LOWELL THREATENING FOR HOME ICE WITH SWEEP OF BC BU's Curry wins three straight on return, including Beanpot final

Things are nearly set at the bottom of the Hockey East bracket, thanks to a 3-2 win by Providence over Maine on Friday. The win locked up the final playoff spot for the Friars ahead of Merrimack, who will miss the playoffs for the first time since the 1995-96 season. Providence and Massachusetts will now play out the season to determine the No. 7 and No. 8 seeds in the Hockey East tournament. Maine rebounded from the loss to collect a 6-2 win in the rematch courtesy of three power play goals.

Despite a victory over Harvard in the Beanpot consolation game, Boston College fell two places in the Hockey East standings after suffering a dramatic sweep at the hands of UMass Lowell. The River Hawks got back-to-back strong performances from goaltenders John Yaros (32 saves in a 3-1 win at BC) and Peter Vetri (39 saves in a 4-1 win back at Lowell) to lead them to victory, closing to within three points of Maine for fourth place and with it a home ice berth in the Hockey East quarterfinals. The two teams face-off twice next weekend at Alfond Arena, so both control their own destinies and could easily end up facing each other again in the first round of the playoffs.

UNH navigated into first place thanks to the hot hand of rookie goaltender Kevin Regan, who allowed just three goals over two road wins. The explosive UNH offense did the rest, posting 11 goals over the two games, led by Jacob Micflikier's two goals and four assists on the week.

Boston University took over second place by sweeping Massachusetts on the heels of a 3-2 OT win in the Beanpot championship game vs. Northeastern. Rookie Chris Bourque scored the Beanpot winner and added two goals and an assist in Friday's 3-0 win at UMass. John Curry totalled 29 saves for his first career shutout and allowed just three goals over three wins on the week.

- Daniel Winnik, UNH (So. F: Mississauga, ON) Scored two goals and added two assists and a +5 rating over two road victories.



TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Defenseman Andrew Alberts and goaltender Cory Schneider are both injured and will be out of the lineup for three to five weeks. Their absence definitely affected the previously top-ranked Eagles, who suffered their first home loss of the season and first back-to-back losses of the season this past weekend vs. UMass Lowell.

Boston University: The Terriers have killed off 19 straight opposing power play chances ... Rookie Chris Bourque has nine goals this season, but none have come at BU's home rink ... The Terriers have reached the 20-win mark for the 21st time in Jack Parker's 32-year tenure.

University of Maine: After converting only two of 22 power play chances in the previous five games, Maine scored three power play goals on six opportunities in Saturday's win at Providence ... The Black Bears enter the final regular season home series this coming weekend with a 9-4-3 record at Alfond this year, following a 17-1-1 home record last year.

University of Massachusetts: Hockey Humanitarian finalist Peter Trovato has set a new team record for games played. He has skated in 140 games in a Minuteman jersey ... UMass gets a break from Hockey East action this coming weekend with a single game at Niagara on Saturday.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks outscored the BC Eagles 7-2 in a weekend sweep, breaking a seven-game winning streak for the Eagles in the series during which they had outscored UML 33-11 ... Sophomore transfer Jeremy Hall has a six-game point streak, his longest since joining the River Hawks ... The UML penalty kill has not given up a goal in the last three games, going 10-for-10, including killing a five-minute major at BC on Friday.

Merrimack College: The Warriors will miss the Hockey East playoffs for the first time in nine years ... Defenseman Bryan Schmidt has reached the 30-point mark (13-18-31) for the first time in his career ... The Warriors have struggled offensively since the calendar turned to 2005, scoring just 17 goals in 11 games, including just one goal in seven of those.

University of New Hampshire: The UNH penalty kill is 27for-29 over the last eight games with two short-handed goals ... UNH head coach Dick Umile won his 348th game Wednesday night at Merrimack to pass Charlie Holt as the all-time UNH leader ... 28 of Jacob Micflikier's 37 points have come in league play.

Northeastern University: Northeastern was penalized 10 times for 20 minutes on Saturday, but is still the least penalized team in the nation with an average of 13.4 penalty minutes per game ... Tim Judy's short-handed goal Friday was Northeastern's fourth of the season, the most in a single season in the Bruce Crowder era.

Providence College: The line of Jamie Carroll, Chris Chaput and Torry Gajda led the 3-2 win over Maine Friday, connecting for two goals and three assists. They have combined to score eight of the team's 13 goals over the last seven games ... The win over Maine ended PC's 16-game (0-12-4) Hockey East winless streak dating back to Oct. 29.
