UMASS THRILLS HUGE HOME CROWD WITH WIN OVER BC Vermont back in the hunt for home ice following win, tie at Providence

The second-largest crowd ever for a UMass hockey game showed up Friday night to see the Minutemen take on first-place Boston College, and few of the 7,132 in attendance left disappointed. Rookie Jon Quick rang up 47 saves in the game, shutting out BC until midway through the third period, en route to a 3-2 triumph. Invigorated, the Minutemen promptly added a 5-2 road win at UMass Lowell on Saturday, vaulting them over the River Hawks in the standings. P.J. Fenton had two goals and one assist in the Lowell game, while teammate Stephen Werner had a goal in each game and added one assist.

Rattling the host Friars was the task for Vermont this weekend at Providence, and the Catamounts pulled it off with a 4-1 win on Friday and a 3-3 tie on Saturday, coming within one minute of a sweep. Jon Rheault preserved the single point for Providence with an extra-attacker goal at the 19:01 mark. Brady Leisenring and Torrey Mitchell led the way for Vermont, each tallying one goal in each game and three points in the set.

UNH rebounded from a 4-1 loss at Maine Friday with a 7-4 win in the rematch, marking its first victory at Maine since 2000. Brett Hemingway and Jacob Micflikier each had two goals and one assist in the win, while Maine's Greg Moore continued his hot streak with a pair of goals in the same game. Hemingway and six other Wildcats were suspended for Friday's game due to a violation of team rules, but the makeshift UNH squad made it interesting anyway, getting 36 saves from Kevin Regan. Josh Soares scored twice for the Black Bears.

Boston University kept its pre-Beanpot winning streak intact by posting its eighth straight victory, 5-1 at Lowell on Friday. John Curry had 32 saves. Northeastern managed to comeback to tie Merrimack for the third time this season, getting two third-period goals rendering Warrior rookie Patrick Watson's 34-save effort bittersweet.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC's loss at UMass Friday ended a 16-game winning streak for BC in Amherst. The last time the Eagles lost at UMass was Jan. 17, 1995, the Minutemen's first year in Hockey East ... Senior Chris Collins registered his 100th career point (50 goals and 50 assists) Friday

Boston University: BU's eight-game win streak is the best active streak in the nation right now, and the team's best since the 2001-02 season ... BU's all-rookie line of Chris Higgins, Jason Lawrence and Brandon Yip have produced 24 points during BU's eight-game current win streak.

University of Maine: Derek Damon became the 44th player in Maine history to reach 100 points when he had an assist on Friday night against UNH ... The seven goals allowed on Saturday night were the most by an opponent in Alfond Arena since a 7-2 loss on December 10, 2000, to Boston College.

University of Massachusetts: Fourteen Minutemen shared in the wealth of two wins last weekend, registering at least one point, while seven registered multiple points ... Senior Jamie Solon netted the game-winning goal vs. BC Friday, marking his fourth goal in six games. He had just nine career goals prior to this burst ... Friday's win marked the fifth time this season that the Minutemen beat a Top 15 team.

UMass Lowell: Andrew Martin returned to the lineup Friday after missing the last nine games due to injury. Martin has only played in 10 games this season, missing 17 matches with various ailments. He is closing in on the 100-point mark for his career with 95 in 119 games to date.

Merrimack College: Following a 10-game losing streak, the Warriors are now 1-1-1 in their last three, all league games ... Merrimack tied Northeastern in each of three meetings this season ... Sophomore Jordan Hart scored his first career goal Friday vs. Northeastern.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's win at Maine Saturday was its first there since Jan. 8, 2000 ... Junior forward Jacob Micflikier posted his 100th career point with a goal on Saturday ... 13 of 18 UNH skaters posted a point for the Wildcats in Saturday's 7-4 win. It marked the third time this season that the Wildcats have scored five goals or more.

Northeastern University: Northeastern salvaged three ties vs. Merrimack this season, despite trailing by at least two goals at some point in each of those games ... Northeastern's six ties this season are the third-most in NU history. NU tied seven games in both 1993-94 and 2003-04.

Providence College: The Friars, who are averaging 34 shots per game, were held to a season-low 17 shots versus Vermont on Friday ... Freshman goalie Stephen Ritter made his second career start in Saturday's 3-3 tie vs. UVM. Tyler Sims had started 23 consecutive games for the Friars prior to that ... PC has four players with 20 points or more. Last season, only two Friars reached the 20-point mark.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts are 31-1-2 in their last 34 games when leading after two periods ... Vermont held Providence to 1-for-14 on the power play this weekend and rank tied for second in the country on the penalty kill this season at 90.6% ... The 14 penalties for 36 minutes against Providence in Saturday's tie were both season highs.

• **John Curry, BU** (Jr. G; Shorewood, MN) – Boasts an eight-game winning streak with a 1.50 goals-against-average, a .945 save percentage and two shutouts in that span.

• **Greg Moore, Maine** (Sr. F; Lisbon, ME) – Has nine goals in his last nine games and is tied with BC's Chris Collins with 15 goals in league play this season.

• **BC's Brian Boyle, Chris Collins and Stephen Gionta** – The formidable trio has accounted for 14 of BC's last 19 goals and has 20 assists in that same six-game span. Collins and Gionta boast six-game point streaks.

• **BU's Brian Ewing, Peter MacArthur and Kenny Roche** – Have led BU to an eight-game win streak, connecting for 15 goals and 14 assists in that span.
