MINUTEMEN, WILDCATS EARN LEAGUE SWEEPS Terriers tie up Maine; UML collects three points; BC bounces back

UMass served notice it will be a legitimate threat in Hockey East with a weekend sweep of Providence, while Maine and UMass Lowell both earned three imporatnt points in league standings. Likewise, New Hampshire and Boston College rebounded from tough losses to win crucial league tilts.

The Minutemen, after splitting a close pair of away games at Maine and New Hampshire the weekend before, pinned two losses on a Friars team that was hoping to build on the momentum of a Halloween win over Boston College. UMass sophomore goalie Jon Quick (Hampden, CT) was solid, getting both wins - 4-1 and 3-2 - despite PC's 71-44 shot advantage. Senior Chris Capraro (Medford, MA), making his season debut, stole the show Friday with an assist and two goals. UMass junior P.J. Fenton (Longmeadow, MA) delivered the goods on Saturday, with an assist and the game-winner.

BU senior goalie John Curry (Shorewood, MN) stood on his head during the weekend to preserve a point apiece against UMass Lowell (1-1) and Maine (2-2). In the two games, Curry turned aside 56 of 59 shots, including every OT attempt. UML's Jason Teichma (Muskegon, MI) finally got the game-tying goal for the River Hawks with six minutes to go in Friday's tilt, off-setting the second-period strike by BU's Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, NY). The next night, the Terriers fought back from a 2-0 hole to garner a point against the nation's top-ranked team, outshooting Maine 26-13 over the last two periods.

Despite a feisty effort by Warrior goalie Jim Healey (Holyrood, NF), Maine overpowered Merrimack on Friday, 4-1, thanks to four power play goals by the Black Bears. The following night, in Lowell, the River Hawks blanked the Warriors behind two goals from senior Jeremy Hall (Mays Landing, NJ) and the continued fine play of freshman goalie Carter Hutton (Thunder Bay, ON).

New Hampshire also got back on the winning track, taking a home-and-away series from Northeastern on the strength of two big periods. In Friday's game, the Wildcats pounced for three goals in the third period, breaking up a close 3-3 game and allowing UNH to cruise to a 6-3 win. At Matthews Arena on Saturday, UNH parlayed a strong three-goal second period to stop the Huskies in the rematch, 3-1. Also on Saturday, UVM Coach Kevin Sneddon must have felt snake-bit when his Catamounts dropped their 4th straight one-goal game, as Boston College blanked Vermont, 1-0.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Boston College lost to Providence College for the first time since Jan. 24, 2003, a 4-1 PC victory in BC's Kelley Rink. The BC unbeaten streak spanned 10 games, during which the team went 7-0-3 ... BC's 1-0 shutout victory extended the Eagles' win streak against Vermont to 10 games.

Boston University: After Saturday's tie, John Curry is 4-1-2 against Maine in his career... Matt Gilroy scored the first goal for the Terriers in both games... All 22 skaters on BU's roster have made at least one appearance this season.

University of Maine: In the Black Bears' seven wins this season, seven different players have scored the game-winning goal ... Maine has allowed one even strength goal in the last 249:51 of play ... Maine (7-0-1) and Cornell (4-0-0) are the only two college teams without a loss ... The Black Bears' power play (27.9 percent) leads the nation.

University of Massachusetts: The Minutemen's win over PC ended a three-game winless streak against the Friars ... Of 22 skaters that have dressed this season, 14 have tallied points. Cory Quirk (So., F; Brockton, MA) leads the pack with seven points, while the senior and sophomore classes are responsible for 24 of 44 team points. The freshmen and juniors have 10 apiece.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks garnered three of a possible four points for the second week in a row with a tie against Boston University and a win over Merrimack ... Lowell's penalty kill has killed 15 of the last 17 power plays against, while its power play snapped an 0-for-19 skid with two man-advantage markers against the Warriors ... The River Hawks are off to their best start in league play since the 1991-92 squad began its conference schedule 5-0-0.

Merrimack College: Mike Alexiou (Pinckering, ON) had a five-game scoring streak snapped against UML on Saturday ... In the last three games, Merrimack has taken 43 penalites and opponents have scored nine power play goals ... Pat Watson (Waltham, MA) made 26 saves in his season debut against UMass Lowell on Saturday.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's penalty kill went 14 for 15 over the weekend vs. the Huskies (93.3 percent) ... UNH is undefeated against Northeastern in the last 17 meetings (14-0-3) ... Trevor Smith has scored a goal in each of the first six games of the season ... The Wildcat offense ranks eighth in the nation at 4.17 goals per game.

Northeastern University: Chad Costello (Johnston, IA) had the first two-goal game of his career on Saturday ... Northeastern outshot New Hampshire 30-24 on Saturday, marking the first time NU outshot an opponent this season ... NU's freshmen and sophomores have 46 points (16-27-46).

Providence College: The Friars have scored a power-play goal in each of the last five games after going scoreless on the man advantage in their previous three contests ... Providence College has outshot its opponents in seven of the nine games this season.

University of Vermont: Vermont defeated the University of Ottawa 5-2 on Sunday at Gutterson Fieldhouse ... The Catamounts outshot Boston College 30-13 in the final two periods, and 33-21 overall for the game, but still missed the mark in a 1-0 loss ... Vermont ranks fourth in the country in scoring defense with a 1.86 goals against average.
