RELEASE #26 **UNH KEEPS ROLLING; MAINE SWEEPS RIVER HAWKS** UMass and MC split; BU, NU garner three points; Eagles trip Friars

In a wild weekend of intra-conference play, leagueleading UNH topped the Vermont Catamounts twice at home. Maine served noticed that they'll be in the hunt for the Hockey East crown, BU Coach Jack Parker got a milestone victory, and UMass goaltender Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) got a game-winning goal

In Burlington on Friday, the Wildcats jumped on several miscues by the Catamounts to spring to a 3-0 lead before coasting to a 7-1 win in the opening telecast of NESN's Hockey East Friday Night series. The next night, Vermont's vaunted defense was back, but the Catamounts couldn't solve UNH goalie Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA). Wildcats Trevor Smith (North Vancouver, BC) and Chris Murray (Dover, MA) scored to give the Wildcats a hard-fought 2-1 win.

Maine's Teddy Purcell (St. John's, NF), still flying after his MVP performance in the Florida College Classic, led the Black Bears with a five point effort as the Orono crew swept two from UMass Lowell, 4-2 and 5-2, in the sellout "Back to the Forum" series. Coach Blaise MacDonald's River Hawks outshot the Black Bears both nights, but Maine netminder Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO) kept UML at bay.

Friday was a milestone evening for BU Coach Jack Parker, as he collected his 750th career victory when the Terriers downed the Providence Friars by a 5-1 margin. However, Northeastern denied Coach Parker win No. 751, as goaltenders John Curry (Shorewood, MN) for BU and Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC) matched save for save in a 0-0 draw on Saturday. On Friday, the Huntington Hounds caught lightning in a bottle, roaring back from a 2-0 deficit to nip the Boston College Eagles 3-2 in overtime. NU's Denis Chisholm (Fox Valley, SK) got the game-winner 2:33 into the extra session.

In Andover on Friday, Merrimack freshman Matt Jones (Kentwood, MI) enjoyed a breakout night, scoring his first two collegiate goals, including the gamewinner, in a 2-1 win over UMass, while MC goalie Patrick Watson (Waltham, MA) again stymied the Minutemen. The next night, in the return engagement, Minuteman goaltender Jon Quick pulled off one of hockey's most unlikely feats, getting credit for a goal that a Merrimack defender accidentally slipped into his own net. To make the goal even more special, it turned out to be the eventual game-winner, as UMass sprinted past the Warriors 4-2 in the rematch.

On Sunday, the Eagles rebounded from their overtime loss at Northeastern to pin a 3-1 loss on Providence at Conte Forum. BC goalie Cory Schneider was immense, finishing with 35 saves as the Friars outshot the Eagles, 36 to 17. The Eagles, however, have little time to celebrate, as they're back on the ice this Wednesday to face the Merrimack Warriors.

John Curry, BU (Sr. G; Shorewood, MN) - Stopped 50 of the 51 shots he faced on the weekend, coming close to posting back-to-back shutouts, garnering a win against Providence and a tie with Northeastern for the Terriers.

Kevin Regan, UNH (Jr. G; South Boston, MA) - Went 2-0 on the week against UVM with a 1.11 GAA and a .955 save percentage with 42 saves. Posted 34 saves in the 2-1 victory on Saturday night at Gutterson Fieldhouse.

Matt Jones, MC (Fr. F; Kentwood, MI) - Scored his first three collegiate goals, including two in Friday's 2-1 win over UMass.

Jon Quick, UMass (So. TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Sophomore forward Benn Ferriero (Essex, MA) assisted on both of Joe Rooney's shorthanded goals over the weekend ... Sophomore forward Kyle Kucharski tallied his first career point – an assist on Ben Smith's power-play goal at at Northeastern, and scored his first collegiate goal in the team's 3-1 home victory over Providence ... Friday's 3-2 overtime loss at NU marked the first time BC entered the third period with a lead and lost the game in the last 65 opportunities.

Boston University: The Terriers have allowed just one goal in their last 185 minutes of play, spanning three games ... Only three of the Terriers' last 11 opponents have scored an evenstrength goal ... The Terriers are 7-1-4 this season when scoring at least two goals ... BU earned the 1,300th win in program history on Friday at PC, joining Minnesota (1,538) and Michigan (1,402) as the only schools to reach the plateau.

University of Maine: Josh Soares (Hamilton, ON) is first in Hockey East with seven power play goals ... The Black Bears power play has converted 27.9 percent of their chances this season, which is first in the nation ... With 35 career wins, Ben Bishop is ranked tenth all-time in wins at Maine ... The Black Bears return to Alfond Arena for the first time since December 6 when they host Boston University this weekend.

University of Massachusetts: UMass' Saturday win put an end to a four game winless skid for the Minutemen, their longest of the season. The four games were all on the road. UMass' home magic continued, improving to 7-1-1 overall on the season.

UMass Lowell: One of Lowell's all-time greats, Dwayne Roloson, was tabbed as Goalie of the Year by Goalie World magazine. Roloson plays for the Edmonton Oilers ... Jason Bergeron (Ancaster, ON) scored two power play goals and has three goals in three games against Maine ... The two games were played at the Tully Forum as part of Back to the Forum weekend as the university inducted the school's three Division II national championships ('79, '81 & '82) in the UMass Lowell athletic Hall of Fame

Merrimack College: Freshman Pat Kimball has four points in his last two games and leads the Warriors in scoring with seven points (3-4-7) ... The Warriors won two games in a season series against UMass for the first time since the 2001-02 season ... Merrimack has killed off 35 of its last 38 penalties.

University of New Hampshire: UNH is 10-0-0 on the road this season, which marks the best road record in college hockey ... The 'Cats own a 7-1-1 record against nationally ranked teams this season ... Jacob Micflikier (Winnipeg, MB) ranks third in the nation in assists at 1.00 per game...UNH is 14-1-1 in their last 16 games and have outscored their opponents 70 to 20 in that time ... Six of the top nine scorers in Hockey East are from UNH. In league play, the Wildcats occupy the top four spots.

Northeastern University: Northeastern's 3-2 overtime win over Boston College on Friday was Northeastern's first win over BC since a 3-0 win Jan. 3, 2004. It was the Huskies' first overtime win since they topped Harvard, 2-1, in double overtime in the first round of the Beanpot on Feb. 2, 2005 ... Northeastern split the season series with Boston College, 1-1-1, for the first time since 1997-98.

Providence College: Senior Tony Zancanaro (Trenton, Mi) has played in 130 consecutive games ... Sophomore Chris Mannix (Hubbardston, MA) made his collegiate debut on Jan. 5 against BU ... The Friars have outshot their opponents in 16 of 20 games.

University of Vermont: The seven goals allowed by Vermont on Friday were the most allowed by the Catamounts since the season opener in the 2004-05 season ... UNH leads the alltime series against Vermont 62-14-3.
