MAINE MAKES ITS MOVE UNH sweeps; BU, BC, UML collect wins

Maine jumped into 4th place with a weekend sweep over visiting Vermont, while UNH held firm to its league lead with two wins over Merrimack. Boston College and Boston University also kept pace with wins, and UMass Lowell is making noise with a three-game unbeaten streak.

In Orono, Maine freshman goalie Dave Wilson, subbing for injured starter Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO), shut down Vermont on consecutive nights, ringing up two key league wins. The Maine power play was clicking Friday, as the Black Bears blitzed UVM's Joe Fallon for four second-period goals with the man advantage to take a 5-0 lead into the final stanza. Vermont tightened up its defense the next night, and freshman goalie Mike Spillane was superb, but the Catamounts couldn't solve Wilson and Maine completed the sweep, 1-0.

Meanwhile, the 1st-place UNH Wildcats ensured that no opponent would encroach on its lead, taking a home-and-home series from the Merrimack Warriors, 3-1 and 4-1. Junior Mike Radja, who has been sizzling since returning from a knee injury, led the Wildcat charge with a goal and an assist in each game. UNH can clinch a share of the Hockey East regular season title with a win next Friday, and win it outright if BC loses.

However, the way BC's Cory Schneider is playing, no one is betting on a BC loss. Schneider followed up on his superb 2-1 Beanpot win over Harvard by collecting a career-high 45 saves against Providence, allowing the Eagles to escape Schneider Arena with a 2-1 victory.

Likewise, Boston University followed its 4-0 Beanpot win over Northeastern with a tough 3-2 decision over UMass in Amherst. UNH will have its hands full with the Terriers in Friday's NESN telecast, and the match-up between the Wildcats' high-flying forwards and BU's stout defense should be an epic one.

UMass rebounded from its loss to BU, and a 3-2 Providence lead, to secure a point against the Friars with a 3-3 tie on Saturday, thanks to a last-minute goal by Mark Matheson (Calgary, AB). In earlier league action last Thursday, UML freshman Nevin Hamilton pitched his second shutout in three games, backstopping the River Hawks to a 1-0 win over Northeastern at Tsongas Arena.

Tonight, BC and BU face off for city bragging rights in the Beanpot final, thought the game won't count in league standings. NU will match up against Harvard in the consolation game. NESN will broadcast the final, starting at 8.

Nevin Hamilton, UML (Fr. G; Ashland, MA) - Recorded his second shutout in the last three games with 10 saves in UML's 1-0 victory over Northeastern. Hamilton has backstopped the River Hawks to two consecutive wins and a three-game unbeaten streak.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Cory Schneider's 53rd career victory at Providence moves him into a fifth-place tie with Greg Taylor (1993-97) and BC assistant coach Jim Logue (1958-61) on BC's all-time wins list ... Both of Brett Motherwell's (St. Charles, IL) two goals have come at Providence ... Of Nathan Gerbe's (Oxford, MI) 13 goals, four have come in short-handed situations, four have come via the power play and four were game-winning goals. Gerbe is tied for first place nationally in short-handed goals.

Boston University: BU posted a shutout skein of 196:03 that began Jan. 27 and ended Feb. 9 at UMass' Mullins Center ... Following their 3-2 win over UMass, the Terriers are 19-2-1 in their last 22 games played in between Beanpot matches ... Sophomore Matt Gilroy (North Bellemore, NY) has assisted on five of the Terriers' last nine goals ... Junior Dan McGoff (Winchester, MA) doubled his career goal total when he scored twice in a four-minute span against NU.

University of Maine: The Black Bears lead the nation with 44 power play goals and the 25.4 percent (44/173) also is best in the country ... The one goal on Saturday marked the fourth time this season Maine has only scored one goal in a game, and it was the first win in those four games ... Saturday's shutout was the Black Bear's third of the season, matching the total number of shutouts in the 2005-06 season.

University of Massachusetts: Kevin Jarman's 18 points on the season is tied for fourth on the team, and he has bettered his junior points total by 11. He also has 13 points in conference play, which is second-best among all Minutemen ... 7,240 fans attended Friday's game against Boston University, the second-most to see a game at UMass in the Mullins Center.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks earned their second win in a row, and third straight without a loss, with a 1-0 defeat of Northeastern Thursday ... Cleve Kinley scored his second goal, the game-winner, against NU ... UML is 27-for-29 on the penalty kill over the last 10 games (93.1 percent) ... Freshman Chris Auger (Belleville, ON) has four assists in his last six games.

Merrimack College: After killing off 70 of their last 76 penalties entering the weekend, the Warriors allowed five PP goals to UNH this weekend ... Senior Justin Mills (Edgerton, AB) scored his first goal of the season for the Warriors Saturday night ... Sophomore Patrick Watson (Waltham, MA) made 24 saves Saturday in his first action since Jan. 12 against BC.

University of New Hampshire: Mike Radja leads Hockey East in goal scoring with 17, and his .77 goals per game ranks second nationally ... UNH ranked third in the nation in defense, while the BU Terriers, this week's opponent, rank first in the nation ... UNH's 80.4 percent winning percentage is the best in the country ... UNH is one of three schools in Div. I hockey that have 11 straight 20-plus win seasons.

Northeastern University: NU's 10 shots on goal Thursday against UMass Lowell was the lowest shot total since before the 2000-01 season ... Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC) gave up one goal to UMass Lowell on Thursday, marking the seventh time he has given up a goal or less. NU is 5-1-1 in those games ... NU faces Harvard in the Beanpot consolation game for the 17th time.

Providence College: Senior Colin McDonald (Wethersfield, CT) scored his career high on Saturday night with his 11th goal of the season ... PC's Chase Watson (Media, PA) and his younger brother Brett, a freshman forward at UMass, faced off against each other for the second time this season.

University of Vermont: With 24 points, the Catamounts have clinched a berth into the Hockey East playoffs, guaranteeing a spot in the quarterfinals for the second straight season ... Vermont has scored one goal or less in five of its last six games.
