LITTLE SETTLED AS MAINE, UNH SPLIT Terriers anxious to knock Eagles off perch

Some lengthy streaks came to a screeching halt this weekend around Hockey East. Maine put the brakes on first, ending UNH's perfect 12-0 start at home this season with a 3-1 win over the Wildcats at the Whittemore Center on Friday. Rookie Billy Ryan provided the offense, scoring twice, while Jimmy Howard totalled 28 saves.

But UNH got the last laugh, outlasting Maine 2-1 in the rematch thanks to 29 saves from rookie netminder Kevin Regan. That ended a 12-game unbeaten streak in league play (eight games overall) for the Black Bears. Their last Hockey East loss was Nov. 12 at Northeastern.

UMass was happy to end two streaks of its own when it recorded a 3-1 win at Merrimack Saturday, marking its first victory since December. That also stopped a surprising 14-game winless streak (0-13-1) on the road for the Minutemen, which had been building since taking a 1-0 decision at Maine over a year ago.

One streak that rolled on was BC's undefeated streak, now at 14 games, its best in the Jerry York era. The Eagles got two goals from defenseman Andrew Alberts Friday at Providence to turn a 2-0 deficit into a 2-2 tie. It was the third tie this season for BC vs. Providence – the Friars are one of only two Hockey East teams that have not lost to BC this season.

Boston University is not one of those, having been swept in a home-and-home set by BC just a few weeks ago, and will be looking to balance the scales and end the Eagles' flight tonight in the Beanpot. The Terriers are coming off an important 4-4 tie vs. UMass Lowell that kept the River Hawks at arm's length as the playoff race heats up. David Van der Gulik notched his first career hat trick to lead BU in the game. The River Hawks made up some ground on the field on Saturday, however, defeating Providence 3-2 on a Bobby Robins goal just 1:23 into overtime.

Northeastern was able to pick up two points headed into tonight's Beanpot faceoff against Harvard, as the Huskies dropped UMass 2-1 on Thursday.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Andrew Alberts' two-goal game at Providence was the second multiple-goal game of his career.

Boston University: John Laliberte scored a power play goal for the Terriers against UMass Lowell, ending an 0-for-17 stretch for the BU power play. They are 3-for-46 over the past seven games ... Stephan Siwiec drew the start against the River Hawks, marking the first time in his collegiate career that he started two straight games.

University of Maine: The Black Bears were able to end UNH's12-0-0 start at home this season with a 3-1 win Friday, but saw their own eight-game unbeaten streak (and 12-game unbeaten streak in conference play) come to an end in a 2-1 loss on Saturday ... In the last nine games, the Maine power play has come to life, converting on nine of 43 chances. The penalty kill has also improved, allowing only four goals in 43 attempts, including one of seven at UNH, who has the nation's best power play percentage.

University of Massachusetts: UMass snapped a couple of extended slumps with Saturday's 3-1 win at Merrimack, breaking a 14-game road winless streak (dating back to a 1-0 win at Maine on Jan. 17, 2004) and a seven-game overall winless streak (dating back to Dec. 30). The line of Matt Burto, P.J. Fenton and Craig MacDonald accounted for two goals and four assists in the victory ... Tim Vitek's goal Saturday was his first since Nov. 14 vs. Mercyhurst ... Six UMass players have met or exceeded their individual season highs in 2004-05.

UMass Lowell: Saturday's 3-2 OT win against Providence was the 150th victory of head coach Blaise MacDonald's career ... Junior Danny O'Brien reached career bests in goals (9) and points (23) with a goal at BU Friday.

Merrimack College: Merrimack held a 27-25 shot advantage in its 3-1 loss to UMass on Saturday, marking just the second time this season the Warriors have outshot their opponent in a league game ... Matt Johnson has a modest hot streak going, with five goals and three assists in the last nine games ... Merrimack is 8-2-1 when scoring four or more goals this season but 0-18-2 when scoring three or less.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's penalty kill has killed 13 straight over the past four games ... Head coach Richard Umile now has 345 wins, two short of Charlie Holt's all-time school wins record ... Freshman goalie Kevin Regan is 3-0-0 in his last three starts with a 2.00 GAA and .935 save percentage, which includes wins against nationally ranked Lowell and Maine.

Northeastern University: Jason Guerriero has assisted on 10 of Mike Morris' 13 goals this season while Morris has assisted on seven of Guerriero's 12 goals ... NU is averaging 13.5 penalty minutes per game this season, the least in the nation ... Keni Gibson has allowed two goals or less 15 times this season, and has allowed just four goals over NU's past three games.

Providence College: Jamie Carroll extended his point streak to five games with one goal in each game this past weekend ... David Cacciola has faced 98 shots in two games against BC this season and has stopped 95 of them ... The Friars have lost seven games by just one goal ... Providence is still looking for its first road win this season as they have gone 0-11-1.

WHO'S HOT

• Patrick Eaves, BC (Jr. F; Faribault, MN) – Following a modest start to his junior season, Eaves has caught fire with a league-best nine-game point streak, notching seven goals and 10 assists in that span.

• Mike Morris, NU (Jr. F; Braintree, MA) – Has scored seven goals over the past seven games.

• Boston College Defense and Goaltending – The Eagles are on an 14-game undefeated streak thanks to stingy defense and goaltending, which has allowed just 18 goals in that span (1.29 per game). They have allowed more than two goals in just one game during the streak.

• UMass Lowell at home – The River Hawks have won nine straight home games dating back to an 8-0 win against Bentley on Nov. 27. In that span, they have dominated their opponents with a 42-13 scoring advantage and have allowed more than two goals only once.
