UNH ASCENDS TO NO. 1; BC COLLECTS TWO WINS Huskies, Maine split; UMass, BU earn three points, MC-UVM all tied

Late-game heroics by Boston University and Boston College on Saturday helped the Beantown schools maintain their second and third place standings in Hockey East, while the league's top team - UNH - was voted No. 1 in the country.

Both BC and BU had busy weeks, starting with a rescheduled tilt last Wednesday, which the Terriers won on the Eagles home ice, 4-1, behind senior goalie John Curry (Shorewood, MN). BC returned the favor on Friday, riding the stellar goaltending of Cory Schneider to a 5-2 victory at Agganis Arena in NESN's weekly Hockey East telecast. On Saturday, the Eagles roared backed from a 3-1 deficit at home against UMass Lowell, winning 4-3 on a last-minute goal by senior Brian Boyle, his second of the game. The River Hawks built their lead on second-period goals by Jeremy Hall, Ian Schaser and Nick Monroe, but BC's Joe Rooney and Matt Greene were able to get the Eagles within one before the end of the stanza. The win enabled BC to capture four league points.

At Orono, Northeastern stunned the home fans with a convincing 6-1 win on Friday, as captain Mike Morris (Braintree, MA) got a goal and an assist, and freshman Greg Costa tallied twice. NU goalie Brad Theissen had 29 saves. Undaunted, the Black Bears and goalie Ben Bishop came ready to play on Saturday, and edged the Huskies 2-1 on an overtime strike

by freshman Teddy Purcell to gain the weekend split. Thiessen was again superb, recording 32 saves in the loss, and freshman Chad Costello got NU's only goal to garner three points on the trip.

In Amherst, the Minutemen jumped out to a 3-0 lead against the Terriers on strikes by Alex Berry, Justin Braun and Cory Quirk, chasing Curry from the nets. However, BU's Karson Gillespie (Mankota, SK) shut the door from that point on, and BU clawed back on two goals by Kevin Schaeffer, and a power-power tally by Chris Higgins. Gillespie finished with 12 saves, while UMass goalie Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) had 30 saves on the night. The tie gave the Minutemen three points on the weekend, after they blitzed UML for three late goals in a 6-3 win on Friday.

In North Andover, Merrimack senior Jim Healey put on a goaltending clinic, stopping 77 of 79 shots in two games against Vermont, preserving a pair of 1-1 ties and two points for the Warriors. On Friday, Merrimack's Mike Vaskivuo scored his first collegiate goal to offset an earlier strike by UVM. On Saturday, Vermont came from behind, when Catamount Ryan Gunderson (Bensalem, PA) tied the game after John Goebel (Parma, OH) gave Merrimack an early lead.

Also on Saturday, UNH rebuffed a feisty Providence squad, winning 2-1 after Cody Wild had given the Friars a 1-0 lead. UNH's Jacob Micflikier (Winnipeg,

MB) got the tying strike, and Thomas Fortney popped in the game-winning goal a minute later. UNH's Kevin Regan was solid, with 32 saves, while PC's Tyler Sims kept the Friars close, also making 32 saves.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Boston College and Boston University played twice this week, marking the first and second time that coaches with 750 career wins (BC's Jerry York and BU's Jack Parker) faced off ... Junior left wing Matt Greene (Plymouth, MA) recorded his first goal of the season against UMass Lowell on Jan. 27 ... With at least one point in each game this week, sophomore Brock Bradford (Burnaby, BC) extended his point-scoring streak to six games.

Boston University: The Terriers were unbeaten in 14 straight January games (13-0-1) before falling to BC on Jan. 26 ... The 5-2 setback was also BU's first multi-goal loss of the year ... BU is 12-2-3 when recording less than 30 shots, but is just 2-3-4 when recording more than 30 shots ... The Terriers are a perfect 7-0-0 this season when taking a lead into the first intermission.

University of Maine: Maine defenseman Mike Lundin (Apple Valley, MN) picked up his first penalty of the season on Saturday night against NU. It was his first penalty since Dec. 2, 2005, a stretch of 49 games ... Saturday, Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO) allowed a single goal for the ninth time this season. Maine is 8-0-1 in those games ... Maine faces UNH at the Verizon Center on Friday, its first appearance at the venue since Feb. 1, 2003.

University of Massachusetts: UMass faces UMass Lowell for the third time in four weeks next Saturday in Amherst ... UMass' three points on the weekend marks the first time since Nov. 3-4 (vs. Providence) that the Minutemen have taken more than two points in league play.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks scored three goals in a 4:01 span Saturday at Boston College, their fastest three goals this season (previous was 4:10 vs. Niagara on Oct. 21) ... Lowell scored three goals in back-to-back games for the first time since mid-December ... Jeremy Dehner (Madison, WI) had a goal and an assist, both on the power play, against UMass ... The River Hawks are 16-for-17 on the penalty kill in the last six games.

Merrimack College: The Warriors two ties against Vermont gave them points in consecutive games for the first time this season ... the Warriors posted back-to-back 1-1 ties for the first time in school history ... Merrimack is 1-2-2 against Vermont since the Catamounts joined HEA last season ... In his last four games, goalie Jim Healey has a 1.69 GAA and a .944 save percentage.

University of New Hampshire: The last time UNH was ranked No. 1 in the nation was Oct. 20, 2003 in the USCHO poll and the last time the team was #1 in both polls was Oct. 28, 2002 ... UNH needs only one win for its 11th consecutive 20+ win season ... The Wildcats are 6-0-0 in their last six home games and they have outscored the opponent, 22 to 3 in that time.

Northeastern University: NU got its first win at Alford Arena since Nov. 12, 1998, when the Huskies topped Maine, 6-1, on Friday. With Saturday's 2-1 loss, NU split a series with Maine for the first time since taking three points from Maine Jan. 11-12, 2002 ... Five different players scored in NU's 6-1 win over Maine, the fifth time this season at least four different NU players scored.

Providence College: The Friars have killed off 58 of the last 62 opponent power-play opportunities; including 19 consecutive ... Junior Tyler Sims now ranks ninth all-time at PC with 1,872 career saves and seventh with 75 career games played ... After not scoring in the first 17 games this season, Cody Wild (North Providence, RI) has scored a goal in two of the last three games.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts have the nation's second longest unbeaten streak at six games (3-0-3) ... Vermont is 1-1-4 in overtime games this season ... Vermont is currently winning or has won the season series against eight of nine Hockey East teams this season. That is the most series leads by any team in Hockey East including UNH (seven).

Kevin Regan, UNH (Jr. G; South Boston, MA)
Is undefeated (6-0-0) in his last six starts, with a 1.05 GAA and a .967 save percentage. He has stopped 176 of 182 shots during that time.

Mike Vaskivuo, MC (Fr. F; Helsinki, Finland)
Scored his first collegiate goal in a 1-1 tie with Vermont on January 26, 2007.

Greg Costa, NU (Fr. F; Crownsville, MD)
Scored his first collegiate goals on January 26, 2007, in a 6-1 win over Maine. He scored his second the same night.

Justin Braun, UMass (Fr. D; Vadnais Heights, MN)
Scored his first collegiate tally on January 27, 2007, vs. BU. Braun also added an assist for his first multi-point game.

Cory Schneider, BC (Jr. G; Marblehead, MA)
Registered a season-high 38 saves in BC's 5-2 win at No. 6 BU on January 26, 2007, his 50th career victory.

Jacques Perreault, NU (So. D; Grosse Point Farms, MI)
Scored his first collegiate goals on January 26, 2007, against Maine.
