TWO BIG WINS LIFT UNH INTO A TIE FOR FIRST PLACE Northeastern and Massachusetts each post first Hockey East win

Since a narrow 3-2 loss to preseason favorite Boston College on Nov. 1, the UNH Wildcats have rung up four straight Hockey East victories, laying their claim as the hottest team in Hockey East. Friday night's 3-2 win at BU trumped the Terriers, who last week halted extended winning streaks by both Maine and Vermont. Saturday night, the 'Cats returned home and outpaced fourth-ranked Maine, 4-2, to complete a sweep of weekend action. Player of the Week Jacob Micflikier had one goal and one assist in each game and linemate Brett Hemingway also contributed four points over the two games. Senior Jeff Pietrasiak (32 saves at BU) and sophomore Kevin Regan (31 saves vs. Maine) each picked up one win. Maine had to settle for the split after dominating at UMass Lowell Friday night, 9-2. Defensemen Bret Tyler led the way with a goal and three assists.

Northeastern and UMass each registered its first league win of the season, with the Huskies toppling the Minutemen head-to-head on Friday. Goaltender Adam Geragosian picked up his first career win in impressive fashion, notching a 26-save 2-0 shutout. NU sophomore Jimmy Russo picked up both goals in the win, each coming in the closing seconds of a period. UMass rookie goaltender Jon Quick stopped all but one of 30 shots faced in the loss, and continued his strong play with 39 saves in Saturday's 4-2 home victory vs. BU. Senior teammate Stephen Werner handled the offensive duties, scoring two goals and setting up one other.

Vermont hosted its first two home Hockey East contests this weekend, splitting the set. Senior forward Jeff Corey was outstanding in Friday's 6-2 win vs. Providence, putting up two goals and two assists, as fellow senior Brady Leisenring added two goals of his own and one assist to extend his point streak to nine straight games and reach the 100-point plateau for his career. Leisinring's streak was stopped Sunday in a 2-1 loss to BC, but Corey scored the only UVM goal to complete a big weekend. The Eagles were led by rookie Nathan Gerbe, who scored both BC goals.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC has won five straight against Vermont and is now 5-1-1 against the Catamounts under head coach Jerry York ... BC's penalty kill stopped all five Vermont power plays and improved to 16-for-16 in penalty-kill situations over the last three games, all victories.

Boston University: John Curry has made 108 saves over his last three games after needing to make just 68 in his first four games of the season. He entered the BU career goaltending record books with his 40th game on Nov. 11 and is now BU's best ever in both career save percentage (.921) and GAA (2.07) ... John Laliberte has at least one point in all six games he has played this season while Brad Zancanaro has a modest four-game point streak going.

University of Maine: Maine had 14 different players score a point on the weekend ... The last time Maine scored nine goals in a game was on March 1, 2002 at Boston University, a 9-6 win for the Black Bears ... In twelve games this season, Maine has been outshot only twice ... Despite giving up two power play goals on Saturday night to UNH, Maine's penalty kill is still best in the nation at 93.9% ... 73 games into his collegiate career, senior defenseman Travis Wight potted his first goal, Friday night at UMass Lowell.

University of Massachusetts: Chris Capraro's man-advantage goal Saturday ended an 0-for-15 power play slump for the Minutemen. Scott Crowder collected his first collegiate goal in the game, and it stood as the gamewinner ... UMass' win over Boston University was only its fifth in the all-time history of Massachusetts Hockey, three of which have come under current head coach Don Cahoon, a BU alum.

UMass Lowell: Matt Walsh has two goals and one assist in his last four games after putting up just two assists in 20 games last year. His father, Ed, was an All-American goaltender for BU in the 1970s ... Mike Potacco scored his first collegitate goal in UML's 9-2 loss to Maine Friday.

Merrimack College: The Warriors did not play last week. They return to action Friday, hosting Vermont.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's power play has scored at least one goal in the last four games, including a 5 for 12 weekend vs. BU and Maine (41.7%) ... 16 of UNH's 34 goals have been scored in the second period this season ... Daniel Winnik has scored 11 of his 15 points in six league contests, as the conference's leading scorer ... UNH has won five of its last six games after starting the season 1-2-1.

Northeastern University: Northeastern held Massachusetts to 0-for-10 on power plays on Friday. It was the first time this season an NU opponent failed to score a power play goal ... Goaltender Adam Geragosian has his best numbers against Massachusetts with a 1-1 record, a .970 save-percentage and a 1.01 GAA ... Freshmen and sophomores have scored 14 of Northeastern's 16 goals this season.

Providence College: The Friar defensemen have combined to score six goals in nine games this season. Last season, the PC blueliners combined for seven goals in 37 games.

University of Vermont: Brady Leisenring finished off a ninegame point streak and became the 39th Catamount to register 100 career points with a goal in Friday's win ... Vermont has scored 17 of its 36 goals this season on the power play ... The Catamounts have outshot their opponents in all 10 games this season.

- Torry Gajda, PC (Sr. F; Westfield, MA) Has recorded at least one point in eight of the first nine games. He already has 11 points this season, nearly equalling his 2004-05 season total of 13.
- **Jimmy Russo, NU** (So. F; South Weymouth, MA) In the past five games, has five assists and two two-goal games.
- Cory Schneider, BC (So. G; Marblehead, MA) In his last three games, he is 3-0 with a 1.67 GAA and a .935 save percentage.
- **UNH's top line** Brett Hemingway, Jacob Micflikier and Daniel Winnik combined for 11 points in two games this past weekend and account for 42.1% of UNH's total offense this season.
