TERRIERS COMPLETE SWEEP AT MAINE UNH wins RiverStone; PC bumps UML; UVM takes three points at NU

Though Hockey East's top team – New Hampshire – held a firm grip on its No. 1 status, there was considerable movement in the pack due to a flurry of league play this past week.

Backboned by John Curry's consistently brilliant goaltending and timely scoring by a resurrected offense, the BU Terriers left Orono, Maine with a pair of league wins. BU's Peter MacArthur was a difference maker on Friday, potting a hat trick to propel the Terriers after Curry helped BU repel a 15-0 Maine shot advantage to open the game. The Black Bears, however, didn't go away quietly, though their furious rally from a 6-2 deficit ended with Josh Soares strike with only two seconds left, resulting in the 6-5 final. On Saturday, Curry deflected all 30 Black Bear shots to preserve the win for BU and give the Terriers of their first two-game sweep in Orono in 21 years.

Boston College's offense also came to life last week as the Eagles buried 10 goals in a two-game sweep of league rival Merrimack in a home-and-home series. On their own ice last Wednesday, the Eagles tallied four goals and relied on the rock-solid goaltending of junior Cory Scheider (21 saves) for a 4-1 win. Then BC's top line of Benn Ferriero, Brian Boyle and Joe Rooney exploded for a combined 12 points on Friday as the Eagles streaked past the Warriors, 6-1. Ferriero finished the two-game set with four goals and six points, earning league Player of

the Week honors.

Vermont earned three points the hard way, coming into Northeastern's Matthews Arena and managing a tie and a win against the Huskies. On Friday, NU's Jimmy Russo capped a Husky comeback when he slipped the disc past UVM's Joe Fallon to knot the game at 2-2. When neither team could score in overtime, each collected a point for the draw. NU goalie Brad Thiessen had the bulk of the work, collecting 25 saves to Fallon's 12. The next night, however, Fallon was impenetrable and Vermont won, 3-0.

PC senior Colin McDonald got the Friars a key road win when he converted an overtime breakaway to down UMass Lowell, 3-2, on Saturday. The River Hawks lost for the second time in two nights, despite outshooting their opponents on each occasion. On Friday night, the UMass Minutemen defeated the River Hawks by a 5-1 margin, even though UMass Lowell enjoyed a 34-29 shot advantage. UMass goalie Jon Quick finished with 33 saves, while five Minute-men scored in a balanced offensive attack.

On Saturday, the UNH Wildcats outlasted the Dartmouth Big Green, 4-2, to lay claim to state bragging rights in the annual RiverStone Challenge in Manchester, NH. Wildcat goalie Kevin Regan was immense, stopping 43 Dartmouth shots. Kevin Kapstad put the Wildcats ahead to stay with a blistering shot from the point with six minutes to go.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC's wins over Merrimack gave the Eagles a three-game (season) series sweep. For BC's four seniors, the win capped their careers with a 10-0-2 mark against Merrimack ... Brian O'Hanley scored his first goal of the season (the game-winner) in the team's 4-1 home win over the Warriors on Wednesday ... Joe Rooney has registered 23 points – nine goals and 14 assists – this season, surpassing his single-season high of 20 points that he set as a sophomore in 2004-05.

Boston University: BU's six-goal output in Friday's win at Maine was its highest in an opposing rink since a 7-1 victory at UMass on Dec. 4, 2004 ... The Terriers are 8-2-2 in their last 12 games and 4-0-1 in their last five conference games ... BU has compiled an impressive 5-1-3 road record this season ... In Saturday's 3-0 victory over the Black Bears, eight players recorded one point apiece.

University of Maine: In the 3-0 loss to Boston University on Saturday night, it was the first time since January 20, 2006 against Providence that the Black Bears had been shutout at Alford Arena ... The 6-5 loss on Friday night to the Terriers was the first time this season Maine had lost a game in which they had scored four or more goals ... The hat-trick scored by Pete MacArthur on Friday was the first by an opponent since Jan. 27, 2001.

University of Massachusetts: Four Minutemen went 1-1-2 vs. sister school UMass Lowell on Friday: Alex Berry (Danvers, MA), Chris Davis (Simsbury, CT), P.J. Fenton (Longmeadow, MA) and David Leaderer (Rochester, NY). Leaderer's goal was his first in 67 games, dating back to Jan. 27, 2005 vs. Boston College ... Zech Klann (Peacedale, RI) also put an end to a scoreless streak dating back to Feb. 26, 2005, at Niagara (40 games).

UMass Lowell: All of UML's goals over the weekend were scored by freshmen – Ian Schaser, Jeremy Dehner and Jason Bergeron ... The Lowell penalty kill was 6-for-6 against Massachusetts and Providence and is 24 for the last 28 (85.7 percent) over the last eight games ... The River Hawks face Northeastern for a home-and-home series this weekend.

Merrimack College: Merrimack has killed off 48 of its last 53 penalties, including 13 of 15 against BC last week ... sophomore Chris Kane (Irvine, CA) recorded his first career assist at BC on Wednesday night ... Merrimack's three Hockey East wins matches its season total for the 2005-06 season.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has won four straight games and has outscored its opponent, 18 to 6, during that time ... Eight of UNH's 13 remaining regular-season games are at home ... UNH is the only undefeated team in college hockey on the road at 10-0-0 ... Jacob Micflikier (Winnipeg, MB) has scored 138 points in 139 career games.

Northeastern University: Northeastern is 4-3-1 (.562) in its last eight games. That is NU's best eight-game stretch since Feb. 3-26, 2005, when Northeastern went 5-2-1 (.688) ... Through 21 games, Northeastern has scored 51 goals. That is 13 better than the 38 NU scored through 21 games last season. NU has been shut out twice this season, compared to six times at this point last season.

Providence College: The Friars are 2-0-1 in overtime games this season ... PC's win over UMass Lowell on Saturday was its first since Nov. 26 ... The win also marked the Friars' first road victory this season ... The Friars have outshot their opponents in 17 of the 21 games this season ... Colin McDonald has equaled last season's goal total with nine.

University of Vermont: Junior Joe Fallon's 1.58 goals against average this season is the best in the country ... Jay Anciti (Wolfeboro, NH) earned the first point of his career with an assist in UVM's victory over the Huskies on Saturday ... Vermont hosts BC in a pair of televised contests this weekend.
