UMASS LOWELL, UNH TRADE KNOCK DOWN PUNCHES BC goes 2-0-1 on week to run unbeaten streak to 13 straight

Setting a sharp tone for the stretch run, the UMass Lowell River Hawks and UNH Wildcats both made their marks, posting big wins over each other in a grueling weekend set. Lowell made the first statement, cruising to a 7-0 victory Friday at home led by two goals and two assists from junior Danny O'Brien and 21 saves from rookie Peter Vetri. The win upped UML's undefeated streak to 14 games overall and also upped its Hockey East winning streak to six straight games.

But UNH ended both runs in the rematch, pouring in five unanswered goals in the third period to post an 8-3 victory. Six of the eight goals came on the power play, tying a Hockey East record coincidentally last accomplished by UNH vs. UMass Lowell in January of 1996. Jacob MicFlikier was the most productive Wildcat, netting three power play goals and adding two assists.

Earlier in the week, UNH managed a 2-2 tie at BC in one of the best games of the year so far. UNH goaltender Jeff Pietrasiak was outstanding with 41 saves, including three in overtime. Patrick Eaves set up both Eagle goals and added two more assists and three goals of his own in a weekend set vs. Massachusetts. He was named the ITECH First Star in all three games.

Maine extended its undefeated streak in league play to 11 games, the best by any team this season, with a win and a tie vs. Northeastern, in spite of NU goaltender Keni Gibson's best efforts. Gibson stopped 57 of 60 Black Bear shots on the weekend, but only got two goals in support. Gibson did pick up one win on the week, 4-3 vs. Merrimack.

Boston University got back in the win column following a modest 0-3-1 slump. The Terriers picked up two one-goal victories over Merrimack and Providence, but lost goaltender John Curry to a shoulder injury in the process. Curry is expected back in 1-2 weeks, but may miss the Beanpot opener vs. Boston College.

The only other game last week was a non-league game for Providence vs. UConn. The Friars put up a 4-1 advantage early and held on for a 4-3 win to snap a five-game winless skid.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC's 13-game unbeaten streak is the longest single-season unbeaten streak for the Eagles during Jerry York's tenure ... Rookie goaltender Cory Schneider remains unbeaten at 8-0-3.

Boston University: Terrier goalie John Curry will be out of the lineup 1-2 weeks due to a separated shoulder ... The Terriers' power play is just 2-for-39 over the last six games and 0-for-16 over the last three ... David Van der Gulik has been strong in 13 home games this year, with nine goals and five assists, better than a point per game.

University of Maine: In the last seven games, Maine has posted a 4-0-3 record. Goaltender Jimmy Howard has a 1.24 GAA and a .941 save percentage in that time, including two shutouts. Maine also has an 11-game undefeated streak (7-0-4) in league play, the best mark by any Hockey East team this season.

University of Massachusetts: Four of the six points tallied vs. BC this past weekend were notched by defensemen ...In Friday's game, goaltender Tim Warner made his first start since Nov. 23 vs. Vermont. Freshman Jamie Gilbert came on in relief in the third period, seeing his first action since Nov. 6 vs. Merrimack.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks' 14-game unbeaten streak was broken with a loss at UNH on Saturday. It was the longest streak for Lowell in its history as a Division-I team ... UML had held opponents scoreless on 21 straight powerplay chances before giving up six man-advantage goals Saturday at UNH ... Ben Walter's goal Saturday night was his first career goal against UNH. The Wildcats were the only Hockey East team Walter had not scored a goal against ... Peter Vetri's hot streak came to an end Saturday. He had gone 10-0-2 in his previous 13 appearances (12 starts) with a 1.47 GAA and .938 save percentage in that span.

Merrimack College: Rookie Jordan Fox had a modest fourgame point streak ended when he was held without a point in Thursday's 3-2 loss at BU ... Merrimack's penalty kill is ranked 11th in the nation. The Warriors killed off all five penalties in Thursday's game at Boston University, including a five-minute major.

University of New Hampshire: The Wildcats are the only team in Hockey East with a perfect record at home (12-0-0) ... Saturday night's win vs. Lowell marked the first win for the Wildcats against the River Hawks in their last six meetings ... After scoring six man-advantage goals vs. Lowell Saturday (tying a Hockey East record), UNH overtook the River Hawks as the nation's top ranked power play (25.5 percent) ... Preston Callander ended a six-game goal streak when he was held scoreless Friday at Lowell.

Northeastern University: Northeastern picked up a point at Maine on Saturday to split the season-series with the Black Bears, 1-1-1 ... Friday's game marked the third time this season that NU has been shut out. The Huskies were shut out just once in 2003-04, and that was a 0-0 tie.

Providence College: Chris Chaput continues to inch closer to the century mark as he needs 13 more points to become the 48th Friar to reach 100 ... Providence has posted a 10-2-3 mark in February over the last two seasons.

WHO'S HOT

- Patrick Eaves, BC (Jr. F; Faribault, MN) Following a modest start to his junior season, Eaves has caught fire with an eight-game point streak. notching seven goals and nine assists in that span.
- Andrew Martin, UML (Jr. F; Brampton, ON) Has 23 points (8 goals, 15 assists) in his last 15 games.
- Boston College Defense and Goaltending The Eagles are on an 13-game undefeated streak thanks to stingy defense and goaltending, which has allowed just 16 goals in that span (1.23 per game).
- UNH Offense After going scoreless at Lowell Friday, the Wildcat attack poured on eight goals in Saturday's rematch. The team has scored at least six goals in four of the last six games. UNH's first line of Sean Collins, Preston Callander and Brett Hemingway has amassed 100 combined points over 26 games this season.
