# RECORD CROWD WATCHES BC WIN RECORD TITLE Eaves-less Eagles win with Boyle, Schneider and hungry seniors

BC's 10-man senior class has seen plenty of success in its four years – three 20-win seasons, three regular season titles, a Beanpot title, three trips to the NCAA tournament and one trip to the NCAA Frozen Four. This past weekend, they added another feather to their collective cap by defeating UNH 3-1 on Saturday to clinch their first Hockey East tournament championship.

It was the sixth Hockey East tourney title overall for the Eagle program, the most by any team. Amazingly, the Eagles did it without Player of the Year Patrick Eaves, who was sidelined due to injury. Instead, they relied on outstanding contributions from rookie goaltender Cory Schneider, who stopped 65 of 67 shots faced on the weekend, and sophomore forward Brian Boyle, who scored three of the Eagles' five goals en route to securing the tournament MVP honor.

BC faced its toughest task in outlasting Maine in Friday's first semifinal. Stretching to the 9:09 mark of the second overtime, it was the longest semifinal in Hockey East history. The only two goals in regulation were scored just 12 seconds apart midway through the second period. Schneider stopped 39 of 40 shots to set a semifinal record for rookie goaltenders, while 2004 tourney MVP Jimmy Howard stopped 36 of 38 at the other end, ultimately yielding to an overpowering slapshot by BC blueliner Andrew Alberts. In the other semifinal, UNH built a 4-0 second-period lead over BU with three power play goals and one short-hander. Preston Callander and Daniel Winnik had two goals each and both were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Crowds peaked both nights of the event. The semifinal night was a sellout (17,565) for the third straight season and the championship game sold out for the first time ever, bringing the two-night total to its maximum of 35,130.

With the win, Boston College was awarded the No. 1 overall seed in the upcoming NCAA Tournament., and will face Mercyhurst in the East Regional at Worcester on Friday. BU is the No. 3 seed in Worcester, UNH is the No. 2 seed in Amherst and Maine is the No. 4 in Minneapolis.

## **TEAM NOTES**

Boston College: The Eagles' special teams were outstanding in the tournament, converting on six of 15 power plays (40 percent) and killing off 18 of 19 opposing chances (94.7 percent) ... Andrew Alberts became just the third defenseman to score an overtime goal in Hockey East tournament history, and the first to do it in a semifinal contest.

Boston University: The Terriers will be making their 28th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, tying them with Michigan for the second-most appearances ever. Minnesota leads the way with 29 appearances ... Jack Parker will be making his 20th appearance in the Tournament, the second most of any coach. Former Michigan State and Bowling Green coach Ron Mason holds the record with 22 appearances. Parker holds the record for most NCAA Tournament victories with 24 to date.

University of Maine: Jimmy Howard stopped 36 of 38 shots in the semifinal game against Boston College, including nine in the first overtime period ... Maine has advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the seventh straight season, the longest streak in Hockey East and the second longest streak in the nation, trailing only Michigan's 15 straight ... The Black Bears are 4-8 this season in one-goal games after going 15-5 in one-goal games last season.

New Hampshire: UNH's 2005 senior class is only the second class in school history to make NCAA appearances in all four seasons at UNH ... UNH has only met Harvard once in the history of the NCAA Tournament, a 7-1 UNH loss on March 26, 1994 ...The Wildcats are the only team in the nation to have four 40-point scorers on the roster ... Senior forward Preston Callander finished the Hockey East tournament as the leading scorer with eight points on five goals and three assists. He has a nine-game point streak with seven goals and eight assists in that span. Linemate Sean Collins has also posted at least one point in each of his last nine contests with a 4-11-15 line during that stretch.

#### **Tournament Notes / Records:**

- The semifinal night was a sellout (17,565) for the third straight year. The championship game was a sellout for the first time ever, maxing the two-night total at 35,130.
- BU's John Curry ended his tournament-record consecutive scoreless minutes streak at 182:23. Maine's Jimmy Howard held the old mark of 164:13.
- BC's Cory Schneider set a new mark for saves by a rookie in a semifinal game (39) just one week after PC's Tyler Sims established a new overall tourney mark for rookies with 51 saves in a 4-1 win at Boston University.
- Friday's BC-Maine game was the longest semifinal in Hockey East history at 89:09, surpassing the 85:00 mark set in a 2003 BC-BU tilt.
- UNH's Preston Callander notched just the sixth shorthanded goal in semifinal history, and the first since UNH's Chad Onufrechuk and PC's Mike Omicioli did it in the same game in 1999.
