SIMS SHUTS OUT LOWELL IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES Vermont dominates Duluth to run record to 4-0

Tim Army could not have scripted a sweeter return to Hockey East. In his first league action as bench boss, the former PC captain coached his alma mater to back-to-back shutouts vs. Lowell. Granted, sophomore Tyler Sims did most of the work in gaining the distinction, stopping all 43 shots he faced over the two-game set to earn CCM RBK Player of the Week honors.

In the only other league game of the weekend, Northeastern's Adam Geragosian and BC's Cory Schneider traded save-for-save in what ended as a 1-1 tie.

Vermont ran its record to a perfect 4-0 with two more wins vs. the WCHA, both coming 5-1 against visiting Minnesota Duluth. Freshman Peter Lenes wasn't satisfied with scoring his first collegiate goal Friday night, so he added two more scores to register the hat trick and added another goal in Saturday's rematch. Teammates Brady Leisenring and Torrey Mitchell each had five points over the two games. Maine also continued a hot streak, picking up back-to-back wins

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: In 11 career Hockey East games, sophomore goalie Cory Schneider is 6-0-5 with a 1.81 GAA. In four career outings against Northeastern, he is 3-0-1 with a 1.25 goals against average. The Eagles are unbeaten in their last five games against NU ... BC is now 7-3-2 in conference openers under head coach Jerry York.

Boston University: The Terrier penalty-killing unit has allowed just five shots on net in 19 shorthanded minutes ... John Laliberte now has six career points vs. RPI, but his goal on Friday was his first against the Engineers ... Ten different BU players have figured in the five goals scored thus far this season.

University of Maine: The Maine penalty kill has allowed only one power play goal in 35 opportunities this season, a 97.1 success rate ... After allowing the opponent to score first in the first four games of the season, Maine scored the first goal in both Alabama-Huntsville games ... Maine has opponents 13-3 in the third period this season.

University of Massachusetts: Stephen Werner is riding a three-game scoring streak, having put up points in each of the first three games this season. He has been on the ice for all but two of UMass' seven goals so far this year ... Jamie Solon's goal on Friday was his first since Nov. 5, 2004, breaking a 29game drought.

UMass Lowell: The scoreless weekend for the River Hawks marked just the second time in the program's history that UML was shut out in back-to-back games. The active streak of 170:01 minutes without a goal is the longest such streak in the program's history ... Freshmen forwards Mark Roebothan and Mike Potacco made their collegiate debuts Oct. 21 at Providence - it was the first appearance for any UML freshman this year in a veteran-laden lineup.

Merrimack College: The Warriors improved to 19-0-0 all-time vs. UConn with its win Friday night, but the Huskies struck back with their first ever win vs. Merrimack on Saturday ... Merrimack outshot UConn in both games this weekend, marking the first time since January of 2004 that they have outshot their opponent in two consecutive games ... Merrimack has been two men short for a total of 6:26 so far this year, but has not allowed a goal in that situation.

University of New Hampshire: Brett Hemingway has recorded a point in every game this season and has posted a goal in three of four games ... A loss and a tie to open the home schedule marks the first time in the 11-year history of the Whittemore Center that the Wildcats haven't picked up at least one win in its first two home games of the year.

Northeastern University: NU's attendance of 5,402 at Matthews Arena on Saturday was its first crowd in excess of 5,000 since Nov. 1995, when the Huskies drew 5,750 in a 6-4 loss to BU ... Adam Geragosian has allowed just seven goals over his last five appearances, boasting a 1.97 GAA and a .944 save percentage in those.

Providence College: Dating back to last season, the Friars have won five consecutive Hockey East contests, three coming vs. Lowell ... The two shutouts posted this weekend were the first back-to-back for the Friars since 1976. They have not allowed a goal in a span of 129:36 ... Torry Gajda has had at least one point in each of the first four games ... The Friars have killed off 19 consecutive penalties.

University of Vermont: This is just the third time in the 43year history of hockey at Vermont that the Catamounts have begun a season with four straight victories ... UVM is now 6-0-2 in its last eight games against WCHA opponents ... Torrey Mitchell's had four assists Saturday. The last Catamount to do that was Kevin Karlander on Nov. 13, 1999, against Princeton.
