# VERMONT'S FALLON DELIVERS BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS BC backup Joe Pearce named MVP of Denver Cup

It was a pleasant holiday season for Hockey East as its teams collectively won three of the six holiday tournaments in which they participated. Vermont goaltender Joe Fallon notched the most impressive performance of any Hockey East player last week, posting back-to-back shutouts in the annual Catamount Cup, 1-0 vs. Dartmouth and 3-0 vs. Clarkson. At the Denver Cup, BC backup Joe Pearce stopped 53 of the 57 shots he faced in the tournament and picked up Tournament MVP honors. The third tournament title came just before Christmas when Providence won its own Holiday Classic.

The UMass Lowell River Hawks nearly made it four when they staked themselves a 3-1 first period lead over host Minnesota in the title game of the Dodge Holiday Classic. But the Golden Gopher offense eventually overpowered Lowell and finished off with a 5-4 win. Peter Vetri was forced to make 44 saves in the game, including 23 in the first frame alone.

In other tourney action, UMass salvaged a 2-1 win over Army in the consolation game at the UConn

#### CCM / RBK HOCKEY PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JOE FALLON – Vermont Sophomore Goaltender, Bemidji, MN

Most Outstanding Player of the Catamount Cup tournament notched back-toback shutouts, stopping 18 shots vs. Dartmouth and 19 vs. Clarkson. Hockey Classic. Northeastern rookie Doug Jewer's 47 saves was not quite enough against Maine in the Florida College Classic consolation game, as the Black Bears pulled out a 4-2 win.

Merrimack looked as if it was going to survive an onslaught at BU Friday, as the Warriors held a 2-1 lead midway through the third period courtesy of two goals from Justin Mills. But the Terriers got two goals during a five-minute power play and added an empty-netter to win 4-2. Elsewhere, UNH dropped a 6-2 decision to nemesis Niagara despite launching 51 shots on goal.

# TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Chris Collins, Peter Harrold and Joe Pearce were all named to the Denver Cup All-Tournament Team. Pearce's holiday tournament MVP Award was the second of his career. He was the Great Lakes Invitational MVP in 2003. BC has now won its last three holiday tournaments ... Freshman defenseman Tim Kunes scored his first collegiate goal Saturday vs. Princeton ... BC had not played last weekend's opponents (Ferris State and Princeton) since the 1983-84 season.

**Boston University:** David Van der Gulik played his first game of the season Friday (injury absence) and registered one assist ... Friday marked the first time this season that the Terriers won a game in which they trailed after two periods. They are now 1-6-2 in that situation this year.

**University of Maine:** Wednesday's win vs. NU broke a fivegame slump (0-4-1) for the Black Bears at the Florida College Classic ... Maine has given up four goals just three times this season, and have lost all three games ... The Black Bears have ended their non-conference schedule with a 7-2 mark.

University of Massachusetts: Captain Stephen Werner recorded his seventh career short-handed goal in Thursday's loss ... Mark Matheson's game-winning goal vs. Army Friday was his first tally of the season ... The Minutemen have scored a power-play goal in each of the last three games. Prior to this stretch, they hadn't had back-to-back games with at least one power play goal.

**UMass Lowell:** Peter Vetri made 40 or more saves in three of UML's six games in December. He had never had a 40-save performance prior to that ... UML's special teams improved dramatically in December. Through the first 11 games of the season, UML's power play was only 12.7% effective while its penalty kill was at 76.5%. In the six games since, the units have converted at 26.3% and 84.6%, respectively.

**Merrimack College**: The Warriors have struggled holding late leads in each of the last three games. Despite having the lead entering the third period in each of those, they went 0-1-2, allowing seven third period goals and scoring just one ... Junior Mike Alexiou saw his six-game point-streak snapped in Friday's loss to the Terriers ... Bryan Schmidt now has 30 career goals, only two short of the all-time record for Merrimack defensemen.

University of New Hampshire: UNH is now 0-3 all-time vs. Niagara. The Wildcats have struggled in non-conference play in general, going just 1-4-1 so far season ... UNH has three losses on home ice this year, one short of last year's total ... Junior defenseman Chris Murray scored his first collegiate goal Friday vs. Niagara.

**Northeastern University:** Ray Ortiz made his season debut on Tuesday (injury absence) and notched a short-handed goal in NU's 4-2 loss to Maine on Wednesday. NU has three short-handed goals this year, all vs. Maine ... NU has led entering the third period just four times this season, and is only 1-2-1 in those games.

**Providence College:** The Friars did not play last week. They return to action Friday at Boston University.

**University of Vermont:** UVM has notched back-to-back shutouts for the second straight year. Joe Fallon has nine shutouts in his career, one behind all-time UVM leader Tim Thomas ... Fallon, Matt Syroczynski and Torrey Mitchell were named to the Catamount Cup All-Tournament Team ... Vermont is 10-1 when scoring first this season and owns a 20-8 scoring advantage in the opening period.

• Chris Collins, BC (Sr. F; Fairport, NY) – Has 11 points (six goals and five assists) in BC's last four games.

• Torry Gajda, PC (Sr. F; Westfield, MA) -

Has a six-game point streak with multiple points in five of those games. He has seven goals and five assists in that span.

#### Vermont's Defense and Penalty Kill –

The Catamounts have allowed more that two goals just once in the last 10 games. The team's 1.67 goals against average ranks third in the country. Its penalty kill also ranks third, having allowed just eight goals in 84 opportunities (90.5%).
