-0 deficit vs. Ferris State in the opener of the Badger Classic, but ultimately lost by a 7-4 final. Ferris State went on to win the title over host Wisconsin while UML managed a 5-3 consolation game win over Union. Paul Mammola made 33 saves for the victory.

Third-ranked Maine had perhaps the toughest draw of the weekend at the Everblades College Classic, and it showed as the Black Bears suffered back-to-back losses. Goaltender Frank Doyle was solid in defeat, stopping 53 of 57 shots faced over the two contests. Defenseman Prestin Ryan netted two assists in a 4-2 loss to No. 11 Ohio State.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Boston College is undefeated in the last 12 games. BC last went 12 games without a loss when it closed the 2000-01 season with 10 straight victories, including the NCAA championship.

University of Maine: For the first time in four years of the Everblades College Classic, Maine failed to advance to the championship game ... Maine's 1-0 loss to Notre Dame Sunday marked its first shutout loss and first one-goal loss of the season. The last time Maine was shut out was Oct. 18, 2002, 3-0 vs. Colorado College.

University of Massachusetts: With back-to-back ties this past weekend, UMass has five ties in its last eight games ... Marvin Degon has scored in seven of eight road games this season after scoring in only one as a freshman ... UMass has scored at least one power play goal in seven straight games and scored one shorthanded goal in each game over the weekend.

UMass Lowell: After surrendering six unanswered goals to Niagara on December 14, UMass Lowell gave up the first four goals of the game Saturday against Ferris State ... A total of six River Hawks currently have a point-scoring streak of two games or more.

Northeastern University: In each of the last five games, an NU player has registered his first collegiate goal. Freshman Aaron Moore becoming the latest Husky to accomplish the feat in Sunday's 6-4 win over Colgate ... Keni Gibson had his shutout streak snapped at 131 minutes and 33 seconds, but recorded his third straight victory ... Over the last three games, all wins, NU has limited its opponents to five or fewer shots in the third period.

Providence College: Three freshmen scored in PC's 4-3 victory over Clarkson, including Bill McCreary, who netted the game-winner ... The Friars dropped their first non-conference game of the season with the loss versus St. Cloud State. PC is now 5-1-1 in non league games. St. Cloud also stopped junior Chris Chaput's six-game point streak.

World Junior Championships: Team USA is off to a 2-0 start at the World Junior Championships in Finland, having manhandled Austria and Slovakia by scores of 8-0 and 5-0, respectively. BC's Patrick Eaves had a goal and two assists in the second period of the win over Austria and was named the team's top player of the game. UMass' Stephen Werner closed out the scoring for Team USA in the win over Slovakia.

Happy ending to rough year: Former Merrimack netminder Joe Exter signed his first pro contract last week, marking a complete recovery from a life-threatening head injury sustained during a collision with BC's Patrick Eaves in last year's Hockey East quarterfinals.

• Mark Pandolfo, UML (So. F; North Andover, MA) – Has scored six goals over the last five games.

• Ryan Shannon, BC (Jr. F; Darien, CT) – Has a 12game point streak, the longest by a Hockey East player this season. BC is undefeated in that span.

• Ben Eaves and Tony Voce, BC – The senior linemates have connected for 18 points over the last four games and each has a seven-game point streak. Voce has 10 goals in that span.

• Merrimack Special Teams – Over the past seven games, Merrimack has gone 10-for-31 (.322) on the power play and 25-for-28 (.893) on the penalty kill. The Warriors now have the the league's best overall power play and the second-best overall penalty kill.


