RIVER HAWKS REBOUND TO END UNH WIN STREAK Providence remains in first place with win at NU, tie vs. BU

After being victimized by a quirky bounce in the waning minutes of a 3-2 loss at UNH Friday, the UMass Lowell rebounded to score a 6-3 win in the rematch at home, ending the Wildcats' fivegame win streak. Bobby Robins led UML with two goals and an assist in the win, while Jeremy Hall had four assists. UNH defenseman Brian Yandle had an assist in the first game and a goal in the second, extending his point streak to eight straight games, all in league play.

Lowell was picked by many to be the dark horse team of the year, but that title may be more fitting for Providence. The Friars have six league wins already, tying their total from last season, and are entrenched in first place, just ahead of UNH. They got two more solid performances from goaltender Tyler Sims this week (58 saves on 61 shots faced) and picked up a win and a tie. Their OT win at Northeastern Tuesday was their first victory over NU since 2002.

Boston College got big contributions from forwards Brian Boyle and Chris Collins in each of two

and Chris Collins in each of two games on the week. Both had two helpers in a 5-3 loss to Harvard Tuesday and led a rebound win against Northeastern on Saturday by the same score. Collins had two goals and one assist in the victory while Boyle had two powerplay markers.

An evenly played game through two periods was dominated by Vermont in the third period Friday, as the Catamounts outshot host Merrimack 15-1, scoring three times and cruising to a 3-0 win.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC extended its unbeaten streak against Northeastern to six games (5-0-1) and improved to 12-1-1 in the last 14 meetings.

Boston University: The tie vs. Providence marked the first time this season that BU did not lose a game in which it trailed after two periods. It was also the first time in five games that BU has held an opponent scoreless on the power play ... BU is undefeated this season (2-0-1) when facing a team ranked higher in the Hockey East standings.

University of Maine: Maine got goals from seven different players in its 7-2 exhibition game win vs. the U.S. Under-18 Team Saturday. The power play was 3-for-5 on the night. Sophomore Ryan Shelley saw his first-ever action in a Black Bear uniform, stopping three shots late in the third period.

University of Massachusetts: The Minutemen did not play last week. They return to action Tuesday at Vermont.

UMass Lowell: UMass Lowell is unbeaten in its last home five games vs. UNH, going 2-0-3 in that span ... The River Hawk defense held Hockey East leading scorer Daniel Winnik to just one point on the weekend, an assist in Saturday's game. Friday night's game was just the second all season that Winnik failed to register a point ... Mike Potacco and Matt Walsh each had three-game point streaks snapped Saturday night ... UMass Lowell tallied a season-high three power-play goals in Saturday's 6-3 win.

Merrimack College: Vermont's 3-0 shutout win over the Warriors marked the first time Merrimack has been shut out since a 5-0 loss to Maine on Dec. 4, 2004. The loss halted freshman Rob Ricci's point streak at three games ... Matt Johnson is tied for fifth nationally with five power play goals.

University of New Hampshire: The Wildcat top line of Brett Hemingway, Jacob Micflikier and Daniel Winnik account for 44 of UNH's 111 points this season (39.6% of the team's offense) ... Five of the top six scorers in Hockey East play this season skate for UNH ... UMass Lowell snapped UNH's league-best five-game win streak Saturday ...UNH's power play has scored at least one goal in 10 of 12 games and has scored at least two goals in six of those.

Northeastern University: Forwards Yale Lewis and Joe Santilli, who both recently returned from injury, each scored their first goals of the season at Boston College on Saturday. NU went 3-for-8 on the power play, and now has a 20 percent efficiency rating in league play. BC's short-handed goal was the first allowed by NU this season.

Providence College: Tuesday's 2-1 win at Northeastern marked PC's first victory over NU since November 9, 2002. The Friars were 0-3-4 vs. the Huskies in the last seven meetings ... Providence has four road wins this season, surpassing last season's total of three ... Torry Gajda has recorded at least one point in nine of the 11 games this season. His goal against BU ended a PC scoreless stretch of 127:09 vs. the Terriers dating back to last season.

University of Vermont: Vermont outshot Merrimack 15-1 in the third period Friday. Shots were even at 13 each after two periods. The Catamounts have outshot their opponent in every game this season ... Vermont held Merrimack to 0-for-5 on the power play and held the Warriors scoreless during a five-minute advantage in the second period. Vermont ranks second in the country on the penalty kill, stopping 57 of 61 power play opportunities (93.4%).
