BEST OF BOTH WORLDS: NORTH DAKOTA VS. MAINE Whittemore Center readies for the Ice Breaker

Yes, it's very early in the season, but few can suggest this weekend's two-game series between third-ranked Maine and fifthranked North Dakota won't feature two of the best games of the year.

North Dakota brings the best offense of 2003-04 (4.44 GPG) into Alfond Arena, home of 2003-04's best defense, the Black Bears' 1.57 goals-against-per-game. The teams ranked 1-2 in scoring margin, with North Dakota way ahead of the pack with a mighty 2.24 goals-per-game differential.

trio of superstars, two of whom have left the team after signing pro contracts in the offseason. WCHA Rookie of the Year Brady Murray is back, but he may be the only true sniper left on the roster.

Maine, on the other hand, was led by its goaltenders, the outstanding tandem of Frank Doyle and Jimmy Howard. Doyle has graduated, but Howard is coming off a record-breaking year that suggests he is the top goaltender in the nation, easily capable of excelling in a full slate of games.

Maine was outstanding at home last year, going 17-1-1. North Dakota will have two chances to topple the Black Bears in their own building, but Boston College had the same opportunity last March and was swept at Alfond Arena on the final weekend of the regular season.

The series has all the makings of a great weekend of hockey, but so too does the Ice Breaker Tournament, featuring one team from each of the four "senior" college hockey conferences. The annual tournament, now in its eighth year, will be hosted by UNH this season and will open with St. Cloud (WCHA) taking on St. Lawrence (ECACHL). In Saturday's nightcap, No. 10 UNH (Hockey East) faces No. 12 Ohio State (CCHA). Hockey East teams have dominated the Ice Breaker recently, winning two consecutive and three of the last four.

Boston University and Northeastern are both headed to Dayton, Ohio, for the Lefty McFadden Invitational, and each will get a crack at top-ranked Michigan and its CCHA sibling Miami. Merrimack has also accepted a tournament invitation and will be opening the Maverick Stampede at Nebraska-Omaha against Rensselaer. After not playing in any tournaments last year, the Warriors are slated for four tourneys this season.

The four other Hockey East schools will break into their 2004-05 schedules relatively slowly. Both Massachusetts and Providence will host Clarkson, while Boston College has only an exhibition game on its slate, Saturday against New Brunswick. UMass Lowell head coach Blaise MacDonald will have a homecoming of sorts, travelling to upstate New York to take on his former squad at Niagara.
