UNH SWEEPS INTO FIRST PLACE; BC TAMES MAINE NU earns dramatic tie; BU blanks PC; UMass beats UConn; UVM wins

On the strength of their two-game sweep of UMass Lowell this past weekend, the UNH Wildcats took over sole possession of first place in Hockey East. The 'Cats snuck by the River Hawks, 5-2, in Lowell on Friday, despite being outshot 33-19. Junior goalie Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA) made 31 saves to preserve the win. The next night in Durham, it was Regan's teammate, Brian Foster (Pembroke, NH), who stole the show, as the freshman netminder whitewashed UML, 4-0, in his first collegiate start. UNH's Jerry Pollastrone (Revere, MA), who collected four points on Friday, got the game-winner on Saturday just 72 seconds into the game. UNH senior Shawn Vinz (Rochester, MN) collected his first goal when he tipped home a shot from Brad Flaishans (Glendale, AZ).

At Maine on Sunday, Boston College's Joe Rooney (Canton, MA) was the difference as the senior potted the game-tying goal against the Black Bears, and then buried the winning tally in overtime to give the Eagles a hard-fought 4-3 win. BC captain Brian Boyle (Hingham, MA) collected his 100th career point with an assist on Rooney's game-winner. Rooney's heroics overshadowed a fine effort by Maine captain Michel Léveillé (Levis, QC), who had a hand in all three Black Bear goals on Sunday, scoring twice and getting an assist on a power play marker.

BC was on the opposite end of a dramatic finish of Friday, as Northeastern captain Mike Morris (Braintree, MA) scored with less than three seconds on the clock to forge a 3-3 tie at Matthews Arena. Across town on Friday, BU's John Curry (Shorewood, MN) had a big game, as the senior netminder stoned the Providence Friars, allowing the Terriers to preserve a 1-0 win before their home crowd. PC's Tyler Sims was almost Curry's equal, stopping 19 or 20 Terrier shots. BU's Chris Higgins (Lynnfield, MA) got the only goal, knocking home a third-period rebound. At a Saturday matinee in Amherst, the UMass Minutemen dispatched Connecticut, 8-1, with Cory Quirk (Brockton, MA) netting the hat trick.

Earlier in the week, Vermont tripped up BU, 2-1, behind goals from Brian Roloff (West Seneca, NY) and Dean Strong (Missassauga, ON), and the superb goaltending of Joe Fallon (Bemidji, MN). In Providence, Friar freshmen defensemen Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, MA) and David Cavanagh (Warwick, RI) scored their first collegiate goals to help PC edge Northeastern, 4-3, in overtime.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Captain Brian Boyle recorded three points – one goal and two assists – against Maine ... Boston College, which entered the third period trailing 2-1, scored twice in the third period and once in overtime to defeat the Black Bears, 4-3. The win snapped a Maine streak of winning 115 games after going into the third period with a lead.

Boston University: The Terriers' contest against Providence kicked off a four-game homestand, the team's longest since playing five straight games at Walter Brown Arena in December, 2002 ... BU has not allowed a goal at Agganis Arena in more than 123 minutes of play ... Friday's shutout against the Friars was the Terriers' first 1-0 victory in conference play since Jan. 24, 2004, against Maine.

University of Maine: Alfond Arena has been sold out for all six home games this season ... Maine has lost the last four regular-season Sunday games played at Alfond Arena ... The Black Bears saw their streak of winning when leading after two periods snapped at 115 games. Prior to the loss on Sunday, Maine was 109-0-6 over the last 115 games when leading after two periods, dating back to Dec. 30, 2001.

University of Massachusetts: Mike Kostka (Ajax, ON) had a four-assist outburst vs. UConn. The mark was a personal single-game best for the blueliner ... The line of Chris Capraro, Cory Quirk, and Chris Davis combined for six goals and nine assists for 15 points ... Goalie Dan Meyer (Voorhees, NJ) saw less than 10 minutes of action to close out the game vs. UConn, but it marked his first time in net since winning the season-opener vs. Sacred Heart.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks have killed off 25 of the last 29 power plays (86.2 percent). UML's PK unit allowed two goals to UNH on Friday but held the Wildcats to just one shot in four attempts Saturday ... The River Hawks have outshot their opponents in seven of their last eight games ... UNH's first-period goal Saturday snapped Lowell's six game stretch of not surrendering a first-period goal.

Merrimack College: Derek Pallardy's (Chesterfield, MO) power-play goal against Vermont snapped a streak of four consecutive games without an extra-man tally ... The Warriors have scored one goal or less in eight of their 11 games this season.

University of New Hampshire: The last time UNH started the season a perfect 5-0-0 on the road was in 1996-1997 ... UNH's line of Jerry Pollastrone, Trevor Smith and Matt Fornataro (Calgary, Alberta) are the second highest scoring trio in college hockey with 48 points (19 goals, 29 assists) ... UNH's penalty kill was a perfect 11 of 11 this week.

Northeastern University: Captain Mike Morris's goal on Friday was the fifth power-play goal and third game-tying goal of his career. Morris has a seven-game point streak and he has 11 points (5-6-11) in that span ... Northeastern has a better record (1-1-2) when opponents score first than when the Huskies score first (1-6-0).

Providence College: The Friars' overtime win over Northeastern on November 14, 2006, marked their first overtime win in nearly one year when the defeated the Huskies, 2-1, at Matthews Arena on November 15, 2005 ... The Friars have now played at BU's Agganis Arena six times.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts have won three straight Hockey East league games for the first time in school history ... Vermont has held its opponents to three or fewer goals in six straight contests. UVM's 1.70 goals against average this season ranks third best in the nation.
