UMASS GETS TWO MORE WINS OVER RANKED OPPONENTS Back-up goaltenders star during wild weekend

The UMass Minutemen erased a five-game losing streak with some impressive performances over the last 10 days, picking up three straight wins vs. ranked opponents before dropping a 4-0 decision to Denver on Saturday night. That loss only slightly soured a 4-3 win vs. No. 3 Colorado College the night before as UMass got 42 saves from senior Gabe Winer. Freshman Jon Quick was the hero in Tuesday's 2-1 win at Vermont, stopping 29 of 30 shots faced.

Vermont's backup goaltender Travis Russell starred in drawing a rare start, making 29 saves in a 2-1 win at Maine Sunday, marking UVM's first win vs. the Black Bears in 20 years.

Boston University rebounded from an early rush by the Harvard Crimson on Tuesday to settle for a 2-2 tie, and almost pulled off a similar trick in a 6-5 OT loss to Colorado College on Saturday. Trailing 5-3, the Terriers scored two goals in the final two minutes of regulation to tie the game. In both comebacks, BU's John Laliberte set up the late goals that tied the game and totalled four

late goals that tied the game and totalled four assists on eight BU goals on the week. Sandwiched between those two games was a 1-0 shutout of Denver, in which Karson Gillespie made 31 saves in his first start in a year.

UNH recovered from a 3-1 deficit to tie Northeastern yesterday, thanks to two power play goals and one assist from Brett Hemingway. BC rookie blueliner Tim Filangieri also picked up a pair of goals, leading the Eagles to a 3-0 win vs. Merrimack. Cory Schneider made 16 saves for his second career shutout, first in league play.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Goalie Cory Schneider has limited opponents to two goals or fewer in six of seven league games played ... The Eagles are unbeaten in their last nine meetings against Merrimack (7-0-2) and in their last 15 home games against Merrimack (14-0-1).

Boston University: BU is 4-2-2 against ranked opponents with 21 goals for compared to 17 goals against ... John Curry has five 15+ save periods in his last six games and has made 30+ saves in four of those six.

University of Maine: Maine has played only two Sunday afternoon games this season, but both have yielded 2-1 home losses, yesterday vs. Vermont and Nov. 6 vs. BU. Yesterday's game pitted the nation's top two penalty-killing teams. Not surprisingly, neither team scored a power play goal as Maine was 0-for-5 and Vermont was 0-for-2.

University of Massachusetts: UMass' 4-3 win over No. 3 Colorado College on Friday marked its first-ever win over a WCHA opponent and its first-ever win vs. a ranked non-conference opponent. It also marked the first time UMass has won three consecutive games against ranked opponents ... Stephen Werner cracked the 100-point mark with two points vs. the Tigers on Friday. Werner was one of five players that each recorded two points in the victory.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks did not play last week. They return to action Saturday at St. Lawrence.

Merrimack College: The Warriors have suffered back-toback shutouts in league play and have not scored a goal in 139:27. They have scored just three goals in five Hockey East games so far, but have scored 14 goals in five nonleague games.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's unbeaten streak against Northeastern is now at 15 games (12-0-3), dating to Feb. 16, 2002 ... Daniel Winnik has notched 14 of his 18 points in league play ... The Wildcats have scored 20 of their 43 goals in the second period this season accounting for 46.5% of the offense ... UNH owns a 2-2-1 record vs. nationally ranked teams this season.

Northeastern University: NU tied New Hampshire at the Whittemore Center Sunday, breaking break an eight-game losing streak there and a 10-game overall losing streak UNH ... Northeastern has six goals over the last two games, all scored by different players ... NU has been outshot in eight of 11 games played so far this season.

Providence College: Torry Gajda has 14 points already this season, one more than all of last season ... The first-place Friars are 6-2-1 in Hockey East play, but 0-4 in non-conference contests this season ... Of PC's 36 goals this season, 18 have been scored in the third period ... The Friars will play seven of their next eight contests on home ice after playing 10 of their first 13 away from Schneider Arena.

University of Vermont: Sunday's win broke a six-game losing streak for the Catamounts in their all-time series vs. Maine. Their last win vs. Maine came nearly 20 years ago – Dec. 30, 1985 ... The Catamounts were outshot for the first time this season (30-17) Sunday at Maine. It was the most shots they have given up in a game this year ... Vermont's overall scoring defense (1.77 goals against per game) ranks fourth in the nation.
