VERMONT ICES TOURNEY WIN; MAINE BURIES GOPHERS Hockey East squads dominate in exhibition matches

The Maine Black Bears served notice this weekend that they'll be a force both in Hockey East and on the national level when they knocked off the 2nd-ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers, 3-1, in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame game on Friday. Not to be outdone, the Vermont Catamounts presented Coach Kevin Sneddon with his 100th career win with an impressive victory in the Ice Breaker Invitational in Ohio.

In St. Paul, the 11th-ranked Black Bears relied on the brick-wall goaltending of sophomore Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO), and timely first-period tallies from Josh Soares (Hamilton, ON) and Bryan Plaszcz (Apple Valley, MN). Bishop finished with 29 saves, many of the spectacular variety, despite the Gophers enjoying a territorial advantage due, in part, to eight penalties called against the Black Bears. Freshman forward Teddy Purcell (St. John's, NF) sealed the win with an empty-net tally with only 26 seconds remaining.

At Miami University, Vermont's Joe Fallon (Bemidji, MN) stopped 54 of 55 shots over two nights, and the Catamounts stormed past Colgate and host Miami to win the Ice Breaker. Sophomore Corey Carlson (Two Harbors, MN), registered two goals in the final, and freshman Colin Vock (Plymouth, MI) scored the game-winner to power Vermont. In Friday's semifinal against 14th-ranked Colgate, Vermont rode four power-plays goals and 23 saves by Fallon to send the Raiders into the consolation game, 6-0.

In exhibitions, Hockey East teams took five or six from Canadian visitors. Providence shut out St. Thomas, 4-0, Massachusetts tipped New Brunswick, 4-2, and UMass Lowell swept past St. Francis Xavier, 6-2, behind two goals by freshman Nick Schaus (Orchard Park, NY). On Saturday, top-ranked Boston College beat St. Thomas, 5-3, Boston University edged New Brunswick, 3-2, and St. Francis Xavier caged UNH, 3-2.
