VERMONT HOSTS FIRST HOCKEY EAST ACTION UNH draws challenging weekend against BU and Maine

A feeling that has been building for over 18 months will reach its crescendo Friday, when fans at the University of Vermont take in their first-ever Hockey East game at Gutterson Fieldhouse.

The Catamounts split their first two Hockey East games last week, both on the road, and will host Providence tomorrow night in their home Hockey East debut. It could be an instant classic, as the Friars bring in an impressive league record of 5-1, marking their best start ever. They have won eight of their last nine Hockey East games dating back to last season. Vermont started its season at 7-0 overall, a program best, before suffering a 4-2 loss at BU last Friday.

The Catamounts will have a day off Saturday but are back on home ice Sunday af-

ternoon for a visit from defending Hockey East champ and preseason favorite Boston College. BC's modest 3-2-1 start could be deceiving, considering they have one of the league's best goaltenders (sophomore Cory Schneider) as well as its most talented freshman class. One look at the polls (below right) suggests the teams are evenly matched. Another game that promises to be a memorable one, it will be the first-ever Hockey East contest televised by ESPNU.

Television coverage will be extensive for a nine-day span starting on Friday. Over the next week and a half, five different carriers will televise eight different games involving nine of Hockey East's 10 teams.

Both headline matchups involving teams tied for second place will be televised this weekend. On Friday, NESN will air UNH at BU. The Wildcats have already seen BU's new Agganis Arena once, skating away with a 4-4 tie late last season. On Saturday, UNH will be on again, this time on their home network of NHPTV as the Wildcats host Maine. Boston University will also be on TV twice this weekend, as Comcast CN8 will televise Saturday's game at UMass.

The Minutemen first have a date at Northeastern, however, and both teams are seeking their first Hockey East win of the season. The Huskies were decimated by graduations last year (losing their top forward, defenseman and goaltender) and will be without their top returning sniper Mike Morris for most of the season due to injury. UMass has welcomed scoring forward Matt Anderson back to the mix after a year off, but it hasn't paid off as the offense has been held to under two goals per game so far.

In the only other game of the weekend, Maine will visit UMass Lowell. The River Hawks, although somewhat enigmatic early this season, have already split with BU. Maine has been dominating, suffering just two one-goal losses offset by eight wins.

The Providence College Friars got some more good news on the alumni front as Jay Leach ('01) made his NHL debut last Saturday with the Boston Bruins. Former PC teammate Nolan Schaefer ('03) has been turning heads since his NHL debut on Oct. 26, posting a 5-1 record and a 1.94 GAA for the San Jose Sharks.
