NORTHEASTERN TAKES OUT NO. 1 MICHIGAN Collins, Hemingway selected as Co-MVPs of the Ice Breaker Tournament

They weren't even a blip in the polls headed into Friday's match vs. top-ranked Michigan, but the Northeastern Huskies used that as motivation to record a 4-2 win over the Wolverines in the opening game of the Lefty McFadden Invitational on Friday. Co-captain Jason Guerriero recorded a goal and two assists while fellow senior Keni Gibson kept the MIchigan attack at bay with 31 saves.

Gibson and Guerriero weren't the only prime-time performers around Hockey East this weekend. UMass sophomore Matt Anderson earned honors as CCM Player of the Week with his first career hat trick to go with two assists in Saturday's 6-4 win over Clarkson. Linemate Stephen Werner had a goal and three assists in the game. Providence also dealt Clarkson a loss, getting three points from sophomore Chase Watson. Elias Godoy had a goal and two assists for UMass Lowell at Niagara Saturday, setting up Cleve Kinley for an overtime game-winner in the 3-2 triumph.

At the Ice Breaker Tournament at UNH, the host Wildcats got four points from Sean Collins and three goals from Brett Hemingway on the weekend to win the title. The teammates were selected as

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Ryan Shannon opened the scoring in Saturday's 7-2 exhibition win with a short-handed goal at 6:49 of the first period. He added an assist later in the period to stake BC to a 4-0 lead. Each of BC's three goaltenders played one period in the game.

Boston University: The youth of this year's Terrier hockey team was manifested this weekend when Parker fielded a lineup that included six freshman and only three seniors. The play of the Terrier freshmen was a highlight despite a 7-2 loss to Michigan as center Peter MacArthur scored the Terriers' two goals, while first-year left wing Chris Bourque had an assist. Sophomore goaltender John Curry was a perfect 12-for-12 over 31 minutes played in a relief appearance vs. Michigan.

University of Maine: The loss in overtime on Friday night (4-3 to North Dakota) was the Black Bears' first OT loss since the 2002 NCAA title game vs. Minnesota (also a 4-3 final). Derek Damon scored two of Maine's three goals in Friday's loss.

University of Massachusetts: Matt Anderson's hat trick was the first for a UMass player since Thomas Pöck netted three goals vs. Providence on Jan. 5, 2003 ... Freshman P.J. Fenton picked up an assist on the game-winning goal against Clarkson for his first collegiate point

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks had four two-man advantages in the Niagara game, converting on two ... Saturday's game was the first ever between the River Hawks and the Purple Eagles that was decided in overtime.

Merrimack College: Merrimack picked up its 100th tournament win over the weekend. The Warriors are now 100-54-4 all-time in various tournaments in the history of the program ... Brent Gough continued his success against Nebraska-Omaha with a pair of assists on Sunday night. In three career games played against the Mavericks, the junior forward has a goal and four assists.

University of New Hampshire: UNH scored six of their nine goals over the weekend on the power play. UNH scored on six of 20 opportunities for a 30 percent conversion rate

... The Wildcats won the Ice Breaker for the second time in the eight year history of the tournament and are only the second host team in the history of the tournament to win the Ice Breaker title. UNH and BC are the only repeat winners of the Ice Breaker title.

Northeastern University: The Huskies started off the season with a win for the first time since the 2000-01 season by defeating top-ranked Michigan 4-2. NU is 44-24-5 all-time in season openers, including a 5-2-2 record since Bruce Crowder became head coach. NU is now an impressive 6-4-4 against top-ranked teams during the Crowder era ... Jason Guerriero notched his 100th career point when he assisted on Ray Ortiz's goal in the second period of NU's victory over Michigan.

Providence College: Rookie Trevor Ludwig got his career started off strong, assisting on two of four PC goals in Friday's 4-2 win over Clarkson. Three sophomores accounted for all four Friar goals in the game ... PC improved to 34-19-1 all-time is season openers and has won the last three in a row.
