BU CLAIMS FIRST REGULAR SEASON TITLE SINCE 1999-2000 UNH takes three of four points vs. BC to lock up final home ice spot

It took a little bit of fortune and a lot of hard work, but in the end it all worked out for the BU Terriers, who completed a weekend sweep vs. Northeastern and got some help from other teams to clinch the 2005-06 Hockey East regular season title outright. It was their seventh Hockey East regular season title but first in six years. Pete MacArthur led the BU sweep with five points.

BU's quarterfinal round opponent will be UMass, whose 2-2 tie Friday at Maine enabled the Terriers to take a one-point lead over the Black Bears and place sole claim on the title. UMass rookie Jon Quick was outstanding with 48 saves. The Bears struck back Saturday, however, posting a 5-3 win against UMass' Gabe Winer.

Maine will host UMass Lowell in the first round, and the River Hawks enter the series on a 4-1-1 run, thanks to a sweep vs. Vermont this past weekend. In perhaps the most interesting quarterfinal series, Vermont will visit BC in a set between two squads that have been quite unpredictable recently.

UNH got 40 saves from Kevin Regan (3-3 tie) and 34 from Jeff Pietrasiak (5-2 win) to complete a three-point weekend vs. BC in claiming the final host bid for the quarterfinals. The Wildcats will take on Providence, who notched a 5-3 win at Merrimack Friday, but lost 4-3 in OT at home vs. the Warriors Saturday. Warrior rookie Rob Ricci was outstanding with five points in the set, including Saturday's overtime goal.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Freshman Nathan Gerbe's goal at UNH Saturday marked his first score since Jan. 13 vs. Merrimack ... A UNH power-play goal Thursday broke a string of 18 consecutive successful penalty kills by BC ... BC is 4-7-1 in its last 12 games following a 15-2-1 run.

Boston University: BU finished the regular season on a 16-2-2 run after a 5-7-2 start ... The Terriers have scored three or more goals in 17 of the last 20 games, and five goals in eight of those ... The Terriers won seven of nine Hockey East series this season, including sweeps over Maine, Merrimack and Northeastern ... Brian Ewing and David Van der Gulik each had a goal in each game vs. NU and each added one assist as well. John Laliberte also had three points in the sweep.

University of Maine: Maine will host the Hockey East quarterfinals for the seventh straight season ... Maine is the only school in the nation with both the power play (fifth) and penalty kill (first) ranked in the top five in the country ... Maine is 18-0-1 on the season when entering the third period with a lead and 20-2-0 when scoring three or more goals.

University of Massachusetts: Chris Capraro's two-goal game Friday was his first multiple-goal outing since October of 2003 ... Freshman defenseman Topher Bevis notched his first career goal Saturday at Maine ... In 14 starts this season, rookie goaltender Jon Quick has made at least 30 saves in nine of them and 40 saves in four of them.

UMass Lowell: UML has won three straight and four of its last five contests, outscoring opponents 19-9 in the four wins ... Andrew Martin needs just one point to reach the 100-point plateau ... Mark Pandolfo and Jason Tejchma each had three points in a sweep vs. Vermont.

Merrimack College: Bryan Schmidt had a goal in each game this weekend to give him 34 for his career, good for No. 1 all-time among Merrimack defensemen. Schmidt's three-point night on Saturday was his best outing of the season. Brent Gough also had three points, a career high ... Rob Ricci led all rookies this season with 20 points in Hockey East play and had the game-winning goal in all three of Merrimack's three league wins this year.

University of New Hampshire: UNH will host the quarterfinal round for the 10th straight season. The Wildcats are 7-2-1 in their last 10 meetings against Providence, their quarterfinal opponent ... UNH was the only team in Hockey East not to lose at least one season series this year ... Rookie Trevor Smith had a goal in each game vs. BC while Jacob Micflikier totalled three points.

Northeastern University: Freshman defensemen Andrew Linard and Louis Liotti each scored his first career goal in NU's final game of the season ... Defenseman Steve Birnstill got all 16 of his points this season in Hockey East games ... Jimmy Russo led Northeastern with 18 points this season, even though he had just two points in his final 14 games ... Freshman Ryan Ginand had nine goals in league play this season, tied for the second-highest total among all rookies.

Providence College: The Friars have scored 45 of their 104 goals in the third period ... Sophomore Dylan Cox picked up his first point of the season (an assist) on Saturday night.

University of Vermont: The five goals Lowell scored on Saturday were the most allowed by UVM this season ... With an assist on Saturday Brady Leisenring recording his 117th career point moving him past John LeClair '91 for the most point by a Vermont-born player in school history.
