LEAGUE SQUADS AGAIN A FORCE ON THE ROAD Merrimack gets first win; UML earns three points; Maine holds at home

Hockey East squads again showed strength on the road. Boston College went into Madison, WI, to battle the defending national champion Badgers, and left with two sparkling wins, 3-0 and 4-1. Northeastern almost mirrored that feat, losing a tough overtime match to Michigan (4-3, on a power-play goal) before rebounding the next night to declaw the Wolverines, 3-2. Massachusetts, Merrimack and UMass Lowell also scored big road wins against HE opponents, while Maine held serve.

Boston College, in its first meeting with Wisconsin since losing the NCAA title tilt last March, throttled the Badgers behind the outstanding goaltending of Cory Schneider (Marblehead, MA). The junior stopped 56 of 57 shots in the two-game series. Meanwhile, BC's Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, MI) netted two goals Friday, and sophomore Benn Ferriero (Essex, MA) got a pair in Saturday's 4-1 victory.

In Ann Arbor, Northeastern wasn't awed by 6th-ranked Michigan on Friday, battling the Wolverines for 60 minutes before losing a heartbreaker, 4-3 in overtime. Undeterred, the Huskies came back with a vengeance Saturday, and pinned a 3-2 loss on the Maize & Blue behind a 45-save effort by freshman goaltender Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC). Chad Costello (Johnston, IA) potted the game-winner.

On Thursday, the UMass Minutemen toppled the 8th-ranked UNH Wildcats in Durham, 3-2. Senior Kevin Jarman (Aurora, ON) got the winning tally, tipping in a shot from freshman Justin Braun (Vadnais Heights, MN). Sophomore netminder Jon Quick (Hampden, CT) was outstanding, recording 34 saves.

UMass Lowell's River Hawks came into Boston University's Agganis Arena gunning, outshooting the 4th-ranked Terriers 24-18 and taking the game, 2-1. UML freshman goalie Carter Hutton (Thunder Bay, ON) made 17 saves in his first collegiate win. Merrimack got on the winning track when senior Jim Healey (Holyrood, NF) stopped 33 Providence shots and the Warriors tripped the Friars at Schneider Arena, 3-2. MC's Chris Kane (Irvine, CA) got the game-winner with the first goal of his career.

Providence garnered a point on the weekend the next night, when the Friars tied up the River Hawks, 2-2, in Lowell. New Hampshire's frustrations continued, as an opportunistic Yale team notched a 4-3 overtime win in Durham. In Orono, UMass couldn't complete the road sweep, as the top-ranked Maine Black Bears skated away with a 4-1 win. On Sunday, Vermont was nipped by Dartmouth, 3-2.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: With two victories, BC improved to 10-9-0 in the series with Wisconsin ... Friday's 3-0 victory marked the first shutout in the 19-game series ... The two-game series sweep marked BC's first two-game sweep of Wisconsin since the 1984-85 season, when BC captured 5-2 and 6-2 road victories over Wisconsin on Jan. 4-5.

Boston University: The Terriers suffered their first loss in a 2-1 against UMass Lowell at home ... Senior assistant captain Kenny Roche (South Boston, MA) set up freshman Brian Strait's first career goal on a third-period power play for BU's lone tally ... Goalie John Curry made 22 saves in the loss.

University of Maine: Maine is the only Hockey East school currently in the top 15 nationally in both offense (4.83, third) and defense (1.50, second) ... Of the eight goals allowed by Ben Bishop this season, only two have been even-strength ... Maine has only allowed nine goals this season, three each in the first, second and third periods ... Alfond Arena has been sold-out (5,450) for all three home games this season.

University of Massachusetts: The Minutemen's win over New Hampshire was their second consecutive at the Whittemore Center, marking the first back-to-back road victories over the Wildcats since 1930 ... UMass captialized twice on the power play over the weekend, and the team's penalty kill was a perfect 100 percent against both squads ... Sam D'Agostino (Fr. F; Medford, MA) skated in his first two collegiate games after red-shirting last season.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks defeated Boston University, 2-1, Friday and skated to a 2-2 draw with Providence Saturday to earn three of a possible four points on the weekend ... The River Hawks are unbeaten after their first two Hockey East games for the first time since the 2001-02 season when they opened that season with wins against Boston College and Providence.

Merrimack College: The Warriors earned points in consecutive games last week for the first time since a pair of ties against UNH and UML on Feb. 10-11, 2006 ... MC has won its last two games at Schneider Arena following an 0-6-1 stretch in its previous seven decisions there ... Merrimack's win over PC was its earliest win in HEA since the 2003-04 season (two games).

University of New Hampshire: UNH lost two games in a row at home for only the second time in the history of the Whittemore Center...UNH is 12-0-3 against Northeastern in the last 15 meetings with the Huskies last win coming on Feb. 15, 2002, at 5-4 Northeastern win at Matthews Arena.

Northeastern University: Northeastern's penalty kill was superb in the Huskies' 3-2 win over Michigan on Saturday, holding the Wolverines scoreless in 12 opportunities. Michigan went 3-19 on power plays over both games. Northeastern ranks third in Hockey East in penalty kill (.889), fifth in power play percentage (.175) and leads the league in combined special teams (.585).

Providence College: Colin McDonald (Weathersfield, CT) has scored a goal in five of the six games this season ... Senior Tony Zancanaro (Trenton, MI) has played 116 consecutive games. He is on pace to finish in the Top 10 in career games at PC ... The Friars are winless in their last four games (0-3-1), their longest streak since 2004-05.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts have lost three straight games by one goal ... Sophomore Dean Strong's (Mississauga, Ontario) four power-play goals are the most among Hockey East players so far this season ... Vermont travels to No. 5 Boston College next Saturday. The Catamounts have not defeated BC over a span of 11 games dating back to 1994 in a 3-2 win at Kelley Rink.
