22ND SEASON SET TO BEGIN Maine, UMass Lowell first to see regular season action

Eight of Hockey East's 10 teams will get a warm-up this weekend, hosting one exhibition match each. The two others, however, will jump right into regular season play, and neither will slide in easily.

Maine will play in the annual IceBreaker Invitational, opening against Air Force on Friday. After that, the Black Bears, ranked 11th in the preseason polls, will take on tourney host Colorado College, ranked 6th, in what should be the first headline battle of many this coming season.

UMass Lowell also has its work cut out, opening its season at Colgate. The Red Raiders are ranked 18th in USCHO's preseason poll while the River Hawks stand at No. 16. Victorious or defeated, the River Hawks return to Lowell for a Sunday game against Rensselaer.

It's Game On again for the NHL, which opened its 2005-06 season last night. Over 40 former Hockey East players were on opening night rosters, including 2005 Boston College grad Andrew Alberts, who made his NHL debut in a 2-1 Bruins' loss vs. Montreal. Also making his first NHL appearance was Merrimack's Matthew Foy, who set up the gamewinning goal in Minnesota's 6-3 win vs. Calgary. Former BC sniper Brian Gionta stole headlines with two goals and one assist in leading New Jersey to a 5-1 win vs. Pittsburgh.
