COLLINS, FERRIERO DOMINATE IN BC SWEEP Friars defeat BU but now share first place with Eagles

The Boston College Eagles sent a message to the rest of the league this weekend with back-to-back convincing wins vs. UMass: they're weren't chosen the preseason favorite for nothing. Outscoring the Minutemen 11-1 in the two-game set, BC got a major showing from the line of Chris Collins (3-4-7), Brian Boyle (1-4-5) and rookie Benn Ferreiro (3-3-6). Coupled with a near-perfect weekend for goaltender Cory Schneider (35-of-36), the Eagles were essentially unbeatable. The two wins moved the Eagles into a first-place tie with Providence, which continued to roll to its best-ever Hockey East start with a 4-1 win over BU. The Terriers rebounded with a 5-1 non-conference victory at Dartmouth Saturday. Brad Zancanaro led all BU scorers with two goals and two assists on the week.

After suffering its second shutout in four games with a 1-0 loss to Harvard Thursday, UNH got back in the win column with a 4-1 triumph vs. Lowell on Saturday. UML's Peter Vetri was the story

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC is 15-1-1 in its last 17 games vs. UMass and has a 16-game undefeated streak at UMass ... In Friday's 7-0 win, Chris Collins notched the first BC hat trick since Patrick Eaves did it on Feb. 14, 2004. Brian Boyle's four assists were the most by a BC player since Jan. 31, 2003, when Ben Eaves had four.

Boston University: BU's win over Dartmouth Saturday was its first triumph over an unranked opponent this season. It was also the first career game for sophomore Craig Sanders ... BU has scored 47.6 percent of its goals in the third period (20 of 42), including eight in the last three games.

University of Maine: Maine had given up just two short-handed goals in the first 15 games of the season, but gave up two to Northeastern on Saturday night ... Maine boasts an amazing 89-0-5 record in the last 94 games in which it has led after two periods ... Maine's penalty kill continues to excel, killing 81 of 86 chances by opponents for a 94.2% success rate, the best in the nation.

University of Massachusetts: Matt Anderson broke a slump with his first goal in 10 games in Tuesday's 4-1 win vs. Merrimack. Marvin Degon broke a seven-game scoreless drought with one goal and two assists this week ... Stephen Werner has 103 career points, third-most in the modern era of Minuteman hockey (1993-present) ... A season-high 6,372 fans came to the game Saturday at the Mullins Center.

UMass Lowell: Peter Vetri's 53 saves at UNH Saturday was a career high, breaking his old mark of 40 set just one week prior. He is averaging over 37 saves per game over his last six ... In the past six games, the UML power play has been clicking along at 36.4%. Over the first nine games, the unit was only 9.4% effective.

Merrimack College: Junior Mike Alexiou has quietly built a seven-game point streak, just two short of the best by a Hockey East player this season ... The Warriors' OT loss on Saturday night snapped a streak of 14 consecutive overtime games without a loss. Their last OT loss came on Feb. 14, 2003, when they dropped a 3-2 decision at BC.

University of New Hampshire: UNH posted a season-high 57 shots on goal on Saturday night with 100 total shots attempted ... UNH's top line of Jacob Micflikier, Daniel Winnik and Brett Hemingway have combined for 70 points in 18 games this season for an average of 3.89 points per game, making the trio the top scoring line in Div. I college hockey.

Northeastern University: Bryan Esner's two short-handed goals on Saturday were NU's first two short-handers of the season and marked the first two-goal game of Esner's career ... NU has been outshot 11 times in 14 games this season, including 41-16 by Maine Saturday ... Adam Geragosian reached the 35-save mark for the fifth time this season when he made 36 in NU's loss to Maine.

Providence College: The Friars remain unbeaten at home (5-0-1) this season. They were 8-7-3 at home last season ... The Friars' 8-2-1 start in Hockey East is their best ever after 11 league contests ... Torry Gajda has 11 goals this season, already matching PC's leading goal-scorers from last year.

University of Vermont: Seven different Catamounts had multiple points in Saturday's 8-4 win vs. the U.S. Under-18 Team, led by Jaime Sifers' two goals and two assists. Six of the Catamounts' eight goals came with the man advantage.

- Torry Gajda, PC (Sr. F; Westfield, MA) Has scored six goals over an active four-game goal-scoring streak.
- Matt Johnson, MC (Sr. F; Eden Prairie, MN) Had backto-back two-goal games for the Warriors last week and is now tied for second among all Hockey East players with 11 goals this season.
- **Jeff Pietrasiak, UNH** (Sr. G; Shrewsbury, MA) Has posted a 6-0-1 record and a .931 save percetage in his last seven starts. His only loss of the season came on Oct. 21 vs. North Dakota.
- **BU's No. 1 line** John Laliberte, Jason Lawrence and Brad Zancanaro have combined for 17 points in the last three games. Zancanaro three goals and four assists in that span, including two three-point efforts, and a game-winning goal versus Boston College.


