## TOP FOUR SEEDS SWEEP BACK TO THE GARDEN BU, Maine, BC and UNH all repeat as semifinalists

Fans attending Friday's Hockey East semifinals at the TD Banknorth Garden may get a sense of déjà vu, considering the pairings are identical to last year's, BC vs. Maine and BU vs. UNH. The top four seeds advanced via sweep, although three of the four visiting teams forced one overtime game each.

No. 8 seed Massachusetts was the only one that didn't, surrendering back-to-back 4-1 losses at Boston University. Both UMass goals were scored with a two-man advantage, as BU's John Curry was perfect otherwise, totalling 57 saves. David Van der Gulik led the way in Game One with a hat trick, while linemate John Laliberte had a goal in each game and added three assists.

The Maine-Lowell series also featured identical outcomes, with the Black Bears prevailing 4-3 in each. Keith Johnson needed just 51 seconds of overtime to decide Game One on Friday, but it was Michel Léveill  (2 assists in each game) and Greg Moore (3 goals, 2 assists in the series) that were the primary offensive stars for the hosts.

Friar goaltender Tyler Sims' best efforts in Game Two at UNH were ultimately thwarted when Daniel Winnik scored at 14:18 of the second overtime to end the series in favor of the Wildcats. Sims stopped 59 of 61 shots faced in the game (including 27 in OT) and 85 of 90 on the weekend, but was outduelled by UNH's Kevin Regan (27-for-27 in a 4-0 Game One shutout) and Jeff Pietrasiak (34 of 35 in the 2-1 2OT win in Game Two). Jacob Micflikier registered four points in the sweep.

Boston College broke out of a moderate late season slump with back-to-back wins vs. Vermont. Senior blueliner Peter Harrold set up Chris Collins' late tying goal Thursday and scored the OT winner himself in BC's 3-2 triumph. In the rematch, Collins took over with a hat trick and one assist en route to a 6-2 victory. Collins' four goals brought him to 30 for the season.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Jerry York notched his 745th career victory Friday, moving him ahead of CHA Commissioner Bob Peters for sole possession of 2nd place all-time behind Ron Mason's 926 ... Chris Collins scored his 30th goal of the season on Friday, becoming the first BC player to score 30 or more goals in one season since Brian Gionta scored 33 goals during the 2000-01 campaign ... Peter Harrold has tallied multiple-points three times in BC's last five games and has at least one point in 13 of BC's last 15 games ... In five games against Vermont this season, sophomore goalie Cory Schneider went 5-0 with a 0.97 goals against average and a .960 save percentage.

**Boston University:** John Curry's quarterfinal shutout streak came to an end at 215:01 when UMass scored at 5:52 of the third period on Friday. It also ended his shutout streak vs. the Minutemen at 117:53 ... The Terriers have advanced to the semifinals for the fifth straight season ... The BU line of Kenny Roche, Pete MacArthur and Bryan Ewing has combined for 17 points over the last five games, while the all-senior line of David Van der Gulik, Brad Zancanaro and John Laliberte has an even higher total output, with 20 points in the last four outings.

**University of Maine:** Michel Léveill  and Greg Moore both hit the 100-point mark this weekend ... The Black Bears are 19-0-1 this season when entering the third period with a lead ... The overtime win on Friday night was the Black Bears first overtime win since March 27, 2004 in the NCAA Regionals (2-1 over Wisconsin) ... Maine is advancing to the Hockey East semifinals the 17th time, the most ever by a single team.

**University of Massachusetts:** Chris Capraro came on strong in the last games of the season, with a point in six of the last seven ... Senior blueliner Marvin Degon led the team with 29 points this season and led all defensemen in conference play with eight goals and 22 points.

**UMass Lowell:** Nick Monroe scored his first collegiate goal in Friday's loss at Maine ... Jeremy Hall finished his junior season with seven goals and 11 points in the final 10 games, including four multiple-point efforts. Fellow junior Jason Tejchma ended the season on a five-game point streak ... Andrew Martin's power-play goal Saturday night allows him to finish his career with exactly 100 points.

**University of New Hampshire:** Kevin Regan has posted a 4-0-2 record in his last six starts with a 1.62 GAA and a .945 save percentage, while Jeff Pietrasiak is 3-1-1 in his last five starts with a 1.95 GAA and a .929 save percentage ... In the last 11 games, the UNH penalty kill has killed 55 of 59 opponents power play chances (93.2%). The team has just one loss in that span ... Jacob Micflikier has a five-game point streak with four goals and four assists ... UNH has reached the 20-win mark for the 10th straight season ... Brett Hemingway reached the 100-point plateau last weekend.

**Providence College:** Colin McDonald's second period goal on Friday ended PC's Hockey East playoff scoreless streak at 203:29 dating back to last season. The Friars have been shut out in four of their last six playoff games ... The Friars finished the season with nine players who recorded new career highs in points.

**University of Vermont:** UVM allowed six goals (2 ENG) Saturday at BC, the most given up all season. The team allowed 17 goals in the final four games (4.25 per game) after averaging just 1.91 per game prior to that ... Thursday's overtime loss at BC was UVM's first defeat in OT since January 31, 2004, ending a 15-game streak of 5-0-10 in OT.
