## UNH KEEPS GRIP ON FIRST; UVM SWEEPS INTO SECOND Terriers take pair against ECACHL; Providence runs hot and cold

Hockey East squads are proving the long-held belief that the league is one of the country's toughest, top to bottom. Three weeks ago, Vermont was struggling through a stretch of four one-goal losses. But UVM has ripped off five straight wins since, catapulting the Catamounts into second place behind UNH.

On Saturday in Burlington, Coach Tim Whitehead's Maine crew battled valiantly against Vermont, but the Catamounts won a wild one, 3-2. UVM goalie Joe Fallon (Bemidji, MN) barred the door until Maine's Billy Ryan (Milton, MA) scored with a half minute to go. Catamount Dean Strong's (Mississauga, ON) empty-netter proved to be the game-winner, as Maine's Keenan Hopson (Prince George, BC) tallied with three seconds left for the final score. The win capped a big holiday week for UVM, which also won at UMass on Tuesday, 3-0. The Black Bears, following three-straight league losses, have a .500 league mark, and will look to rebound at home Friday against the Providence Friars.

First-place UNH also collected four points on the week, outgunning Boston College, 6-3, on Thanksgiving Eve, and then trimming Northeastern, 3-1, on Saturday. Junior netminder Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA) collected the wins, allowing only four goals on 53 shots over both games, while junior Matt Fornataro (Calgary, AB) sparked the Wildcats against the Eagles with a goal and two assists. Junior Brett Hemingway (Surrey, BC) got the game-winner against the Huskies, off-setting a fine effort by NU's freshman goalie, Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC), who finished the night with 39 saves.

BU's Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, NY) was eager to get home Saturday. The sophomore ended a tight contest against Yale with an overtime strike nine seconds into the extra stanza. The 2-1 win marked the second nail-biter for the Terriers in as many games against an ECACHL foe, as BU slipped past the Harvard Crimson, 2-1, on Tuesday. Terrier goalie John Curry (Shorewood, MN) was solid against Harvard, while Karson Gillespie (Mankota, SK) got the win against Yale, stopping 23 shots.

Providence had a topsy-turvy weekend, beating UMass Lowell at home on Friday, 4-2, before losing to cross-town rival Brown, 2-1, in the annual Mayor's Cup game on Sunday. PC Coach Tim Army went with goaltender Tyler Sims (Grand Blanc, MI) in both games, and the junior responded with 34 saves against UML and 33 against Brown. PC junior Jon Rheault (Deering, NH) got the game-winner against UML, while senior Colin McDonald (Wethersfield, CT) got the lone goal against Brown.

UMass came into the week ranked No. 14 nationally, but was stymied by UVM's defense, 3-0, on Tuesday. The Minutemen tried to regroup against Union on Saturday, but lost a heartbreaker, 4-3.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** With a 6-3 loss to New Hampshire, BC is now 3-3-1 in its last seven games. The loss marked the first to a ranked team. BC is now 2-1-1 against ranked teams this season ... Sophomore forward Benn Ferriero (Essex, MA) improved his point-scoring streak to four games, during which he has tallied six points (3 goals, 3 assists). Ferriero leads BC in goals (seven).

**Boston University:** BU's 2-1 win over Yale was its first overtime victory at Agganis Arena ... Senior John Curry had a home shutout skein of 148:12 snapped by Harvard ... BU is undefeated in its three contests against ranked opponents this season (1-0-2) ... Sophomore Chris Higgins has recorded at least one point in six of the last seven games (three goals, five assists).

**University of Maine:** Maine has lost three games in a row, all afternoon games ... Maine also lost three straight games twice last season (Nov. 12-Dec. 2 and Jan. 13-20) ... The loss at Vermont was the team's first road loss of the season ... Maine is 6-0-0 this season when scoring four goals or more, but 0-2-0 in one-goal games.

**University of Massachusetts:** Senior Kevin Jarman (Aurora, ON) had a two-point evening vs. the Union Dutchmen, scoring his team-leading third power play goal of the season, as well as assisting on the opening tally ... Mark Matheson (Calgary, AB) also scored on the power play, his third goal in four games.

**UMass Lowell:** Jason Tejchma recorded his fifth multi-point game of the season with two assists at Providence ... UML has killed off 16 of the last 19 power plays against them (84.2 percent) ... UML has out-shot its opponents in nine of the last 10 games.

**Merrimack College:** The Warriors face UNH and Northeastern this week. Last season, Merrimack went 1-1-1 against the Wildcats, and fought to a tie in all three contests against the Huskies.

**University of New Hampshire:** UNH has an 8-game unbeaten streak, the second longest in the country ... The Wildcat offense leads the nation with 4.58 goals per game...UNH won at Conte Forum for the first time since Nov. 19, 2002 ... UNH matched its best start ever in Hockey East play with a 7-1-1 record.

**Northeastern University:** Northeastern held UNH scoreless on the power play, the fourth time this season NU has done so against an opponent ... Mike Morris has at least one point in each of the last eight games (6-6-12).

**Providence College:** Jon Rheault's career-high two short-handed goals this season have both been game winners ... The Friars have scored 17 of their 31 goals this season in the second period ... The Friars have killed off 29 straight power-play opportunities.

**University of Vermont:** UVM's 3-2 win over No. 2 Maine was its first win over the Black Bears at home since Feb. 15, 1983 ... Vermont's game on Tuesday with Harvard features head coaches Kevin Sneddon of UVM and Ted Donato of Harvard. The two were teammates at Harvard and won a national championship in 1989.
