NEW HAMPSHIRE STILL REIGNS; NU, BU TOUGH ON 'D' PC-Vermont, UNH-Maine are splitsville; Lowell garners three points

When the smoke finally cleared after a weekend full of Hockey East action, New Hampshire still sat atop the league leaderboard, but Maine served notice it would be a factor, UMass got a big win in Boston, UMass Lowell collected three points, Northeastern took an overtime thriller, and Providence and Vermont split in Burlington.

The Maine Black Bears stymied the vaunted UNH offense on Friday, taking a 4-2 decision at the Verizon Wireless Center in Manchester, NH. Maine's Matt Duffy (Windham, ME) got the deciding tally with less than five minutes remaining after Josh Soares (Hamilton, ON) knotted the game earlier in the period. The next night, in Durham, NH, the Wildcats bounced back to win, 2-1, behind a stellar performance by netminder Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA), who recorded a career-high 46 saves and a game-winner by a healthy Mike Radja (Yorkville, IL).

In NESN's *Hockey East Friday Night*, Northeastern's Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC) and Merrimack's Jim Healey (Holyrood, NF) held up their end in the anticipated goaltending duel, going 0-0 through regulation, but the Huskies squeaked out a 1-0 win when NU's Joe Vitale (St. Louis, MO) scored with 50 seconds left in overtime. Healey finished the night with 18 saves, while Thiessen recorded 23 in his third shutout of the season.

Boston University's defense was also solid, as the

Terriers deadlocked with UMass Lowell, 0-0, on Friday. UML freshman Nevin Hamilton (Ashland, MA) recorded his first career shutout, while BU senior John Curry (Shorewood, MN) got his fifth of the season, and 11th of his career.

The next night, Hamilton got his first career win, when the River Hawks pinned a 2-1 loss on the Minutemen in Amherst. Hamilton finished the night with 25 saves, and UML freshman Kory Falite (Billerica, MA) got the game-winner. UMass goaltender Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) had 27 stops. Quick had better success the night before, as the Minutemen took a 5-3 decision from Boston College in the Eagles' home rink. UMass capitalized on three first-period goals, and then parried every attempt by the Eagles to draw even. UMass' Will Ortiz got the game-winner.

In Burlington, Providence and Vermont split a two game series, with the Catamounts edging PC in the Friday night opener, 3-2, and the Friars regrouping to take Saturday's rematch, 4-1. Vermont's Colin Vock (Plymouth, MI) got the game-winning tally for UVM on Friday, while PC's Nick Mazzolini (Anchorage, AK) put the Friars ahead to stay the next night.

Tonight's opening round of the Beanpot features three Hockey East schools, with Northeastern and Boston University pairing off in the first match, and Boston College going against Harvard of the ECACHL in the nightcap. Both games will be air on NESN.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The nine-member sophomore class has accounted for 51 percent of the team's offense ... Sophomore forwards Benn Ferriero (12-13—25), Brock Bradford (9-12—23) and Nathan Gerbe (12-8—20) each have eclipsed 20 points. Ferriero (Essex, MA) has equaled his freshman output while Bradford and Gerbe (Oxford, MI) have surpassed their first-year production ... Ferriero, who assisted on Bradford's goal against UMass, recorded his 50th collegiate point (28-22—50).

Boston University: BU has scored 41 goals in its 12 road games, but only 22 in their 12 home contests ... John Curry has four shutouts in his last nine starts, helping the Terriers boast a nation-best 1.72 goals against average ... BU is 26-8 (.765) in games played at the TD Banknorth Garden, including a 20-2 (.909) record in Beanpot games.

University of Maine: The win on Friday marked the first time this season Maine has entered the third period trailing and won the game ... The win on Friday was on neutral ice, giving the Black Bears a 4-0-1 record on neutral ice. Two of those wins - UNH and Minnesota - came less than 30 miles from the opponents' campus ... Maine is 12-1-0 when scoring four or more goals.

University of Massachusetts: UMass took the season series with No. 13 Boston College on Friday by virtue of the 5-3 win, a first in program history ... Justin Braun's (Vadnais Heights, MN) two-point outing vs. the Eagles was his second-consecutive two-point game ... Don "Toot" Cahoon's Minutemen have 10 league wins, two shy of tying the program's all-time high. The 2003-04 squad holds the record of 12 HEA wins for UMass.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks took three of a possible four points with a tie at Boston University and a win at Massachusetts ... Todd Fletcher (Chelmsford, MA) scored his first goal of the season and Kory Falite notched his eighth of the year, the game-winner, against the Minutemen ... UML and NU meet for the third time this season on Thursday at Tsongas Arena.

Merrimack College: Senior Jim Healey (Holyrood, NF) has lowered his GAA from 3.32 to 2.65 over his last five contests and increased his save percentage from .889 to .909 ... The Warriors have killed off 70 of their last 76 penalties, including all four against the Huskies on Friday (92.1 percent) ... Merrimack is 0-1-4 in overtime this season.

University of New Hampshire: UNH registered its 20th win for the 11th consecutive season ... Mike Radja scored the game-winner on Saturday night vs. Maine in only his second game back from injury ... Kevin Regan's .935 save percentage and 18 wins rank third in the nation ... UNH is one of eight Division I teams to score more than 100 goals this season.

Northeastern University: Brad Thiessen is 5-2-2 with a 1.28 goals against average and a .949 save percentage since New Year's ... NU now has three OT victories since Jan. 5 ... Northeastern has played 10 overtime games this season, tied for the Hockey East lead with Boston University ... Tonight, the Huskies will be looking for their first Beanpot win over the Terriers since the final in 1988, when NU last won the tournament.

Providence College: The Friars earned their first win over Vermont since Dec. 27, 1997 ... PC's two first period goals against Vermont marked the first time this season that the Friars have scored twice in the opening period ... Colin McDonald (Wethersfield, CT) recorded his career high second short-handed goal in Friday's game at Vermont.

University of Vermont: Saturday's loss to the Friars ended a seven game unbeaten streak for the Catamounts ... Vermont's 10 Hockey East wins already match last season's total ... Torrey Mitchell's (Greenfield Park, QC) goal on Friday night was the 99th point of his career.

Chris Capraro, UMass (Sr. F; Medford, MA)
Tied his single-season best of 23 points with his goal against UMass Lowell on Saturday. Scored 23 points as a rookie with 7 goals and 16 assists, identical to this season.

Nevin Hamilton, UML (Fr. G; Ashland, MA)
Got his first shutout on February 2, 2007, in UML's 0-0 tie at BU. The shutout came before Hamilton's first win, the first goalie in program history to accomplish the feat. Recorded his first victory on February 3, 2007, a 2-1 decision at UMass.

Dan Bertram, BC (Jr. F; Calgary, AB)
and **Matt Greene, BC** (Jr. F; Plymouth, MA)
Played in their 100th career game on February 2, 2007, against Massachusetts.

Jon Quick, UMass (So. G; Hamden, CT)
With Friday's 5-3 win over BC, Quick tripled his win totals from a year ago when he had four. He is 12-8-4 on the season after his 33- save effort against the Eagles.

Brock Bradford, BC (So. F; Burnaby, BC)
Extended his point-scoring streak to seven games with two points (one goal, one assist) in 5-3 loss against UMass. He has nine points (four goals, five assists) during the streak.
