MAINE REIGNS IN FLORIDA UML, Vermont reach finals; BU, NU, UNH split

The Maine Black Bears returned home champions after taking the Florida College Classic. Two other Hockey East schools – Vermont and UMass Lowell – reached the finals of their tourneys, but just missed the brass ring. Boston University, Northeastern and UNH all rebounded from Friday losses to win consolation contests. In Florida, Maine silenced Cornell, 6-3, behind Teddy Purcell's (St. John's, NF) two goals, including the game-winner, and Brent Shephard's (Shawnigan Lake, BC) three assists. Maine got to the finals by sweeping past Western Michigan, 8-4, on Friday, after junior Bret Tyler (Maynard, MA) broke open a 3-3 game with two goals in the third period.

In Burlington, the Catamounts came within a whisker of winning their tourney, but couldn't get the equalizer against St. Cloud State and former PC Friar Bobby Goefert. The final wasn't decided until SCS potted an empty-netter with 35 seconds left. UVM's Joe Fallon (Bemidji, MN) whitewashed Rensselaer on Friday, 3-0, to reach the finals. In Denver, the UMass Lowell River Hawks outshot the Pioneers, 37-23, in the finals of the Wells Fargo Denver Cup, but lost a heartbreaker, 2-1. UML's Frank Stegnar (Toronto, ON) got the lone River Hawk tally with five seconds left. The River Hawks tied Brown in the opening round, 1-1, thanks to Vinny Monaco's (Andover, MA) goaltending, and advanced after winning the

shootout. UML's Jeremy Dehmer (Madison, WI) potted the shootout winner.

In Hanover, NH, the BU Terriers rebounded from an overtime loss to St. Lawrence with a convincing 3-0 shutout victory over host Dartmouth in the Ledyard Tourney. BU junior Karson Gillespie, BU (Mankota, SK) earned his second career shutout with the win, and freshman Luke Popko (Skillman, NJ) got the game-winner. The UNH Wildcats also came back strong from a disappointing loss, thumping Western Michigan, 5-2, after losing to Cornell on Friday by the same margin. Defenseman Chris Murray (Dover, MA) got the game-winner for UNH on Saturday.

Northeastern shrugged off its opening loss to Colgate, 5-2, in the Toyota UConn Classic to shut down Holy Cross, 7-2. NU's Ryan Ginand (Milford, MA) had a goal and an assist to lead the Huskies.

The UMass Minutemen tied Ferris State, 1-1, in the Mariucci Classic in Minnesota, but were relegated to the consolation game after losing the shootout. On Saturday, Alabama-Huntsville got the jump on UMass, and cruised to a 5-2 win. The Providence Friars were edged by Lake Superior State, 2-1, in the opening round of the Badger Hockey Showdown, and then lost to host Wisconsin, 5-0. In non-tourney action, Merrimack garnered a tie in the first of a two-game set against Robert Morris, 2-2, but dropped the rematch.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC forwards Dan Bertram (Calgary, AB) and Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, MI) are competing for their respective countries in this year's World Junior Championships in Sweden. Gerbe has played in all four games for Team USA and currently leads the team in assists (5). Bertram has played in each of Canada's four wins in the tournament.

Boston University: Boston University (7-4-5) is the only Div. I team in the country that has yet to suffer a multi-goal loss this season ... All five of the Terriers' non-conference games this season have ended up being against ECACHL squads, with BU posting a 3-1-1 record in those contests ... BU has scored more third-period goals (20) this season than in the first two periods combined (17).

University of Maine: Maine won the Florida College Classic for the first time since 2002 ... Maine's powerplay was 8-15 on the weekend, including a streak of six straight successful power plays ... Maine ends the non-conference schedule with a 7-0-1 record ... Billy Ryan (Milton, MA), Bret Tyler, and Ben Bishop were named to the Classic's All-Tournament Team. Teddy Purcell was the MVP.

University of Massachusetts: Mark Matheson (Sr. D/F; Calgary, AB) scored goals in back-to-back games over the weekend. His nine goals triples his previous-season's best of three (scored as a junior) and surpass the seven goals scored in his previous three collegiate seasons combined ... Matt Anderson's (Sr. F; West Islip, NY) goal on Saturday marked his first since Nov. 25 at Union.

UMass Lowell: Lowell out-shot its opponents – Brown and Denver – 85 to 46 in the two games ... Jason Tejchma's ninth goal of the season Friday night tied the contest with the Bears, his seventh tally that either tied or gave UML the lead this season ... The River Hawks return to Hockey East play on Jan. 5-6 when they host Maine at the Chelmsford Forum as part of "Back to the Forum" weekend.

Merrimack College: Merrimack and Robert Morris met for the first-time ever on Dec. 29. The game also marked RMU's first game against a Hockey East opponent ... senior Matt Byrnes' two points on Friday night marked the first time this season a Warrior has had a multiple-point game.

University of New Hampshire: The 5-2 loss to Cornell marked the first multiple goal loss for the Wildcats this season ... Assistant captain Chris Murray set a new career-high with 12 points, breaking his previous mark of eight points last season ... Mike Radja (Yorkville, IL) currently leads Hockey East with 14 goals and ranks fifth nationally ... The Wildcats rank second in the nation scoring at 4.28 goals per game.

Northeastern University: Northeastern scored three short-handed goals and allowed five in five games in December ... Northeastern's seven goals against Holy Cross were the team's most since an 8-3 win over Massachusetts on March 5, 2005 ... Northeastern's loss to Colgate on Friday was its first loss to the Raiders since Oct. 31, 1997. NU is 4-1-1 against Colgate since.

Providence College: After missing the first 16 games this season because of injury, sophomore Brad Cooper (Coppell, TX) returned to the Friar lineup this weekend ... The Friars rank ninth in the country on the penalty kill (87.8 percent).

University of Vermont: Vermont is ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense (1.61 goals against per game) and on the penalty kill (92.7 percent) ... Junior Joe Fallon's (Bemidji, Minn.) shutout (21 saves) in Friday's 3-0 win against RPI extended his school record for shutouts to 15. His 1.50 goals against average is second in the country, and his .934 save percentage is good for third place nationally.
