MERRIMACK HALTS LOSING STREAK WITH WIN, TWO TIES

Providence sweeps to keep firm hold on first place

The Merrimack Warriors finally ended a record run of 20 straight Hockey East losses last Tuesday with a dramatic 1-0 shutout victory vs. UNH, courtesy of 31 saves from goaltender Jim Healey. In short order, they picked up two more points in Hockey East play with back-to-back ties vs. Northeastern, giving them a modest three-game undefeated streak. Mike Alexiou led the revitalized Warrior offense with five points on the week, while forward Jimmy Russo and defenseman Steve Birnstill countered for the Huskies, with two points in each game in the weekend set.

UNH rebounded from the shutout loss with a hard-fought 3-3 tie at Vermont followed by a 4-3 comeback win at St. Lawrence. Player of the Week Jacob Micflikier had a hand in all seven UNH goals over the two games, scoring two and setting up five others. UMass Lowell was not as fortunate on the same road trip, dropping both contests.

Providence made a statement with a 4-2 win over visiting Maine Friday that tightened the Friars' hold on first place. They also notched their first non-conference win of the season, 5-1 vs. Brown. Torry Gadja had three goals on the weekend and Tyler Sims totalled 50 saves.

Boston College and Boston University re-ignited their old-school rivalry, trading home wins. The Eagles outlasted the Terriers with a 2-1 win on Friday, but BU stormed back in Saturday's triumph with four goals in the third period. BU's John Curry was strong in net, stopping 57 of 61 shots over the two games.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC allowed four goals in the third period at BU Saturday after allowing no more than one in the third period over the first 11 games. They had outscored the opposition 13-5 in the third period prior to Saturday's loss ... Goaltender Cory Schneider and forward Nathan Gerbe have been selected to represent the U.S. at the World Junior Championships later this month.

Boston University: Saturday's 6-2 win vs. BC marked the Terriers' greatest goal output of the season as well as their largest margin of victory. Rookie John McCarthy scored his first career goal in the win ... The weekend split marked the first time in four years that the Terriers were not swept by the Eagles in a home-and-home series ... All five of BU's wins have come against ranked opponents.

University of Maine: The Black Bears have dropped three straight Hockey East games for the first time since February 14-21, 2003 ... The 41 shots posted by Providence Friday were the most allowed by Maine this season. Maine has only been outshot in three games this season ... Billy Ryan and John Hopson each contributed one goal and one assist in Maine's 4-2 loss at Providence.

University of Massachusetts: The Minutemen did not play last week. They return to action Tuesday vs. Merrimack.

UMass Lowell: Mark Roebothan and Elias Godoy each have modest three-game point streaks. Godoy has seven points in his last eight games ... The home team has won the last four games between the River Hawks and St. Lawrence ... Peter Vetri's 40 saves at St. Lawrence Friday was his career high. His previous high was 39 on Feb. 19, 2005, vs. Boston College.

Merrimack College: After scoring just eight power play goals through its first 11 games, Merrimack has four in its last two games ... Rob Ricci and Mike Alexiou each have moderate three-game point streaks ... Merrimack's 1-0 shutout over No. 10 New Hampshire Tuesday was its first shutout since January 17, 2004, a 3-0 win over UMass Lowell.

University of New Hampshire: Freshman defenseman Joe Charlebois posted his first collegiate goal and the game-winner Saturday at St. Lawrence. Charlebois was raised in nearby Potsdam, NY ... After this week's games vs. Harvard and UMass Lowell, UNH has a 19-day Christmas break.

Northeastern University: Rob Rassey's first career goal was a big one, completing a three-goal third period comeback at the 19:19 mark that gave NU a tie vs. Merrimack on Friday ... Northeastern has had three ties in a row and four overtime games in a row. Half of their 10 league games so far have gone into OT ... NU has had 13 goals scored by nine different players over its last four games.

Providence College: PC's win over Maine was its first over a ranked opponent this season. The victory over Brown was the first non-conference win of the season ... Providence is the only Hockey East team without a home loss this season (4-0-1) ... PC's four short-handed goals this season has surpassed last season's total of three ... Providence has seven Hockey East wins this season, one more than all of last year.

University of Vermont: Vermont is the least penalized team in the country with just 13.3 penalty minutes per game ... Vermont ranks fourth in the country in scoring defense (1.87 GAGP) and is tops among Hockey East teams in both league game offense (3.11 GPG) and overall offense (3.40).
