BC, BU SWEEP WEEK TO SET UP BEANPOT FINALE Maine takes three of four points at Vermont in gaining playoff edge

The stage is set for one of the best Beanpot finales in recent memory. The BU Terriers advanced thanks to a goal and two assists from Saugus native Jason Lawrence vs. Harvard (yielding a 5-3 win) and 23 third-period saves from John Curry, who followed that up with his third shutout of the season, 3-0 vs. UMass on Friday. BC maneuvered into the title game with a 5-2 win vs. Northeastern and then overpowered Providence 8-3 on Friday. BC's big line contributed 16 points over the two games, led by Stephen Gionta's 3-1-4 showing in the win over the Friars.

Providence rebounded with a 4-1 win Saturday vs. Massachusetts, but it was a 1-1 tie by Merrimack vs. UNH that made a bigger splash on the same night. Rookie Patrick Watson had his third sterling performance in as many games with 40 saves. UNH won the first game of the weekend, shutting out Merrimack in Durham Friday, 4-0, as Kevin Regan stopped all 27 shots.

CCM / RBK HOCKEY PLAYER OF THE WEEK

STEPHEN GIONTA – Boston College Senior Forward; Rochester, NY

Started the week with a goal and an assist in a Beanpot win vs. Northeastern and ended it with his first career hat trick plus one assist in an 8-3 win vs. Providence. Northeastern also shook things up, shaking off the Beanpot loss to record a 6-4 win vs. Lowell Friday. The Huskies used a four-goal first period and two third-period goals from rookie Joe Vitale to carry the night, ending a frustrating 18-game winless streak.

Maine got the better end of a series between two teams anxiously fighting for a home ice berth in the Hockey East playoffs, posting a win and a tie at Vermont. The Black Bears overcame deficits in both games to take three-offour points on the weekend.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Rookie blueliner Brett Motherwell extended his point streak to five games with a goal in the Beanpot and two assists vs. Providence ... BC swept the season series against the Friars and is unbeaten in its last 10 meetings with Providence (7-0-3) ... Sophomore Matt Greene's goal against Providence Friday marked his first of the season.

Boston University: BU is in the Beanpot final for the 12th consecutive year and 22nd time in 23 years. The Terriers have won 10 of the last 12 'Pots ... BU's 10-game win streak is its first since 1995, the same year they last won the national title ... Senior blueliner Dan Spang is on a six-game point streak, with a goal and six assists in that time.

University of Maine: The Black Bears tied their first game of the season on Saturday at Vermont ... Greg Moore has continued to impress, scoring nine goals in the last ten games ... Maine's scored seven goals over two games at Vermont this weekend, all by different players ... The Maine penalty kill remains first in the nation at 90.4 percent, which included 1:07 of five-on-three in overtime at Vermont on Saturday.

University of Massachusetts: Rookie Jon Quick's 40 saves vs. BU was only his third-highest total of the season. Earlier this year, he notched 49 vs. Providence and had 47 in a 3-2 win vs. BC last weekend ... UMass has had a strong season at the box office, averaging 4,312 fans per home game.

UMass Lowell: Andrew Martin scored a short-handed goal Friday night at NU and now needs just four points to reach 100 for his career.

Merrimack College: The Warriors have been shutout four times this season, the most in school history ... Freshman Rob Ricci scored Merrimack's only two goals against UNH this season, amazingly yielding a win and a tie ... Three of Merrimack's last four games have gone to overtime ... In the last four games, Merrimack has a win and two ties, matching its league point total from the first 17 games.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's third line of Jerry Pollastrone, Trevor Smith and Brian Pouliot combined for a 2-4-6 line in the 4-0 win on Friday night ... UNH's penalty kill is a perfect 21-for-21 over the last three games ... Brett Hemingway and Brian Yandle each need just seven points to reach the 100-point mark.

Northeastern University: NU broke its all-time record 18game winless streak (0-13-5) with a 6-4 win over UMass Lowell on Friday, marking its first victory since a 2-0 win over Massachusetts on Nov. 11. NU's previous worst winless streak was a 12-game losing streak in 1962 ... NU's six goals vs. Lowell was its most in a single game this season ... Sophomore Josh Robertson has seven points over his last five games after going scoreless in his first nine.

Providence College: The Friars' 90 goals this season have eclipsed last season's total of 85 ... The Friars have nine players who have reached a career high in points this season, led by Torry Gajda, who has 33 points.

University of Vermont: Vermont gave up all three goals in a span of 74 seconds in the third period of Friday's loss. It was the first time all season that Vermont has given up three goals in a period and the first time UVM lost when leading after two periods (13-1-3) ... Vermont and Maine entered the weekend as the top two penalty-killing teams in the country but there was a total of seven power-play goals scored during the weekend series.

• John Curry, BU (Jr. G; Shorewood, MN) – Boasts an 11game winning streak with a 1.55 goals-against-average, a .942 save percentage and three shutouts in that span.

• Patrick Watson, MC (Fr. G; Waltham, MA) – Has posted a win at Vermont and two ties (vs. UNH and NU) in his last three starts, stopping 106 of 111 shots faced for a .955 save percentage and a 1.57 GAA in that span.

• BC's No. 1 Line – Brian Boyle, Chris Collins and Stephen Gionta have scored 22 of BC's last 32 goals and have 28 assists in the same eight-game span. Collins and Gionta have a shared eight-game point streak.

• BU's Ewing-MacArthur-Roche Line – The trio added three goals and four assists in two games last week to bring their 10-game win streak total to 18 goals and 18 assists.
