WILD WEEKEND ENDS WITH TWO OVERTIME WINS Terriers end BC win streak, extend their own

Entering the weekend, the best active win streak among Hockey East teams was eight straight for Boston College, but now it's seven straight for Boston University, as the Terriers outlasted the Eagles 4-3 on Friday and beat UMass 3-1 on Saturday. Defenseman Kenny Schaeffer led the win at BC with a goal and two assists as the Terriers overcame a 2-0 deficit to topple the top-ranked Eagles. The line of Brian Ewing, Pete MacArthur and Kenny Roche did the honors Saturday vs. UMass, each scoring a goal and totalling seven points as a unit.

Boston College looked to be on the ropes again in Saturday's game at Lowell, trailing 3-2 midway through the third period. But the Eagles pulled it out when junior Brian Boyle completed his hat trick at the 12:32 mark and made it a four-goal night with the overtime winner with under a minute remaining in OT. Hockey East leading scorer Chris Collins assisted on all four goals and also set up two of BC's three in Friday's loss, giving him 13 points over the last five games.

Vermont also picked an overtime win to salvage a split weekend against a determined Merrimack squad. The Warriors won Friday's opener 4-2 courtesy of 32 saves from rookie goaltender Patrick Watson. It was the Warriors' first Hockey East road win since Jan. 17, 2004, a span of 23 games (0-20-3). The Catamounts gave up the tying score in Saturday's rematch with under three minutes to play, but won the game in overtime when Jeff Corey notched his second of the game.

Maine didn't require any extra time to complete a weekend sweep at Northeastern, winning 6-3 on Friday and 2-1 on Saturday. Friday's contest was tied 2-2 after one period and 3-3 after two, but the Black Bears took control in the third period to the tune of a 3-0 advantage. Greg Moore led the way with two goals and one assist. On Saturday, it was defense that won the day as Maine allowed NU just seven shots on goal over the final two periods.

In the only action for either squad this weekend, Providence defeated UNH 3-1 on Friday behind two goals from Jon Rheault.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Cory Schneider ended his shutout streak at 242:19, the second-longest streak in school history behind Scott Clemmensen's 254:23 ... Brian Boyle's four-goal effort was the first by any player in a Hockey East league game since UNH's Steve Saviano scored four against Merrimack on Jan. 23, 2004 ... BU's power play goal Friday broke a string of 29 consecutive successful penalty kills by BC.

Boston University: BU finished out January play averaging 3.80 goals per game with a 7-1-0 record, a 30-18 goal differential and two shutouts ... Rookie Brandon Yip concluded a six-game point streak when he was held scoreless Saturday vs. UMass.

University of Maine: The Maine penalty kill remains first in the nation with a 92.0% success rate. The power play is also strong at 21.3%, a big improvement over the 16.2% the Black Bears had in 2004-05 ... Maine's weekend sweep at Northeastern was only the second ever for the Black Bears. The only other time Maine had a two-game sweep at NU was February 12-13, 1993.

University of Massachusetts: Jamie Solon has three goals in his last four games. The senior had just nine career goals prior to that streak ... Gabe Winer recorded 35 saves on Saturday at BU, marking the third time in four games that the netminder has made 35 or more saves in a contest. Winer broke UMass' all-time record for games played by a goalie with his 109th appearance Friday.

UMass Lowell: Elias Godoy has a four-game point streak, the longest streak by a River Hawk this season ... Saturday's OT loss vs. BC was UML's first home loss since Nov. 11.

Merrimack College: Freshman Chris Nugent picked a good time for his first career goal, tying Saturday's game at Vermont with a breakaway goal late in the third period ... Sophomore Derek Pallardy, scoreless through the team's first 21 games, has five points in his last four games.

University of New Hampshire: Freshman forward Jamie Fritsch scored his first collegiate goal Friday at Providence. The game also marked the first Hockey East loss this season for goaltender Jeff Pietrasiak, who had been 6-0-1 ... UNH has outscored its opponents 21-10 in the third period in 17 Hockey East games this season.

Northeastern University: Freshman Ryan Clauson made his collegiate debut Saturday. Northeastern took five penalties for 10 minutes in the game, marking NU's season-low in both categories. It was just the fourth time this season NU had fewer penalties than its opponent.

Providence College: Torry Gajda is on a four-game point streak, with six assists in that span ... Six of PC's 14 wins this season have come against ranked opponents ... Jon Rheault's two-goal game was the second two-goal performance this season and the fourth of his career.

University of Vermont: UVM's home shutout streak lasted 266:03 up to Merrimack's first goal Friday night. It was the first goal Vermont allowed at Gutterson Fieldhouse since Dec. 17 against St. Lawrence. Vermont had gone four straight games at home without allowing a goal ... Jeff Corey's two goals on Saturday marked the first time since Nov. 11 that a Catamount had two goals in a game ... Only two of Vermont's eight losses this season are against unranked teams.

• Danny O'Brien, UML (Sr. F; South Boston, MA) – Has six goals in his last six games, and three assists as well.

• John Curry, BU (Jr. G; Shorewood, MN) – Boasts a seven-game winning streak with a 1.58 goals-against-average, a .940 save percentage and two shutouts in that span.

• BC's Brian Boyle and Chris Collins – Have combined for 11 goals and 13 assists over the last five games.

• BU's Peter MacArthur and Kenny Roche – BU is undefeated (7-0) since the two were first paired together on Jan. 7, during which time the duo has been responsible for 12 of the 29 BU goals and a total of 22 points.
