CATAMOUNTS, FALLON PIN SHUTOUT ON ST. LAWRENCE Maine musters tie against Mercyhurst; UML drops two heartbreakers

Non-league action provided mixed results for Hockey East squads this weekend. Vermont ventured to Canton, NY, for another clash with St. Lawrence and came home with a 4-0 win. Maine overcame the superb goaltending of Mercyhurst's Jordan Wakefield to salvage a 1-1 tie, while UMass Lowell fought gamely but came up a goal short twice in contests against Union and Rensselaer.

Vermont junior Joe Fallon continues to prove he's among the elite collegiate goaltenders in the country, as he and his UVM squad blanked the Saints. On offense, Vermont got goals from four different players. Junior co-captain Torrey Mitchell (Greenfield Park, QC) got the Catamounts' game-winner with a shorthanded tally in the first period. Senior co-captain Kenny Macauley (Baddeck, NS) notched a power-play strike for insurance, and senior Chris Myers (South Boston, MA) and freshman Viktor Stålberg (Gothenburg, Sweden) completed the scoring. The win improved the 13th-ranked Catamounts' overall record to 10-5-1, and sent Coach Kevin Sneddon's squad into the holiday tournament season on a high note. Fallon recorded 31 saves in the shutout, as the Catamounts killed off seven SLU power plays.

In Portland, Maine may have won handily if not for the acrobatics of Wakefield. The senior from

Alberta was immense, collecting 45 saves on the night. Maine's Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO) was also solid in goal, finishing with 18 saves, including a game-saving stop in the second period that kept the Black Bears close. The Lakers got on the board first, with a quick snap shot from Ben Crotteau less than four minutes into the game. Maine stormed Wakefield for the next 40 minutes, and finally broke through when Billy Ryan (Milton, MA) tipped a point blast by senior Mike Lundin (Apple Valley, MN). The Black Bears carried the play in the third, but the closest they got to another goal was a Brent Shephard (Shawnigan Lake, BC) backhand that hit the post.

Meanwhile, Coach Blaise MacDonald's UMass Lowell River Hawks were on the road facing Union and Rensselaer, and lost each time by a single goal. On Friday, UML outshot Union 33-24, and freshman Kory Falite (Billerica, MA) tallied two goals, but the Hawks couldn't recover from a 4-1 deficit and lost, 4-3. UML senior captain Cleve Kinley (Powell River, BC) got the third UML tally. Against Rensselaer the next night, the River Hawks tightened down the "D," but the offense failed to get in gear, and UML dropped a 2-1 decision. Sophomore Nick Monroe (Groton, MA) got the lone goal for Lowell.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Boston College junior forward Dan Bertram (Calgary, AB) has been selected to Canada's 2007 National Junior Team to compete at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5, 2007, in Sweden.

Boston University: Boston University head coach Jack Parker is just two wins shy of becoming the fourth college coach to reach 750 career victories ... Despite its offensive struggles, BU has had 15 different players score goals this season, second only to Northeastern (16) among Hockey East teams.

University of Maine: At semester break, Maine is tied for fifth in the Hockey East standings for the second straight season. Last year Maine finished tied for second in the conference ... On Fridays, Maine is 6-0-0, while the Black Bears are 4-3-2 on Saturday and Sunday.

University of Massachusetts: UMass' special teams were dynamite in the recent two-game set against BC, with the power play clicking at 27.3 percent (3-11) ... Last season UMass had scored 27 total goals by this time, seven on the power play. This year, the Minutemen have scored 42 goals, 13 on the power play.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks wrapped up their first half schedule with two one-goal losses on the road – at Union and Rensselaer ... Senior captain Cleve Kinley (Powell River, BC) scored a power play goal Friday, giving UML a man-advantage goal in three straight games.

Merrimack College: Senior Ryan Sullivan's (Toronto, ON) goal against UMass on Dec. 5 (a 3-0 win) was his first since he scored at BC on Feb. 11, 2005 ... Mickey Rego's (Hudson, MA) goal was his second career marker and first since a 4-3 overtime win at Providence to close the 2005-06 season. His goal snapped a streak of 393:10 without an even-strength goal from a forward.

University of New Hampshire: The longest unbeaten streak in school history (compared to the current 12-game streak) is 14 games in the 96-97 season ... The last time that the Wildcats got off to a start like this was the 1999-2000 season when the 'Cats went 15-2-1 to begin the year ... Eight Wildcats have already surpassed their point totals from the 2005-06 season.

Northeastern University: For the third time in four years, NU plays Colgate in the first round of its holiday tourney. The Huskies topped the Raiders, 6-4, in the first round of the RPI Holiday Tournament in 2003-04. In 2004-05 at the Denver Cup, NU beat then-No. 12 Colgate, 5-1.

Providence College: Prior to their last game, the Friars had killed off 31 of their last 32 penalties ... The Friars currently rank fourth in Hockey East on the penalty kill ... PC senior Tony Zancanaro (Trenton, MI) is on pace to finish in the top 10 in career games played at PC.

University of Vermont: Vermont has won eight of its last nine games going into the holiday break ... Torrey Mitchell's short-handed goal in the first period against St. Lawrence was the team's first since Corey Carlson (Two Harbors, MN) had one on Dec. 2, 2005 in a 3-3 tie against UNH.

WHO'S HOT

• **Jon Quick, UMass** (So. G; Hampden, CT) - His 14 consecutive starts is a career high, while his save percentage ranks in the top five nationally (GAA: top-10). Among league netminders, his save percentage (.929) and GAA (2.22) rank first and fourth, respectively.

• **Joe Fallon, Vermont** (Jr. G; Bemidji, MN) - Has already collected three shutouts this season, and his 1.50 goals against average is second best in the country.

• **Cory Quirk, UMass** (So. F; Brockton, MA) - The team's leading scorer, with 16 points, has surpassed his previous season's total of 13. Others just shy of their 2005-06 totals include Chris Capraro (Medford, MA) currently at 15, four shy; P.J. Fenton (Longmeadow, MA) currently at 11, one shy; Mark Matheson (Calgary, AB) currently at 9, two shy; and Mike Kostka (Ajax, ON) currently at 6, two shy.

• **Ben Bishop, Maine** (So. G; Des Peres, MO) - Has allowed one goal or less in nine of the 15 games this season, and only two goals in the last three Maine games.
