SIX STRAIGHT FOR MAINE AND VERMONT Hat tricks lead Merrimack, UMass Lowell to victories

At 6-0 to open the season, the UVM Catamounts are off to their best start ever and are more than holding their own as representatives of Hockey East. Vermont added two more wins this weekend with a sweep at Niagara as linemates Brady Leisenring and Torrey Mitchell extended their shared point streaks to six games. UVM faces its first league contest Tuesday at NU.

Maine's Keenan Hopson has also registered at least one point in six straight, helping Maine to a 6-0 run following a modest 1-1 start. The latest wins were big ones, 2-1 at Boston College and 4-0 at Maine, as goaltending was the decisive factor once again. Rookie Ben Bishop was 30 of 31 at BC, and Matt Lundin notched his second straight shutout with 31 saves at UMass. Derek Damon had one goal and one assist in each game and was selected ITECH First Star in both.

Lowell's Mark Pandolfo notched the first hat trick in league play this season with three goals in a 7-4 win over BU Friday. Matt Johnson scored three on the power play for Merrimack at RPI Saturday to deliver a 5-3 win as well as CCM / RBK Hockey Player of the Week honors.

Chase Watson had a goal and three assists to help extend Providence's league winning streak to six games Friday vs. Merrimack, but BC stopped the Friars Saturday, 3-2. BC's Chris Collins scored three of the Eagles' four goals on the weekend. Elsewhere, UNH notched a victory in its first league game of the season, 4-1 at UMass. Senior goaltender Jeff Pietrasiak stopped 36 of 37 shots faced.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: A 3-2 win over Providence snapped a streak of three consecutive ties between the two teams. BC improved its record to 5-0-3 in its last eight games against the Friars ... Brock Bradford scored his first collegiate goal Saturday vs. Providence, and it stood as the game-winner.

Boston University: BU has not been outshot all season and holds a 101-66 edge over its opponents so far ... UMass Lowell gained revenge for BU's five second-period goals in a 7-2 win at Tsongas Arena last year, scoring five goals in a 19:28 span in Friday's game.

University of Maine: Maine picked up two road wins on the same weekend for the first time since Oct. 24-25, 2003, two wins at St. Lawrence. The last time Maine picked up two Hockey East road wins on the same weekend was Nov. 15-16, 2002, at Northeastern and BU ... Maine is outscoring the opposition 27-9, including 14-3 in the third period.

University of Massachusetts: The 4-0 shutout suffered Saturday snapped a four-game point streak for senior captain Stephen Werner ... Despite allowing two power play goals over the weekend, UMass' penalty-killing unit is still ranked in the top 10 nationally, clicking at 89.7%.

UMass Lowell: UML's power play stumbled to a 1-for-29 to start this season, but broke out with a 4-for-12 in two games this weekend ... UML's seven goal outburst against BU Friday night nearly doubled its total for the season and marked the most goals the River Hawks have scored against the Terriers since an 8-6 win on Jan. 26, 1996.

Merrimack College: Merrimack came back from a third period deficit for the second time this season to beat RPI, 5-3. The Warriors have outscored the opposition 8-2 in the third period this season ... Matt Johnson's hat trick was the first by Merrimack since Feb. 15, 2003 (Marco Rosa vs. BC) ... Senior Bryan Schmidt has cracked the Top 10 among Merrimack's all-time top scoring defensemen and is just three goals shy of the Merrimack record for goals by a blueliner.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's power play has scored at least one goal on the man advantage in all five games this season. Eight of UNH's 16 goals on the season have come by way of the power play ... Brett Hemingway has accounted for 31% of UNH's goal scoring output this year (5 of 16 goals).

Northeastern University: Freshmen accounted for three goals and five assists in NU's game at RPI on Friday. Matti Uusivirta and Joe Vitale each scored his first career goal ... Northeastern's five goals at RPI on Friday night were three more than NU scored in its first three games.

Providence College: The Friars began the Hockey East schedule with a 3-0 mark for the first time since the 1998-99 season. BC's victory over the Friars Saturday ended a six-game winning streak for Providence in league play, dating back to last season ... Of the 14 goals allowed by the Friars this season, nine have come on the power play ... Freshman forward Kyle Laughlin netted his first career goal Saturday at BC.

University of Vermont: Vermont is 6-0 for the first time in its 43-year history. Its previous best start was 4-0 ... The Catamounts are unbeaten in their last 11 regular season games dating back to Feb. 12, 2005 ... Vermont ranks third in the country in defense (1.50 GAPG).

WHO'S HOT

• **Chris Collins, BC** (Sr. F; Fairport, NY) – Has scored six goals in five games, including two short-handers.

• **Brett Hemingway, UNH** (So. F; Surrey, BC) – Has at least one point in each of five games this year and at least one goal in four of those.

• **Maine Black Bears** – The Black Bears boast six forwards who are averaging one point per game or better. In goal, Ben Bishop and Matt Lundin have combined for a 7-1 record, a 1.12 GAA and a .954 save percentage.

• **Vermont's Brady Leisenring and Torrey Mitchell** – Linemates have each started the season with a six-game point streak, each averaging nearly two points per game.

• **Penalty-killing at Maine and Vermont** – Hockey East's two northern programs have combined to kill off 81 of 83 penalties, boasting the two best ratios in the nation.
